- [[(c) *Preparation for New Development.* A certificate of approval is not required for the following work when carried out in accordance with an approved subdivision plan, site development plan, forest conservation plan, or grading plan:
 - (1) Construction or alteration of public streets and sidewalks, use-in-common driveways, storm drains and drainage swales, stormwater management facilities, and utility lines;
 - (2) Tree clearing and removal; or

- 9 (3) Installation of forest conservation plantings, street trees, and other required landscaping.]]
- [[(d)]] (C) Building Permit. The Department of Inspections, Licenses and Permits shall not issue a building permit or a grading permit for work requiring a certificate of approval unless the Commission has issued a certificate of approval. The permit shall incorporate any requirements or modifications required by the certificate of approval.
- [[(e)]] (D) *Sign Permit*. The Department of Inspections, Licenses and Permits shall not issue a sign permit for work requiring a certificate of approval unless the Commission has issued a certificate of approval. The sign permit shall incorporate any requirements or modifications required by the certificate of approval.
- [[(f)]] (E) *Posted on Property*. The certificate of approval shall be posted on the property in a location visible from a public street while the work authorized by the certificate is being performed.
- 21 [[(g)]] (F) Expiration of Certificate of Approval. Unless extended by the Commission, a certificate of approval issued by the Commission shall expire automatically if:
 - (1) The work has not been substantially completed within 18 months from the date the certificate of approval was issued for an application for the alteration, repair, moving, or demolition of a structure, or for the construction of a new accessory structure.
 - (2) The work has not been substantially completed within three years from the date the certificate of approval was issued for an application for the construction of a new principal structure.

- [[(h)]] (G) Extension of Certificate of Approval. An application for extension of a certificate of approval shall be treated and considered as a new application before the Commission.
