Technical Specialist – Howard County Public School System 2015-Present

My primary focus is the coordination of logistics for the HCPSS's eight summer school programs. I play a key role in the work for two of those programs, our Comprehensive Summer School High School program, and the Summer Institute. For both programs, I am involved in developing the catalog, managing registrations and tuition payments, developing websites, and communicating with parents, guardians, and students to ensure that our programs run successfully and meet the needs of all our students.

Editor – Howard County Public School System 2004 – 2015

I have worked as the primary editor for the Howard County Public School System for nearly a decade. My focus has been the Department of Instruction, where I work with teams from all curricular areas and grade levels to ensure that materials produced by the department meet the high standards expected of a system of our caliber and facilitate the transition to digital learning by redesigning existing products and creating new templates and guides. Beyond curricular materials, I assist in planning technology pilots, and edit policy, grant requests, presentations to the Board, and both internal and external reports.

Information Specialist and Instructor – Howard County Library System 2009 – 2014

The position of Information Specialist and Instructor required that I help patrons from a wide variety of backgrounds navigate the sheer volume of information that now exists at their fingertips. At this particular branch, the majority of interactions involved searching news and research archives, providing instruction on the use of technology tools, teaching patrons how to evaluate sources on and offline, and connecting them with community resources and experts. Additionally, as a member of the Technology Squad, I beta tested new software and hardware, trained my colleagues on new devices, and served as first point of contact for all technology related questions.

Project Assistant - College and Career Readiness Support Project 2010 - 2011

I served as the Project Assistant on an ARRA grant to develop online courses for teachers and students. I was responsible for managing all financials, timelines, reports to the Maryland State to Department of Education, and our 60 person team of staff, contractors, and students. As the project expanded, I led a team in designing and producing MSDE's first app, coordinated several workshops on Universal Design for Learning for teachers and administration, and co-ran a study of the 21st Century learner with design thinking firm, IDEO.
