1           **WHEREAS**, Section 12-103(b) of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated Code of  
2 Maryland authorizes the governing body of a County to impose a recordation tax upon  
3 instruments of writing recorded with the clerk of the circuit court for the County; and

5           **WHEREAS**, the County Executive has recommended the rate of the recordation tax.

7           **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard County,  
8 Maryland this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2017 that it sets a recordation tax of **\$2.50 on each**  
9 **\$500 or fraction of \$500** of consideration payable or of the principal amount of debt secured for  
10 an instrument of writing, the tax to be imposed on the instrument of writing prior to recordation  
11 with the Clerk of the Court; and

13           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the recordation tax rate shall be effective July 1,  
14 2017 and shall continue in effect until changed or repealed by subsequent resolution of the  
15 County Council.
