2	image of a	gaunt silhouette, a strand of barbed wire and an ominous watchtower was		
3	developed to remind every American of our nation's military service members whose			
4	fates were n	ever accounted for from the Vietnam War; and

6	WH	EREAS, by the end of the Vietnam War, more than 2,500 service members		
7	were listed	by the Department of Defense as Prisoner of War ("POW") or Missing in		
8	Action ("M	IA"); and

10	WH	EREAS, in 1979, Congress and the President proclaimed the first National		
11	POW/MIA Recognition Day to acknowledge the concerns and symbolize the steadfast			
12	resolve of the American people to never forget the men and women who gave up their			
13	freedom pro	tecting ours; and

15	WH	EREAS, the POW/MIA flag became the only flag other than the Stars and		
16	Stripes to fl	y over the White House in Washington, D.C. and the only flag ever displayed		
17	in the U.S.	Capitol Rotunda, where it will stand as a powerful symbol of national		
18	commitmen	t to America's POW/MIAs; and

20	WH	EREAS, the POW/MIA flag's continued visibility remains a constant		
21	reminder of	the plight of America's POW/MIAs; and

23	WH	EREAS, the United States Government recognizes the significance and		
24	importance	of the POW/MIA flag by flying it beneath the flag of the United States on the		
25	following da	ates:		
26	1.	Armed Forces Day, the third Saturday in May;		
27	2.	Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;		
28	3.	Flag Day, June 14;		
29	4.	Independence Day, July 4;
