1	WHEREAS, trafficking is the use of force, threat of force, fraud or coercion to		
2	recruit, harbor, transport, provide or obtain any person for labor or commercial sex or to		
3	cause a person under 18 to engage in a commercial sex act; and		
4	WHEREAS, every year, millions of men, women and children are trafficked in		
5	countries around the world, including the United States, and it is estimated that human		
6	trafficking is a \$32 billion per year industry, second only to drug trafficking as the most		
7	profitable form of transnational crime; and		
8	WHEREAS, human trafficking is a hidden crime, as victims rarely come forward		
9	to seek help because of language barriers, fear of the traffickers, and/or fear of law		
10	enforcement; and		
11	WHEREAS, due to the County's location along the I-95 and I-70 corridors,		
12	Howard County serves as a central geographic zone for human trafficking; and		
13	WHEREAS, the Howard County Police Department states that since 2010 the		
14	number of human trafficking cases has grown, requiring additional resources to address		
15	human trafficking; and		
16	WHEREAS, the State of Maryland has passed and considered a number of bills		
17	that seek to offer additional protections to potential victims while increasing penalties for		
18	perpetrators; and		
19	WHEREAS, it is necessary to establish a collaborative body of organizations in		
20	Howard County to formally adopt a consistent and sustained effort to combat this modern		
21	day slavery; to apply for all available grant funding from the Department of Justice, and		
22	to work to establish a victims services network to free and aide victims of both sex		
23	trafficking and domestic worker trafficking; and		
24	WHEREAS, Section 902 of the Howard County Charter authorizes the creation		
25	of temporary advisory boards of citizens to study policies and issues.

27	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
