## SCOTT B. MARKOW

Scott B. Markow is a registered patent attorney with almost two decades of experience in corporate, law firm, government, and academic settings.

He currently works as Senior Group Patent Counsel for Stanley Black & Decker, Inc., in Towson, MD, where he leads the attorney team that supports the professional power tools and accessories divisions. His practice includes patent portfolio management; preparation and prosecution of patent and trademark applications; preparation of patent and trademark opinions; investigation and management of intellectual property disputes and litigation; and negotiation and drafting of license agreements.
