He and others worked very hard to make sure that everyone felt welcome and safe in Columbia. The value of having Columbia and Howard County be a place where people feel welcome and safe is at least 50 years old. I see this Bill as entirely consistent with that legacy, and I urge you to vote for it to keep Howard County in the tradition of Columbia's values.

Second, my profession is housing and neighborhood planning and analysis. I was startled to hear some opponents of the Bill assert that the Montgomery County Sanctuary Bill has caused lower property values to fall. I checked the facts this morning and this assertion is incorrect. Yes, housing values fell in Montgomery County as they did in Howard County and everywhere else due to the real estate recession. However, the dip in values and now the rebound of the housing market there is almost identical to the price trend line in Howard County. There is no evidence I can see that supports a claim that property values in Montgomery have fallen because of legislation. You obviously want to make your decision based on facts, not fears.

Julia, thank you for responding to my correspondence. I appreciate that you are being flooded right now, and I'm sure the late hours listening to testimony have been exhausted.

While I haven't been able to attend the hearings in person due to previous commitments the past two nights, I have been following along on social media and online. I think one of my fellow citizens, Daniel Newberger, who I've never met, presented what might be the best summary of why I believe Mary Kay should support this legislation:

"Luckily, the citizens of Howard County have already made it very easy for you to choose your side. We have already told you which side to choose, and I don't mean the colored t-shirts in this room. In November's fateful election, the voters of Howard County resoundingly rejected the president-elect. Seventy-one percent of us rejected him. Seventy-one percent of us rejected his fear-mongering, and his hate-mongering, and his appeals to the worst aspects of our human nature. Seventy-one percent.

Mr. Kittleman should take heed. I would like to share my support for the sanctuary bill for Howard County- CB9-2017. Even though Donald Trump has threatened to take away federal grants and funding from sanctuary cities, I believe that it is now more important than ever to stand up for what is right- human empathy and kindness. It's not just a "hollow political statement", it's a firm and brave stance on what we believe and value in Howard County. I grew up in a diverse area and I'm very proud of the person my community has shaped me to be. Allowing me to interact with various people of different ethnicity and cultures pushed me into being a better person and trying to change the world in my own way, for the equality of all human beings.

I'm a recent RPCV (returned Peace Corps Volunteer) and I graduated with a degree in TESOL. Before I left, I enjoyed working with immigrant children and their families. I got to hear their stories. I loved my students. They come from hard working families and they have dreams and aspirations too. I learned about their pain and frustrations. And I know that this bill will help ease their fears.

Honestly, one case of an "undocumented immigrant" committing a sin does not justify encroaching on the right of +/-11,000 Howard County residents. They deserve to feel safe. They deserve to be able to keep their families together. I had one student back in 2013-14 who was born in the US. He was the oldest of all of his siblings, and his parents were undocumented immigrants. His father, who was the only member of the family with an income, was in the process of being deported. My student was in 6th grade, and was now essentially forced to become the "man of the house". Now, tell me. What happens to that family of 6? How will they get food now? How do you think this affects the future of my student? What are the chances that he will have the opportunity and privilege to complete his education?

There is no easy solution. But there is basic human decency and empathy wherein people support one another in difficult times. In the Philippines, we had a word for this- "Bayanihan". In the past, when houses in the Philippines were stilted and made of bamboo and nipa, communities would come together and move entire houses before a large storm came on land. It was an amazing feat. When I lived in the Philippines, I experienced this as well. After a strong typhoon, Filipinos will be out early the next morning, 4-5am, clearing out the roads, helping their neighbors, making sure everyone was safe and had basic necessities. I had a complete stranger help take apart the roofing on my porch which had torn away in the storm. We need to support each other because a community who is accepting and protective of all it's residents is a community that is strong and resilient.

The Center for American Progress released a report Thursday that found

- There are, on average, 35.5 fewer crimes committed per 10,000 people in sanctuary counties compared to nonsanctuary counties.
- Median household annual income is, on average, \$4,353 higher in sanctuary counties compared to nonsanctuary counties.
- The poverty rate is 2.3 percent lower, on average, in sanctuary counties compared to nonsanctuary counties.
- Unemployment is, on average, 1.1 percent lower in sanctuary counties compared to nonsanctuary counties.
- While the results hold true across sanctuary jurisdictions, the sanctuary counties with the smallest populations see the most pronounced effects.

