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I am writing to formally express my enthusiastic support for the construction of a dedicated indoor track and field facility in Howard county. Currently, the only Indoor Track facility is in Prince Georges County. Having only one facility in Maryland to compete at limits the number of meets Howard County teams can participate in. All Howard County track teams are limited to 3 league meets, and these are limited further by how many entries we are allowed, which means many newer runners only get to compete once or twice in the season. Teams are then forced to travel to Indoor facilities in Philadelphia, New York, or even Boston to intend a race.

The facility should be well utilized as mentioned above; the only comparable facility is in Prince Georges. All schools in the west, north, and east currently have to run at facilities such as the Baltimore Armory and multi-purpose community college gyms.

Subject: FY2027 Capital Budget - Indoor Track Facility

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Dear County Council,

Let me lend an enthusiastic voice in favor of including funds in the capital budget for the design and subsequent construction of a Multi-Sport Indoor Facility to include a premier indoor track.

Currently, the only viable venue for Indoor Track events for Howard County athletes is the PG Sports Complex in Landover. Having a national class facility in Howard County makes sense for a host of reasons:

- For Howard County high school student athletes, the lengthy journey to, and facility restrictions associated with, the PG Complex makes Indoor Track meets there meets a significant time burden. (For example, early dismissal is required for all PG Complex meets.) Not only does this create an additional time constraint for students trying to study but some athletes simply choose not to participate in Indoor Track because of the hassle. A Howard County facility would eliminate missed class time, reduce the impact on study time, and facilitate additional student participation.
- As seen again this past winter, weather can have a lasting impact on Indoor Track. While streets can be plowed, school tracks cannot and the ability to train for extended periods can be put at risk from a single significant weather event. While scheduling would need to be worked out, the availability of an indoor facility at least holds the promise that Howard County athletes might not be put at a competitive disadvantage.
- There is a market for Indoor Track meets that Howard County can tap into with a new facility. Aside from the scheduled meets at PG Sports Complex, some of the nearest quality tracks where Howard teams travel to for meets are in NYC, Staten Island, and VA Beach. A new facility in Howard County would easily draw the attention of timing/event companies to host meets. Such meets would not only provide competitive opportunities for local athletes but would doubtless create economic impact as athletes from outside the area book hotel rooms and eat at local restaurants, just as our Howard County athletes do when we travel to NYC or VA Beach.
- Community availability. The Armory Track in NYC bombards me with emails (after we participated in a meet there) touting its community programs. The same would be true for an Indoor Facility in Howard County. As a senior member and regular visitor to the Roger Carter Center (my wife is also a senior fitness member), I see how well used these facilities are. I have zero doubt that a

Multi-Sport Facility in Howard County would see the same utilization. My only fear would be the conflict over the excessive demand for the space.

I urge you to approve funding for this facility. It is consistent with the core values that make Howard County a place to visit and live. I'd be happy to provide any additional information I can to help move this proposal forward.

I am pleased to have this opportunity to address you on an issue near and dear to my heart. I have been a track and field athlete and administrator since I was in 8th grade Kensington JHS in 1961. When I was a student at B-CC in the early 1960s, facilities in the area were few and far between, with no real indoor facility in the area. It's not much better today in Howard County and only PG

County has a dedicated facility - the Sportsplex in Landover, which has some severe limitations.

For the past 25+ years I have been deeply involved in USATF Masters and served five years as the USATF MTF Chair. Now I am Vice President of the Masters World Regional organization. In these capacities I have been responsible for site selection and promotion/presentation of some of the largest indoor Masters events in the US and World, so I have a pretty fair understanding of what it needed. From what I understand, the planned facility would be perfect!

I mentioned a few seconds ago that the Sportsplex has limitations for Masters events. First and foremost, it is a flat track, which nowadays eliminates it as a venue for National Meets (we DID host the indoor Nationals three times - 2009, 2015, 2018). The 2018 meet is still the largest indoor nationals ever held, despite the lack of a banked track.

It also only has one "real" throwing area, which is now insufficient for that meet today.

There is a HUGE need for this facility not only for Howard County but for the whole DMV area and for the entire east coast.

I do not want to go on and on, but Masters alone would probably use it for national and regional championships on a regular basis. Howard County high schools needs a local facility for both training and for local meets.

