Resolution No. <u>106</u> - 2012

A RESOLUTION proposing to repeal Section 906 "Copies of books and papers on demand" and Section 907 "Inspection of books, accounts, and papers" of the Howard County Charter and replace them with new Section 906 "Right to Inspect and Copy Public Records"; making the public access provisions of the County Charter consistent with the Maryland Public Information Act; expanding the public right to inspect records to include all persons; permitting persons to obtain copies of public records upon payment of a reasonable fee prescribed by the County Council; and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.

1	WHEREAS, the Howard County Charter provisions regarding public access to
2	County records conflict with the Maryland Public Information Act ("the PIA"), which
3	governs public access to State, county, and city records; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, the Charter's public access provisions don't protect against
6	disclosure of sensitive personal information such as financial and medical records, but the
7	PIA does protect such records; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, the Charter grants access to County records only to Howard County
10	residents and "representatives of the press," but the PIA grants access to anyone
11	regardless of residency or occupation; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, in order to expand access to County records, protect against
14	disclosure of sensitive personal information, and make the Howard County Charter
15	consistent with the Maryland Public Information Act, the County Council proposes this
16	amendment to the Howard County Charter.

18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
19	County, Maryland, that Section 906 "Copies of books and papers on demand" and
20	Section 907 "Inspection of books, accounts and papers", of Article IX, "General
21	Provisions", of the Howard County Charter, are hereby repealed, and that new Section
22	906 "Right to inspect and copy public records", be added to Article IX "General
23	Provisions", of the Howard County Charter, to read as follows:

25	Article IX. General Provisions.
26	SECTION 906. RIGHT TO INSPECT AND COPY PUBLIC RECORDS.
27	ANY PERSON SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO INSPECT ANY PUBLIC RECORD, IN
28	ACCORDANCE WITH THE MARYLAND PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT, IN THE
29	POSSESSION OF ANY BOARD, COMMISSION, OFFICE, OR DEPARTMENT OF THE
30	COUNTY. A COPY OF ANY SUCH DOCUMENT SHALL BE FURNISHED UPON PAYMENT
31	OF A REASONABLE FEE PRESCRIBED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL.

2	[[Section 906. Copies of books and papers on demand.
3	The Executive shall, with reasonable promptness, furnish to any resident of the
4	County, on demand, a certified copy of any book, account or paper kept by any
5	board, commission, office or department of the County government, or such part
6	thereof as may be demanded, except criminal investigation reports, and individual
7	personnel records, upon payment in advance by the person demanding the same,
8	of a reasonable fee to be prescribed by resolution of the Council.]]

10	[[Section 907. Inspection of books, accounts and papers.
11	All books, accounts, bids, contracts, papers and records of any board,
12	commission, office or department, except criminal investigation reports and
13	individual personnel records, shall at all times be open to the inspection of any
14	resident of the County or representative of the press, subject to such reasonable
15	rules and regulations in regard to the time and manner of such inspection as the
16	Executive may make.]]

18	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
19	County, Maryland, that at the next general election to be held in Maryland, the proposed
20	amendment to the Howard County Charter shall be submitted to the voters of Howard
21	County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with the provisions of the Article X
22	of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution, and if
23	adopted by the majority of the voters, shall stand adopted from and after the 30^{th} day
24	following the general election;

26	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
27	County, Maryland, that this Resolution, having been approved by two-thirds of the
28	members of the Howard County Council, stands adopted this day of
29	, 2012 in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter.