Becoming a sanctuary county can only be beneficial to Howard County and it's residents. Frankly, I think forcing/blackmailing small local governments to give up information about their residents seems very illegal (breaks the 10th constitutional amendment), is slightly horrifying, and kind of like the beginning of a dystopian movie.

Please, consider the lives of the residents in your district. Especially the people of Wilde Lake, Clarksville (where I grew up), Columbia, etc... who I know and regard with fondness.

They are human beings. They are not "illegals". Illegals is NOT a noun. It is not an adjective. Human beings can not be illegal. We deserve to be allowed to live and breath and struggle through this maze called "life". Most of all, we need bayanihan- to support each other and walk through each others shoes. Not many people understand that. Being a good councilwoman means that you must be empathetic and understand the stories of all of the people- not just the outspoken ones who have the privilege to be able to speak out. So for my students, past and future. I want to speak out and say that they deserve to feel safe. They deserve basic human decency and protection.

Given the national political climate and the President-Elect's promise to target vulnerable noncitizen communities, Howard County must take steps to ensure that our residents' constitutional rights are protected.

Enacting a formal policy that clarifies the responsibilities of our police to enforce criminal law and not civil immigration law will allow our officers to focus on the public safety of the community. This bill does not hinder current law enforcement priorities. It recommits Howard County's responsibility to protect and serve its most vulnerable residents, not just its citizen residents.

This bill furthers public safety by helping build trust between local law enforcement and noncitizen communities, preventing the racial profiling of noncitizens by local law enforcement officers, and limiting the incidence of discrimination against people of color.

I believe that protecting the civil rights and liberties of all Howard County residents, including vulnerable noncitizen residents, should be a top priority.

As a Howard County resident, it is extremely important to me that my neighbors should feel safe and welcome in their own homes, regardless of their nationality, cultural background, or immigration status. I would beg to differ with the opposition's claims that illegal immigrants should "go back," or "enter legally," as they do not deserve this abusive treatment. Most illegal immigrants have entered legally, but overstayed their visa. Hi Mary Kay,

John here from Hickory Ridge. If you haven't yet made up your mind, I'd like to ask you to support CB9.

When I first heard about it, I did a bit of an eye-roll. I'm not one for political theater or "feel-good" legislation. I did, however, read the proposed bill and then sought out all of the coverage for and against it that I could find.

A number of the proponents made arguments that I thought vaulted it from "isn't this nice" to "wow - this'll protect people I know" status. I was hoping that the opposition would poke some good holes in it, but I'm afraid that neither the "tool to combat terrorism" nor the "break the law, go to jail" nor the threat of loss of Federal funds arguments held much water with me. That, of course, ignores the implicit and explicit xenophobia threaded throughout most of the arguments.

There may be a downstream implication of this legislation that I haven't yet grasped that may make passage of this bill a genuinely bad idea. I know that there are LOTS of lovely sounding ideas that are made into bad legislation. If you think that's the case, I'll trust you to make that call.

If not, and if your considerations are the core ones that the two sides have focused on - I'd ask you to support CB9.

As I said, I wasn't initially supportive of the legislation. But between the President's recent Executive Order and the woman in Bel Air (a citizen) being asked about her immigration status while taking a walk, I started looking at things differently. We're heading into what I consider frightening territory in terms of individual liberties, and though I'm pretty low-key with most of my political views - this is an area where I think it's becoming more and more important to stand up.

I took my 7-year-old to the gathering at the Wilde Lake Interfaith Center yesterday to hear what was being said. I understand that you and your colleagues saw a lot of opposition to CB9 at the public input sessions. However the (reportedly) 1,100+ people there last night showed that the opposition voices don't speak for all of Howard County.



New York City Mayor Bill de Blasio isn't backing away from policies that protect immigrants living illegally in the country, even if that means cuts to his city's budget.