There will be a strong community ready to use this facility from the day it opens, and the local track and field community stands ready to assist in any way it can to make this much needed facility a success!

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Good evening,

Howard County student athletes and the diverse, large running and walking community need an indoor track facility to utilize year-round. At this time Howard County student athletes, runners, walkers, and seniors in many organized groups, fitness programs, and adaptive sports do not have access locally to a safe, climate-controlled facility to stay active. Howard County constituents currently need to:

1. Pay to use extremely limited facilities in the area (i.e., Sandstrom for pole vault & high jump)
2. Pay to use a gym to have access to a treadmill (CA, HoCo Rec & Parks)
3. Purchase their own treadmill (expensive!)
4. Practice outside in extremely cold and dangerous conditions for ~6 months a year, which results in illnesses, injuries, and broken bones
5. Practice indoors in their high school, which is less than ideal and dangerous with other people using the hallways.
6. Miss many hours of school as a result of travel time to the PG Indoor Complex. This past year they missed lunch once, and had to be dismissed before their last two periods on a consistent basis. This resulted in lower grades for some of the student athletes. In my opinion, this is not acceptable.

Student athletes cannot train and compete at the highest level. Voting to have a year-round indoor track and facility will send a clear message to our student athletes: Howard County values youth, opportunity, and excellence. They will have the ability to train and compete at the highest level—right here in Howard County.

This facility would quickly and easily provide a return on the investment. Teams and Track & Field invitationals from Maryland, the DMV area, and beyond would take place in Howard County for meets. They will pay to rent the facility, hotels will be booked, they will eat at our local restaurants, shop at our stores, and make Howard County a regional hub for championship indoor track and field events. Howard County currently is doing the opposite by expending money for a sub-par flat indoor track facility in PG county:

- Thousands of dollars annually to rent a facility
- Expending thousand of dollars with contracts for buses (drivers, gas) for each meet
- Not spending our limited funds smartly; does not support long-term economic growth.

Let's make Howard County the most desired Indoor Track & Field facility destination. Please keep our funding local, and provide our students and constituents a facility that is needed as a year-round community resource.

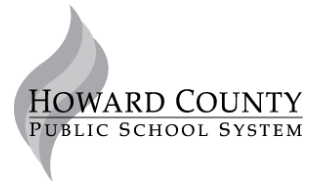

I have been a cross country, indoor, and outdoor track & field coach in the Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) for 23 years. As a resident of Howard County for the past 15 years, with children currently attending HCPSS schools, I am deeply invested in the well-being and development of our youth.

Throughout my career as an educator and coach, I have been committed to supporting student-athletes in their growth—both as athletes and as future contributors to society. The current indoor facility utilized by Howard County Public Schools, the PG Sports and Learning Complex, has become increasingly costly, and access for competitions there is diminishing. Expanding opportunities for our student-athletes within HCPSS remains my top priority, both as a coach and as a member of several local and state committees. The need for a modern indoor track & field facility is now more evident than ever.

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Dear Members of the Howard County Council,

My name is John, and I am a lifelong Maryland resident, currently a track and field coach residing in Columbia. I am writing in support of the funding proposal for the design of a Multi-Sport Indoor Facility included in Dr. Calvin Ball's budget.

As a coach, one of the most consistent challenges I face is the lack of accessible indoor training and competition space for student athletes. Outside of university-owned facilities, the Prince George's Sports and Learning Complex is essentially the only dedicated track and field venue in the state that is open for high school and recreational use. That is a significant gap for a state with as many young athletes as Maryland has.

A facility like this in Howard County would do more than just fill that gap. If designed as a true multipurpose space, it becomes an economic driver for the county — capable of hosting regional and state-level competitions, tournaments, and events that bring visitors, revenue, and visibility to our community.

Beyond athletics, the case for structured afterschool programming is well-documented. Recent Baltimore studies confirm that the hours between 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. are peak times for juvenile delinquency and victimization, and that programs keeping youth in structured environments during those hours meaningfully reduce youth crime. A facility like this gives young people in Howard County somewhere purposeful to be during those critical hours — and that matters just as much as any athletic benefit.

I strongly urge the Council to support this funding. The return on this investment — for our youth, our community, and our economy — is well worth it.
