- (2) Authority to enter into agreements. The County may cooperate with and enter into agreements with governmental agencies in order to provide comprehensive risk management in the most economical manner.
- (3) *Coverage*. The comprehensive risk management program shall compensate for injury or death of persons or damage to property resulting from the negligent or wrongful acts within the scope of their official duties of public officials, agents, volunteers, or employees of the governmental agency, shall provide protection against physical loss or damage to property of the governmental agency, and shall provide for the defense of claims. An agreement may provide for some or all of the coverage included in the comprehensive risk management program established by the County.