As other mayors across the country stand behind their immigrant-friendly policies, we wondered about de Blasio's comment on how much is at stake.

Can funding be restrained in certain areas but not "across the board," as de Blasio said?

A key Supreme Court case

The mayor's press office told us he was referring to the 1987 landmark case *South Dakota vs. Dole*, which the mayor's press office concluded "that federal conditions have to be reasonable and related to the programs they are attached to."

South Dakota vs. Dole examined whether Congress exceeded its spending powers and violated the 21st Amendment (allowing states to regulate alcohol) by setting conditions for states to receive federal highway funds.

Congress in 1984 enacted legislation that allowed the secretary of the Transportation Department to withhold 5 percent of federal highway funds from states where the minimum drinking age was below 21. South Dakota allowed 19-year-olds to buy alcohol.

In a 7-2 decision, the Supreme Court determined that Congress within constitutional bounds "acted indirectly under its spending power to encourage National Constitution Center, Nov. 29, 2016


The court also said spending power must be in pursuit of "the general welfare." Conditions set by Congress for the disbursement of funds must also be unambiguous, related to the national project or program, not lead to unconstitutional actions and not be coercive, the court affirmed.

Constitutional law experts told us de Blasio's comment is generally sound, but noted that the Dole case is specifically about congressional spending power, not presidential authority.

"If Trump was referring to the possibility of congressional legislation that would make continued funding contingent on cooperation with federal immigration policy, then we have a possible Dole situation," said Christopher W. Schmidt, a law professor and co-director of the Institute on the Supreme Court of the United States at Chicago-Kent College of Law, Illinois Institute of Technology.

Imposing across-the-board spending cuts for "sanctuary cities" would run afoul with at least one of the criteria set in the 1987 Supreme Court case — that conditions on spending be related to the national program that Congress is seeking to advance, said Franita Tolson, a professor at Florida State University College of Law.

For instance, if the federal government gives New York money for mass transit, and New York doesn't



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want to participate in a federal initiative for education, the federal government can't in turn threaten the mass transit funds, said Richard Primus, a law professor at the University of Michigan.

Trump's administration "can't cut off any federal grants to sanctuary cities unless it can show that those grants were clearly conditioned on cooperation with federal deportation policies," Ilya Somin, a law professor at George Mason University, wrote in an opinion piece published by the *Washington Post*.

Conditions for funds also cannot be so great that the threat of losing federal money amounts to coercion, Primus said.

Scholars pointed to the 2012 Supreme Court case *National Federation of Independent Business vs. Sebelius*, in which seven of the nine justices said it would be unconstitutionally coercive for Congress to withdraw Medicaid funds from states refusing to participate in the Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act.

"One might argue that the larger the amount of money at stake (or the 'broader' the threatened cut), the more coercive the condition, but there are other factors to be taken into account as well," said Lana Ulrich, associate in-house counsel at the National Constitution Center.



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In the case of sanctuary cities, spending power might be interpreted differently, Ulrich said.

At issue might be the extent to which Congress may condition grants or whether Congress has the discretion to withhold funds for cities that are not in compliance with federal law," Ulrich said.

Trump has not outlined extended details on his sanctuary city proposal, but he said that cities that refuse to assist federal authorities "will not receive taxpayer dollars."

Our ruling

In a discussion about Trump's plans to cut federal funding to sanctuary cities, de Blasio said, "because of a decision by the Supreme Court, no president's in a position to cut off funding across the board. It has to be very specific to the matter at hand."

It's not as settled by law as de Blasio makes it sound, but experts say generally that the mayor is correct.

The Supreme Court, in *South Dakota vs. Dole*, concluded that Congress could not coerce local governments to act based on the threat of withholding federal funds. Also, any funds that are withheld must be germane to the reason they are being withheld.

The court ruling dealt with Congress, however, and

not the executive, and there is ambiguity about both what tactic Trump might pursue and the legal precedence behind it.

De Blasio's statement is accurate but needs clarification or additional information. We rate de Blasio's claim Mostly True.

