Section 6.701. General powers and duties of the Commission for Veterans and Military
 Families.

3 *In general.* Commission for Veterans and Military Families may:

- 6 (2) Maintain communication between government agencies, businesses, educational

 10 educational institutions to ensure adequate consideration of veterans and their history of
 11 service in education, employment, training, and public programs;
- (4) Research, assemble, analyze, and disseminate information and educational materials
 relating to activities and programs that will assist in meeting the needs of veterans and their
 families;
- 15 (5) Identify and maintain a list of veterans' organizations as a resource to the Commission;
- (6) Institute and conduct educational and other programs, meetings, and conferences to
 promote the rights of and opportunities for veterans and military families;
- (7) Advise the Executive and the council on the status of programs and services in the State
 and County related to the needs of veterans and military families; [[and]]
- (8) Assist in planning appropriate public acknowledgement of the contributions made by
 veterans and military families and assist in planning commemoration activities recognizing
 contributions made by veterans and military families[[.]];
- (9) ADVISE THE OFFICE OF PURCHASING ON WAYS TO FURTHER PROMOTE EFFORTS OF THE
 COUNTY IN PROCURING GOODS AND SERVICES FROM VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESS
 ENTERPRISES PURSUANT TO THE COUNTY'S VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE
 PROGRAM; AND
