

1	WHEREAS, Section 16.200(a) and Section 16.301 of the Howard County Code provides
2	that variances for governmental uses from the strict application of the zoning regulations are
3	granted by the County Council by Resolution following a public hearing; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, the County has proposed an administration addition to the front of Deep
6	Run Elementary School as shown in the attached Exhibit A; and
7	
8	WHEREAS, the site is zoned R-SA-8 (Residential: Single Attached), a category that
9	imposes a 20 foot structure and use setback (building restriction line) from Old Waterloo Road, a
10	public street right of way; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, Old Waterloo Road used to be known as Maryland Route 175 and was
13	classified as an arterial highway; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, Old Waterloo Road now functions as a local road and requires a 20-foot
16	building restriction line; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, the County proposes to encroach approximately 9 feet into the front 20-foo
19	building restriction line for an addition to Deep Run Elementary School which will allow the
20	implementation of a vestibule area for security measures along with the relocation of school
21	administrative offices; and

23	WHEREAS, the County requests a variance from the strict application of the 20-foot
24	building restriction line in order to construct the school addition approximately 9 feet into the
25	setback area; and

27	WHEREAS, the County Council finds that the proposed variance from the setback
28	(building restriction line) requirements of the R-SA-8 district for this governmental purpose is
29	within the spirit and intent of the Zoning Regulations and is in the public interest.

The Department of Public Works has been designated coordinator for preparation of testimony relative to the above referenced Council Resolution granting a variance from the structure and use setback for an addition to the front of Deep Run Elementary School located along Old Waterloo Road within the R-SA-8 (Residential: Single Attached) Zoning District.

The County proposes to reduce the required 20-foot setback in order to allow a 9-foot encroachment for construction of an addition to Deep Run Elementary School which will allow for the implementation of a vestibule area for security measures along with the relocation of school administration offices into the addition. The County has requested a variance from the strict application of the 20-foot structure and use setback requirements for the construction of the addition to the school.