I write to express my strong support for Council Bill No. 9-2017 and urge the Council to unanimously adopt this legislation. As bombastic rhetoric, confusion, and inconsistency continue to emerge from the Trump Administration concerning our nation's immigration laws, this sensible legislation provides much-needed clarification and defines the roles of county government employees pertaining to federal immigration laws.

Sanctuary Bill Observations

I testified at the public hearing in strong support of Howard County's Sanctuary bill, CB9-2017. I had never testified before. It seemed like a relatively innocuous bill as the police policy was already identical to the proposals in the bill. I was therefore surprised to encounter a large contingent of well organized hostile opponents to the bill. Most were clad in red shirts waving anti-sanctuary signs. They dwarfed the hand-made signs which some supporters carried.

Another, clad in a business suit, claimed to possess considerable political power and threatened to use this 'considerable political power' to defeat not only the bill but also Calvin Ball and Jen Terresafor proposing it. The Howard County Chief of Police testified against the bill, despite conceding that the bill would b not affect present police policy. I was puzzled until someone pointed out the chief was just doing the bidding of his master, County executive Alan Kittleman, who has threatened to veto the bill. Many of the red-clad opponents waved their huge red and white signs with glee at every mention of Donald Trump.

All the legal experts testified in favor, making sure to point out that the bill was legal. There was very moving testimony in support by high school students, in particular by an Oakland Mills High School boy in a green bowtie who energized supporters.

But, I was proud of my fellow Democrats. It was the Columbia Democratic Club of old, supporting the bill by unanimous vote in a previous meeting. The president of the club, Maureen Evans Artthur, gave eloquent testimony. But so also did other Democratic organisations and individuals. I am not your constituent, but I am a citizen of Howard County and a local activist, and I support Council Bill 9. I hope you vote for it Monday. I know it's a complex issue and I know you've been swamped with aggressive opponents of the bill for weeks now. What you may not realize is the breadth and depth of support for this bill that exists among quietly devoted faith communities, neighbors, and activists throughout our County and beyond it. I sat through 4 hours of the public hearing testimony and 5 hours of the subsequent work session. I realize this will be a tough vote to make, no matter what you decide, but I deeply believe that passing CB9 is the right thing to do. I will back you up in every way I can, if you vote for it, and I have lots of friends who support it, too.

Although I don't know you personally, I have been an active Democrat in Howard County for many years now, and appreciate your service to our community. You may have seen me more recently in my new role as Delegation Administrator for Howard County's Delegation to the General Assembly. Clearly, I am writing to you now simply as a private citizen of Howard County, committed Democrat, Christian seeker, and community activist; these views are my personal opinions. In fact, I held back from sharing them, to some degree, because I wished to maintain a professional distance given my new role with the Delegation. What's worse, it is our President, and our federal government, that is poised to shower our state and local government with edicts that will engulf local and state law enforcement with the unfunded and illegitimate mandate to act as immigration enforcement officers. Given their lack of training and the complexity of immigration law, and the specious nature of federal orders of this kind, it seems quite plausible that local law enforcement will make mistakes that could lead to lawsuits against the County, drain our resources, and undermine the public trust required to maintain effective local law enforcement, crime prevention, and community integrity.

As the Enrollment and Transitions Coordinator of the English Language Center at Howard Community College, I strongly encourage you to vote YES tonight on CB9, In my position at the college, I am in constant communication with adult English Language Learners here in Howard County. Fortunately, when we enroll our nearly 2,000 students annually in HCC's non-credit ESL program, we are not required to ask them about their immigration status. However, that doesn't mean it doesn't come up.

Immigration status typically comes up when I am counseling a student and it becomes clear that the student or one of their family members could use the support of one of Howard County's community service providers. If they are undocumented or have not had permanent resident status for at least 5 years, there are many services for which they do not qualify. And though that can be frustrating, it is an understandable policy.

However, it is always troubling when I am meeting with an undocumented student who is distraught because they have been a victim of a crime such as domestic violence or abuse, assault, fraud, or theft and they have not reported the crime to the police because they fear it will trigger an unwanted action from ICE, either for themselves or someone they care about. I do my best to convince these students otherwise, in addition to referring them to an agency such as FIRN, CASA, or Hope Works, that can support them regardless. Yet, I always remain concerned that their inability to trust the police leaves them vulnerable to future victimization.

