1           **WHEREAS**, Section 4.304 of the Howard County Code provides that unclaimed  
2 property may be turned over to the finder upon the finder's payment of the cost of advertising;  
3 and

4  
5           **WHEREAS**, Section 4.310 of the Howard County Code authorizes the County Executive  
6 to dispose of forfeited motor vehicles to the owner of the vehicle under certain circumstances  
7 and authorizes the County Council to set, by resolution, a fee for towing, storage, and  
8 maintenance of lawfully seized vehicles; and

9  
10           **WHEREAS**, Section 17.713(d) of the Howard County Code requires the County Council  
11 to adopt fees for the failure to pay fines related to false alarms from residential and commercial  
12 alarm systems or the failure to register such systems; and

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14           **WHEREAS**, Section 17.301 of the Howard County Code requires the County Council to  
15 adopt a resolution setting fees for animal control services; and

16  
17           **WHEREAS**, Section 21.301(h) of the Howard County Code requires the County Council  
18 to annually adopt, by Resolution, maximum rates to be charged by a tow operator under the  
19 Accident Tow Program, and

20  
21           **WHEREAS**, Section 1-311 of the Public Safety Article of the Annotated Code of  
22 Maryland authorizes the counties of Maryland to impose charges to pay for operation and  
23 maintenance of the county's 911 emergency telephone system; and

24  
25           **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 4-206 of the General Provisions Article of the  
26 Annotated Code of Maryland, the official custodian may charge a reasonable fee for the search,  
27 preparation and reproduction of public records and the Police Department charges reasonable  
28 fees for certain types of records provided to the public including, without limitation, photograph  
29 development and police report reproduction; and

1           **WHEREAS**, Section 17.905 of the County Code provides that application fees and  
2 permit fees for special events and concerts shall be set by Resolution of the County Council; and

3  
4           **WHEREAS**, Section 17.322(h) of the County Code provides that a nonrefundable  
5 application fee and a license fee for a Private Animal Shelter license shall be adopted by  
6 Resolution of the County Council; and

7  
8           **WHEREAS**, fees were last adopted in Council Resolution No. 98-2025 and, for Fiscal  
9 Year 2027, there are no changes proposed.

10  
11           **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the County Council of Howard County,  
12 Maryland this 20 day of May, 2026 that it adopts the attached schedule of fees.

14           **AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the fee schedule shall be effective July 1,  
15 2026 and shall continue in effect until changed or repealed by subsequent Resolution of the  
16 County Council.

*These fees are set pursuant to Section 17.322(h) of the Howard County Code, which provides that a nonrefundable application fee and a license fee for a Private Animal Shelter license shall be adopted by Resolution of the County Council*

## MAXIMUM RATES FOR ACCIDENT TOWING

*These charges are set pursuant to Section 21.301(h) of the Howard County Code which requires the County Council to set the maximum rates that a tow operator may charge for towing under the Accident Tow Program*

Fees applicable to both Class I and Class II vehicle tows:

Towing a vehicle when the vehicle's keys are not available (per tow)	\$25.00
Taping of any vehicle windows (per vehicle side) or front or rear windshield	\$10.00
Extra people, when needed, and verified by the police officer at the scene (per tow, justification shall be placed on the tow receipt for review)	\$25.00
Inclement weather surcharge which shall only be charged during a declared snow emergency by the state and/or county (calculated based on towing fee but not additional fees authorized by this section)	25%
Administrative Fee (A one-time administrative fee shall only be charged when vehicle's owner has not claimed, or arranged to claim their vehicle within three business days (business day is any day the company is regularly open for reclaiming vehicles).)	\$50.00

Fees applicable to Class II vehicle tows:

(A Class II vehicle is a vehicle that weighs up to 10,000 pounds gross vehicle weight.)

Straight and/or roll-back towing of motorcycles and vehicles including trucks	\$200.00
Winching of vehicles (fee is per hour, to be calculated in 1/2 hour increments)	\$130.00
Extra trucks, when needed, (per tow, justification shall be placed on the tow receipt for review)	\$85.00
Charge for towing each mile beyond 30 miles (fee per mile)	\$10.00
Storage per day, or part thereof, commencing at 12:01 a.m. on the first calendar day after being towed, including days that the tow company is closed	\$40.00
Release of vehicle during non-business hours (flat fee)	\$50.00

Fees applicable to Class I vehicle tows:

(A Class I vehicle is a vehicle that weighs over 10,000 pounds gross vehicle weight.)

County or Private Class I Vehicles

Straight Truck (per hour including recovery/winchng)	\$475.00
Trailer (per hour including recovery/winchng)	\$400.00
Tractor/trailer combination (per hour including recovery/winchng)	\$600.00
Storage per day, or part thereof, per piece commencing at 12:01 a.m. on the first calendar day after being towed, including days that the tow company is closed	\$90.00
Release of vehicle during non-business hours (flat fee)	\$50.00
Charge for towing each mile beyond 30 miles (fee per mile)	\$10.00
Extra trucks, when needed, (per tow, justification shall be placed on the tow receipt for review)	\$160.00

**CHARGE ON TELEPHONE BILLS FOR SUPPORT OF 911 SYSTEM**

*This fee is set pursuant to Section 1-311 of the Public Safety Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland that authorizes the counties of Maryland to impose charges on each telephone bill to pay for operation and maintenance of the County's 911 emergency telephone system.*

Charge per month paid by subscribers to switched local exchange access service \$1.50

Charge per month paid by subscribers to wireless telephone service, except for prepaid wireless \$1.50

Per Section 1-311 of the Public Safety Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the County charge shall not apply to prepaid wireless telecommunications service. Section 1-313 of the Public Safety Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland establishes a prepaid wireless 9-1-1 fee of \$0.60 per transaction to be collected by the State.



## FEES FOR SPECIAL EVENT AND CONCERT PERMITS

*This fee is set pursuant to Section 17.905 of the Howard County Code that allows the County to charge an application fee and permit fees.*

### I. Application Fees

- A. Non-refundable Application Fee for a Special Event: \$50.00
- B. Non-refundable Application Fee for a Concert: \$200.00

### II. Permit Fees

Permit Fee for Special Events<sup>1</sup>: Cost to the County to be computed as follows:

\$64.81 times the number of estimated hours of service for each employee of the County providing services to support the event, subject to the following:

When the event promoter is a Nonprofit Organization
Fee estimated to be \$1,500 or less - No Charge
Fee exceeds \$1,500 - Applicant shall pay 50% of the amount that exceeds \$1,500

  

When the event promoter is a For-Profit Organization
Applicant shall pay 100% of the Fee

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<sup>1</sup> Note that parades and block parties are exempt from permit fees under Section 17.905 of the Code. The County may exempt an applicant from a permit or application fee, or both, if the County determines that such a waiver is in the best interest of the County.
