1           **WHEREAS**, the County Executive issued Executive Order 2018-07 on May 27, 2018, related to  
2 a severe flooding event that occurred on May 27, 2018; and

3           **WHEREAS**, the State of Emergency declared by the Executive Order will expire on June 3,  
4 2018, unless extended by the County Council; and

5           **WHEREAS**, the hazardous conditions will continue beyond June 3, 2018; and

6           **WHEREAS**, extending the State of Emergency is necessary to protect public health, safety, and  
7 welfare and to protect property.

9           **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard County,  
10 Maryland this 18<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2018, that the exercise of Emergency Powers by  
11 the Executive under Sections 6.103 and 6.104 of the County Code is necessary to protect the public  
12 health, safety, and welfare and to protect property in the parts of the County that were harmed by the  
13 flooding.

15           **AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the State of Emergency declared by the County  
16 Executive through the Executive Order issued on May 27, 2018, is extended through July 3, 2018,  
17 unless terminated sooner by the County Executive or extended by Resolution of the County Council.
