

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

I am a resident of Elkridge and I urge you to please reject Council Bill No.16 - 2017, the revision to the Growth Tiers in PlanHoward 2030. The protection of streams in the Upper Patuxent Rural Legacy and the health of the greater Chesapeake Bay should take precedence over the rights of property owners who wish to develop farm and conservation land preserved under current zoning law.

Deforestation, polluting nutrient runoff from an increase in impervious surface area, and the increased use of septic systems for waste will all follow from the development envisioned by rezoning Tier IV land to Tier III under CB 16. Further, the historic flooding in Ellicott City in July 2016 has been largely attributed to an increase in impervious surface area west of the historic downtown, demonstrating very immediate, expensive, and life-threatening second and third order effects and expense of too much development. Finally, damage to the Chesapeake Bay watershed harms wildlife and those whose livelihoods depend on clean water and clean air, not to mention farmland and forest.

In addition to to environmental impacts, additional development in Howard County's rural areas will create demands for more county roads, schools, and other expensive infrastructure. We don't need to further stress county resources or increase the cost of living in Howard County. Balance is needed in all things, including a balance between rural and urban/suburban areas in Howard County.



Dear Howard County Council,

As an environmental scientist and educator I am writing to ask you to vote against CB16. When the Sustainability Growth and Agricultural Preservation Act (a.k.a SB236 or the "septic bill") was passed by the state of Maryland in 2012 it was in important, if somewhat complex to implement, step to preserve farmland and the Chesapeake Bay. The Howard County Council worked diligently to develop an appropriate tiers map for the county in 2013 and this is not the time to change it. Environmental legislation to protect our common resources and the health of the ecosystems on which we depend is in jeopardy at the federal level. We can expect the onus to protect environmental health to be pushed increasingly towards the states. However, under Governor Hogan's administration we are not seeing the type of environmental leadership that Marylander's need and deserve. For example, there has been no enforcement action against Cecil County's non-compliant SB236 map and as a result they have formally adopted a map that is out of compliance with the law. Just because one county does the wrong thing does not mean that we should follow suit. Howard County has been and should continue to be a leader in environmental stewardship – of both farmland and the Chesapeake Bay – especially when we cannot county on leadership further "upstream".

When the Howard County Council voted about this issue in 2013, then Senator Allan Kittleman stated on Twitter and Facebook that it was a "very sad day" for the county as the council "votes to take away farmers' property rights." These sentiments coupled with the irresponsible precedent set by Cecil County and the Hogan administration help to make sense of Mr. Kittleman's current efforts to loosen tier maps for Howard with CB16. That doesn't make changing the zoning of thousands of acres of farmland in western Howard County, from Tier IV (farming and conservation) to Tier III (housing development), right for the long-term well-being of our county and state. Negative consequences of CB16 include:

- Changing the tiers map to make ~36 farms more valuable to developers and about 200 properties less valuable. Currently ~200 properties in western Howard County can be subdivided up to 4 times. Owners can sell their right to subdivide in an exchange program so developers need to buy up these rights to subdivide more than 4 times on a certain property. Thus, if you want to keep farming, you can get paid for agreeing not to subdivide. CB16 would automatically let larger farms to be subdivided, thus the farmers who want to keep farming will not be paid for not subdividing and those who sell to developers will get paid directly. In the end, this bill helps developers, gives an incentive to farmers for subdividing, and takes away an incentive to commit to not subdivide.
- This amendment to PlanHoward 2030 would affect property in the Upper Patuxent Rural Legacy area, violating the Resource Protection Initiative and the Environmental Protection Initiative adopted in the Plan. This area is the only part of Howard County that retains any streams that are clean and healthy enough to be classified as Tier II -- the highest quality -- by the





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high environmental standards that farmland is. Farmers in the Agricultural Land Preservation Program are not only compensated for keeping farms in agriculture, but have plans for nutrient management, soil conservation, and water conservation. Building hundreds of new homes will have a severe impact on the rural environment, starting with the deforestation and loss of ground cover.

- New housing developments in this part of the county would require use of septic systems, further increasing the deleterious environmental impact. Septic tanks are a significant source of water pollution, chiefly nitrogen, a nutrient that in excess quantities feeds algal blooms that block sunlight and reduce life-giving oxygen in the water. Along with phosphorus and sediment, nitrogen is regarded as the single greatest source of pollution for the Chesapeake Bay. Homes that depend on septic systems generate four times more of it than those connected to central sewage lines.
- The bay cleanup is facing too much uncertainty with Scott Pruitt's appointment to head the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to afford the lax approach coming out of Annapolis. If Governor Hogan and members of his cabinet are unwilling to enforce the tier map requirement, counties with a conscious and commitment to the future well-being of our people and place need to do so. If we do not reject CB16, western Howard County will see unnecessary and damaging development, millions of taxpayers dollars spent on agriculture easements and other forms of open space preservation will have been wasted, and other counties will follow the negligent precedent created by Cecil and Howard County. The Chesapeake Bay has little chance of recovery if Maryland isn't willing to protect its open spaces and reduce sprawl and this happens at the county level.

There are some individuals who believe that to own a piece of land is to have an unlimited ability to build on it whatever they like. However, the right of Marylander's as a whole to have clean water and a healthy Chesapeake Bay needs to be asserted more than an individual right to profit via the development of land that is in a relatively natural state. Please make your commitment to clean water progress and meeting the Chesapeake Bay goals and requirements clear by voting no on CB16. We are counting on you to put human and environmental health before personal and corporate profits.



Howard County would benefit by the preservation of agricultural properties and open spaces. However, the proposed Council Bill CB16-2017, which would allow the subdivision of agricultural parcels, has potential to greatly undermine farming and open spaces in Howard County. Not only will having the county's farmland divided into smaller parcels decrease its agricultural value, but the subdivision will also increase the purchase price of land and increase property taxes for future farmers. Compliance of setback requirements will be problematic for the resulting smaller parcels, since the setback will need to be applied to each new property line, further decreasing the agricultural value of the property.

Furthermore, subdivision of farms could contribute to non-agricultural use of the properties which would lead to the need for additional infrastructure such as roads and schools. The increase in impervious surface from eventual improvements in non-agricultural properties will contribute to stormwater runoff, which last year resulted in significant property loss in Ellicott City and the loss of two lives.

In summary, this bill has the potential to be detrimental to the interests of Howard County and passing the bill, especially in view of the current challenges that Howard County is facing, would be irresponsible.
