- 1) **24-Hour Crisis Hotline**, which includes crisis intervention via telephone, and through the Mobile Crisis Team. Here we serve as the single point of entry for assessment for homeless services and supports, mental health crisis, and suicide prevention and intervention.
- 2) **The Day Resource Center**, currently located on Rt. 1, but slated to move in early summer to a new site at the Leona Dorsey Center or Guilford Road. Here we serve those who are chronically homeless and often in most distress for immediate assistance.
- 3) The 51-Bed Shelter at our Freetown Road location, The Shelter on Freetown Road houses 18 single men, 6 single women, and 10 families. and
- 4) The Cold Weather Shelter, a partnership among many congregations and Grassroots with County Support, for moving costs. The Cold Weather Shelter is an integral part of our work to ensure that no person is left out in the cold. The level of community and volunteer support that is provided by each congregation is a true gift to the County and our residents. Additionally in winter, Grassroots serves as the access point for the county's Emergency Cold Weather program which ensures anyone in the county needing shelter is able to find cover.

When one considers self-sufficiency, perhaps the most important part of that is permanent housing. As we go into uncharted territory related to the ACA and HUD, I am grateful to be serving as part of the Board that is tasked with serving individuals with some of the greatest and most complex needs in the county. Grassroots works with individuals who need daily support, most often those who are without housing. I look forward to partnering with individuals, other non-profits and Howard County Government to as a member of the Board to Promote Self-Sufficiency.
