1 **WHEREAS**, Section 28.109(a)(2)(ii) of the Howard County Charter Howard County Code
2 provides for the County Council to select certain members of the Downtown Columbia
3 Partnership Advisory Committee.

4 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard County,
5 Maryland this 2nd day of April, 2018 that the following individuals are
6 selected as members of the Downtown Columbia Partnership Advisory Committee to
7 serve from the passage of this Resolution to March 19, 2020, or until the County Council
8 selects a successor:

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10 A. The following two individuals selected from a list of four residents living in or in
11 close proximity to the Downtown Columbia Management District submitted by the
12 County Executive:

- 13 1. Joan Lancos; and
- 14 2. Barbara Lawson;

16 B. Chuck Bubeck, who is the owner or general manager of a business located within the
17 District having fewer than 25 employees;

19 C. Kristy Myers, who is the owner of property located in the District who has obtained a
20 building permit for downtown revitalization pursuant to section 125 of the Howard
21 County Zoning Regulations; and

23 D. Bart X. deRosa, who represents the membership required by CEPPA 25 of the
24 Downtown Columbia Plan, an owner of a commercial use pursuant to the Downtown
25 Revitalization Zoning Regulations.
