1 WHEREAS, in 2009 the Howard County Youth Task Force reported that 93.5% of the students who answered the survey believed that youth must be a part of the solution in problem 2 solving in the Community, 96% believed that students could contribute and communicate ideas 3 to a board or commission, and 57.9% voiced interest in participating in such a commission; 4 5 WHEREAS, in 2009, Howard County designated the Howard County Voices for Change Youth Coalition as the resource to engage youth and create positive change in Howard County; 6 WHEREAS, bullying is recognized as a widespread concern for school aged youth and 7 is an often misunderstood problem in schools that results in serious implications for victims of 8 9 bullying and for those who perpetrate the bullying; WHEREAS, bullying has become a national concern as state and local governments and 10 school systems struggle to find ways to address instances of bullying while empowering students 11 to stand up for themselves and for others; 12 WHEREAS, the National Center for Education Statistics, the primary federal 13 government entity for collecting and analyzing data related to education in the United States, 14 reported in its Indicators of School Crime and Safety: 2011, that in 2009, about 28 percent of 12-15 to 18-year-old students reported having been bullied at school during the school year and 6 16 percent reported having been cyber-bullied and about 39 percent of 6th-graders reported being 17 bullied at school, compared with 33 percent of 7th graders, 32 percent of 8th-graders, 28 percent 18 of 9th-graders, 27 percent of 10th-graders, 21 percent of 11th-graders, and 20 percent of 12th-19 20 graders; WHEREAS, the National Association of School Psychiatrists reports that over two-21 22 thirds of students believe that schools respond poorly to bullying, with a high percentage of students believing that adult help is infrequent and ineffective, and that approximately 25% of 23 teachers see nothing wrong with bullying or putdowns and consequently intervene in only 4% of 24 bullying incidents; 25 WHEREAS, the Howard County Public School System reported 300 incidents of 26 bullying, harassment, and intimidation for the 2010-2011 school year; 27 WHEREAS, the County Council recognizes the importance of bringing students into the 28

discussion of effective ways to address bullying in schools by empowering them to participate in

the development of policies and solutions for a community-wide prevention program that

1	promotes a positive school and community climate;
2	WHEREAS, the County Council wants to encourage the youth of Howard County to
3	work collaboratively with parents, teachers, government agencies and the Howard County Public
4	School System to help create a safe and civilized educational environment;
5	WHEREAS, the County Council believes that there could be an innovative approach to
6	addressing bullying that includes students in a review of best practices by the Howard County
7	Public School System and government agencies, and a proactive youth run resource for assisting
8	each other in standing up to bullying;
9	WHEREAS, the County Council recognizes that the topic of bullying is being addressed
10	by other agencies and organizations in the County, and that members of Voices for Change can
11	be the link between the various groups to promote idea sharing and limit duplication of effort;
12	NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard County,
13	Maryland, this 45n day of Fe brung 2013 that the County Council requests that Howard County
14	Voices for Change Youth Coalition provide the County Council, the County Executive and the
15	School Safety Task Force with a report from the youth perspective on bullying in the community
16	by May 31, 2013;
17	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Howard County Voices for Change
18	Youth Coalition report may include information providing the youth perspective on:
19	(1) Frequency of bullying incidents and observed consequences in schools and the
20	community;
21	(2) The effectiveness of current programs and policies before and after occurrences of
22	bullying;
23	(3) Ideas for new programs and policies that may discourage and reduce instances of
24	bullying;
25	(4) The relationship between adults and youth in addressing instances of bullying; and
26	(5) The use of social media and technology in addressing bullying and as a means of
27	providing resources to youth who have been bullied.
