



17 Police Major;¹

18 ASSISTANT ADMINISTRATOR;

19 Police Information Specialist; and

20 Police Services Support Supervisor III, serving as the Animal Control Administrator.

23 ¹A Howard County classified employee appointed to this position automatically reverts to the
24 employee's prior rank in the classified service upon removal from the position, unless the removal
25 is based upon such cause as would justify the termination of a classified employee.

27 **Section 2. And Be It Further Enacted** by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland that
28 *this Act shall become effective 61 days after its enactment.*

Currently, the section lists the positions for which the Chief of Police is the appointing authority; the Office of Human Resources is seeking approval to add the classification of Assistant Administrator as an Executive Exempt position within the Office of the Police Chief to enhance the efficiency of operational functions of the office.