Ms. Sigaty, I want you to know and believe that this really does happen! And, regardless of immigration status, everyone deserves the cover of safety that the Howard County Police Department can provide. Offering "sanctuary" to our undocumented neighbors will make Howard County a safer, healthier and truly welcoming community for all. Please vote YES on CB9.

Council Member Sigaty:

I am writing as someone born in your district and who has lived in your district for all but eight of my 42 years to implore you to stand up for the values my hometown of Columbia was founded on and that have made me proud to be a Howard Countian by voting yes on CB 9. I also ask you not to pursue the "compromise" I have been reading about, which seems to me not so much a compromise on the nature of our values, but simply a compromise on how strongly we support those, and therefore will send exactly the wrong message about who we are.

My parents moved to Howard County to start a family expressly for the purpose of making sure that their children would be raised to understand the value of diversity, and while I moved away to go to college, when my wife and I began to start a family, the same reason drove us to leave beautiful San Diego and return here--to do everything we could to ensure that our children would grow up to value diversity, inclusion, and equality, things we consider to be bedrock elements of being a good citizen, and a good human. My mother was raised in the segregated Midwest in the forties and fifties, and while her parents insisted she go to college in the Midwest (too many Communists at the coastal universities), by the time she was pursuing her PhD she was free to choose a school in New York City. She has described to me feeling literal terror in that diverse environment, but she had soon done a complete 180 on issues of race and resolved that she wanted to be part of raising a new generation of Americans who would seek empathy, value difference, and tear down barriers. That was her entire reason for moving to Howard County and, 27 years later, my entire reason for returning.

I haven't been as involved in local issues as I should, given my long residency, but I have paid close attention to the debate around CB 9, and I need to tell you that it has shaken me to my core. I attended the work session on the bill and was very proud of the way you, as my representative, conducted yourself. I felt a high point was the moment when you reminded those assembled that when we are talking about those affected by CB 9, we are talking about people. Unfortunately, that was immediately followed by the lowest point, when opponents of CB 9 in the audience began to shout, "We are people too!" I was raised to understand that human rights are not a zero sum game, and that respecting and valuing the personhood of people different from us does not diminish us, but makes us stronger. I learned those values everyday growing up here in Howard County, and I was shocked and saddened to see them so readily repudiated by others who live here.

And that is why CB 9 is so important to me: I know that Council Member Fox, and others (including some supporters of CB 9), would like to make this about a referendum on Trump, but I hope you will not make your decision on that basis; rather, I hope you will see CB 9 as asking the question of who we are as Howard Countians. Do we stand for tolerance, equality, diversity, human rights? Or are we fearful, insular, and indeed in some cases, hateful? I never thought that in my lifetime Howard County would be having this identity struggle, and yes, I want us to tell the rest of the world who we are, loud and clear: that we value each and every person who has chosen to live here with us, that we are defined by our empathy and not by our fear. But more importantly, I want us to tell that to our children, the next generation of Howard Countians, who so many of us are raising here in order to promote and strengthen those values in the world. And I want to help even those who oppose CB 9 learn the worth of those values, and I commit to you that if CB 9 passes, I will help you and other community leaders however I can in reaching out to those folks with love and compassion in in hopes of deepening our understanding of each other. I attended the **Women Democrats of Howard County** meeting last week, and was disturbed to hear about County Executive Kittleman's record with regard to immigrants' civil rights. It is now more important than ever to ensure that our county does not repeat the ignorant and divisive actions being urged by the current administration in Washington.

The "Sanctuary" bill, CB9, being considered by the Howard County Council, is an example, I think, of the way in which we can both symbolically and practically push back against the fear being drummed up in our community, and around the country. This bill is NOT an immigration bill—immigration policy is determined by legislative action at the Federal level. This bill is rather about policing in Howard County, and this is where I am most concerned about the impact of the President's over-reach.

