11	(A) DEFINITIONS.
12	(1) "ELECTRIC VEHICLE" MEANS A VEHICLE THAT USES ELECTRICITY FOR
13	PROPULSION.
14	(2) "Energized outlet" means a connected point in an electrical wiring
15	INSTALLATION AT WHICH CURRENT IS TAKEN TO CHARGE AN ELECTRIC VEHICLE.

18	(B) SCOPE.
19	(1) This section applies to;
20	(I) RESIDENTIAL GROUP R-1 AND RESIDENTIAL GROUP R-2 OCCUPANCIES,

22	(II) RESIDENTIAL OCCUPANCIES WITH MORE THAN TWO UNITS OWNED

1	(I) AT LEAST 1 PARKING SPACE FOR EACH 25 RESIDENTIAL UNITS SHALL
2	FEATURE ENERGIZED OUTLETS; AND
3	(II) A RESIDENTIAL UNIT WITH A GARAGE, CARPORT, OR DRIVEWAY SHALL
4	FEATURE APPROPRIATE ELECTRIC VEHICLE SUPPLY EQUIPMENT CONSISTING OF
5	CONDUCTORS, CONNECTORS, DEVICES, APPARATUS, AND FITTINGS SO THAT AN