I have been on the Kings Contrivance Village Board for over ten years, and as former Chair of the CA Board of Directors, I was briefed every year on crime statistics for the county. I know from experience that we are still understaffed in police officers and detectives, with scarce policing resources being spread too thin between villages. Villages have to "share" police presence and this is a constant concern of our residents. After all the progress of the past year, and the emphasis on community policing, our county police officers should NOT be tasked with stopping or questioning people about immigration status on the basis of appearance, or nationality, or especially religion. That is not their job.

I was struck by the number of photos on your County Council site that depict you engaging with people of all nationalities and religions on community projects that emphasis our shared values of diversity, tolerance and cooperation. This is a critical time to follow through with a clear message to our immigrant residents that you stand with them, and with all county Democrats, against the intolerance that threatens our continued progress as a vibrant community.

I understand that some council members have suggested a council"resolution" as an alternative. But a resolution, although a statement of principle, is NOT binding--there is no force of law to defend the innocent from aggressive attacks on civil liberties. 

Dear Howard County Council,

My name is Chiara D'Amore and I am a resident of Ms. Sigaty's district. I have called Howard County home since I was in the 4th grade. After leaving the area for college, graduate school, and my early career, my husband and I moved back to Columbia in 2008 in order to raise our children, who are now 7 and 3.

One of the primary reasons I wanted to return to this area to raise our family is because of the diversity that is intentionally supported and deeply valued in this community. In designing Columbia, James Rouse truly wanted to create a better place for people--all people--to live. Mr. Rouse believed we are at our best in communities where there is a sense of responsibility to one's city and to one's neighbor. He imagined and designed Columbia, the heart of Howard County, to be a place that fostered economic, racial, and cultural harmony. CB9 helps to codify this vision in the midst of tumultuous times in our county and country.

As a scientist, I believe firmly in the importance of facts and truth. In honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. I agree with his assertion that "Nothing in this world is more dangerous than sincere ignorance and conscientious stupidity." Unfortunately we have seen a rise in both in recent times, as evidenced by a political culture of false information being passed as fact in order to use fear to garner power. We are seeing this from detractors of CB9. With this context, the reasons I support CB9 are as follows:

- Across the US there are nearly 400 sanctuary cities and municipalities that offer a variety of policies and protections for residents. While there is no legal definition that spans all of these locals, essentially the term refers to a locality that has chosen not to use its local resources to enforce federal immigration law. If the CB9 legislation passes in Howard County, it would legally direct county employees and police not to inquire about a resident's immigration status unless required by law (for example, checking legal authorization to work during the hiring process). The benefits of making what has been a policy position into law are that it prevents discrimination; ensures county resources are prioritized for local law enforcement efforts; and protects the county from exposure to potential liability. Importantly, it also reflects our values as a welcoming and diverse community and promotes trust between our community and government/police.
- This bill would not interfere with our police's ability to investigate crimes and enforce local and state law. Additionally, it does not interfere with ICE's ability to carry out deportation. Our local police would still be required to comply with any federal warrants for arrest. Separating local policing from immigration enforcement promotes public safety and promotes family unity and human dignity.
- Congress appropriates and authorizes the spending of federal funds, not the President. Nothing in this bill violates federal law, so Howard County should not be under any threat of losing federal funds. There is not transparency around any federal funding that Howard County receives that would be threatened if additional steps would be taken to further bolster the County as an inclusive, supportive, compassionate community.
- I have the privilege of being a Caucasian, able-bodied, straight, educated, upper middle class, U.S. citizen, of a non-threatened faith. I have MANY friends and colleagues who do not fit one or more of these categories. As I wrote in my November 20th Op Ed in the Baltimore Sun regarding Governor Hogan's lack of leadership around the rise of hate speech and actions, "There are children in Maryland who are now living in fear due to circumstances around which they have no control the color of their skin, their accent, their religion, their disability, and so on. Friends of mine have been called the N-word for the first time in the diverse and inclusive community of Columbia. Other friends are afraid to wear any public indication of their religion due to harassment."

Now more than ever we need thoughtful, courageous leadership to protect our communities where state and federal leaders will not. I am appreciative that Dr. Ball and Ms. Terrasa put this bill forward and hopeful that both Ms. Sigaty and Mr. Weinstein will support it, making County Executive Kittleman's premature veto determination moot.
