This is an additional supplemental testimony to the memos dated January 31, 2019 and February 11, 2019. Howard County Health Department requests to increase our FY19 spending appropriation by \$817,932 funding which will be provided to us by the Maryland Department of Health (MDH). There are no local funding matches required with this funding. This supplemental request is a result of multiple funding sources:

\$26,271	<b>Rollover of FY18 Behavioral Health Funding.</b> Unspent funding is often approved for spending in the next fiscal year. This funding will be used for treatment initiatives. ( <b>Attachment 1</b> )
\$163,000	<b>State funding to HoCo Police Department to purchase drug testing equipment</b> . HCPD applied for this grant and the State decided to pass the funding through the HCHD. (Attachment 2)
\$100,000	<b>State funding to employees.</b> Mid-year \$500 bonus to all state employees. Note: there was uncertainty if State would provide budget supplements to cover this cost or if LHD would be required to provide within current budgets. Notification was received last week. (Attachment 3)
\$27,000	<b>State funding to employees</b> . Mid-year .5 COLA. Note: there was uncertainty if State would provide budget supplements to cover this cost or if LHD would be required to provide within current budgets. Notification was received last week. <b>(Attachment 3)</b>
\$50,000	<b>State supplement to ACCU Program (Administrative Care</b> <b>Coordination Unit), this is the Medicaid ombudsman program</b> . The State is providing HCHD additional funding to account for our indirect costs that were not taken due to budget constraints and increased salary costs. (Attachment 4)
\$97,768	<b>SOR Recovery Housing Grant.</b> This is state funding given to increase recovery houses in a jurisdiction. (Attachment 5)
\$28,893	<b>State grant supplement for the Breast and Cervical Cancer Program.</b> Funding will be used for screening services. (Attachment 6)

- **\$165,000** State funding supplement to the Medicaid transportation program. Unexpectedly higher utilization due to hospital discharges and increase clients.
- **\$160,000** State funding for Opioid Initiative. Excess funding the State has is being distributed to local jurisdictions mid-year. HCHD submitted a proposal to replace our aging RV that is used for community outreach. Note, we are awaiting notification of our grant proposal.

Your LBHA must submit FY 2018 Rollover Budgets, either a MDH 4542 or if appropriate a MDH 432, to mailbox <u>mdh.bha finance@maryland.gov</u> by March 1, 2019. There should be a single rollover budget for all unspent FY 2018 substance use awards (\$26,274). Please designate the General Fund Services award AS 008 SAS with PCA F826N for the substance use rollover budget.

Rollover funds are one-time-only. Funding of a project with rollover funds does not imply or guarantee continued funding in FY 2020 with State General Funds. Funds utilized for FY 2019 one-time-only award reductions will be restored in FY 2020 for that service.

The awarding of rollover funds by an LBHA to a sub-vendor does not constitute an expenditure. The sub-vendor must fully expend, or appropriately accrue, rollover funds by June 30, 2019. Unspent rollover funds will be reflected on the MDH 440 form for that award and must be returned to MDH. MDH's Division of Grants and Local Health Accounting will issue an invoice to your LBHA based upon the MDH year-end reconciliation (MDH 440) for any unspent FY 2018 Rollover funds.

Any needed revisions to FY 2018 Rollover Budgets must be submitted to BHA's Office of Fiscal Services no later than April 1, 2019. Changes requested after April 1 may not be able to be processed due to end of fiscal year close out procedures and timeframes established by MDH.

Rollover amounts should also be entered into the BHA Web Financial Reporting Application. Guidance on entering rollover amounts into the BHA Web Financial will be distributed later in FY 2019.

Please monitor FY 2018 Rollover expenditures and be prepared to discuss during FY 2019 4th Quarter Monitoring and also as part of BHA's FY 2020 Planning and Budget Review Process.

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Dear Health Officers -

Please see below for an update on LHD COLAs from Jordan Butler. He was able to confirm this information with DBM.

### FY 2019

- A 2% COLA went into effect on January 1, 2019. For this COLA the State has already provided \$1,320,400 to the local health departments. This figure was based off of local health departments' FY 2017 salary expenditures that were supported with State Core funds, Cigarette Restitution Funds, and other administration or categorical funds. The State's support does not account for FY 2017 salaries that were supported with County Core funds or other non-MDH funds.
- The State is also providing support for the 0.5% COLA going into effect in April 2019 totaling approximately \$165,000. The State's support for the 0.5% COLA was calculated using the same approach as in the previous bullet point except with newer FY 2018 salary expenditure data.
- In addition, the State is also providing support to the local health departments for the one-time \$500 bonus to be distributed in April 2019 totaling \$1,574,130. The support will be proportionally distributed to local health departments with the same approach as the COLAs with FY 2018 salary expenditure data.
- Finally, the State is supporting all nurse signing and retention bonus costs incurred by local health departments in the second, third, and fourth quarters of calendar 2018. The costs have already been incurred on local health departments' books, and the Department will be transferring those costs to its books toward the end of FY 2019.

### FY 2020

 State support for the January 1, 2019 2% COLA and the April 2019 0.5% COLA in FY 2019 will be ongoing support. Funding for both of these COLAs have been annualized for a full fiscal year and included in the FY 2020 budget for State Core funding.

• Finally, the State is providing support for the 3% COLA going into effect on July 1, 2019 totaling approximately \$4 million. The State's support for the 3% COLA was calculated using the same approach as the other COLAs with FY 2018 salary expenditure data.

#### **Other Questions**

- There is the potential for an additional 1% COLA to all State employees effective January 1, 2020 if general fund revenue exceeds \$75 million more than the State's December 2018 general fund revenue estimates. If general fund revenue meets this target, the Department will try to secure State support for the local health departments.
- There has not been State support committed for local health departments' costs related to the one grade increase for all nurse classification series effective July 1, 2019 heretofore. However, there's still time left this legislative session for a potential supplemental budget bill to be introduced providing that support. Here's hoping.

Howard County Health Department requests to increase our FY19 spending appropriation by \$817,932 funding which will be provided to us by the Maryland Department of Health (MDH). There are no local funding matches required with this funding. This supplemental request is a result of multiple funding sources:

\$26,271	<b>Rollover of FY18 Behavioral Health Funding.</b> Unspent funding is often approved for spending in the next fiscal year. This funding will be used for treatment initiatives. (Attachment 1)
\$163,000	State funding to HoCo Police Department to purchase drug testing equipment. HCPD applied for this grant and the State decided to pass the funding through the HCHD. (Attachment 2)
\$100,000	<b>State funding to employees.</b> Mid-year \$500 bonus to all state employees. Note: there was uncertainty if State would provide budget supplements to cover this cost or if LHD would be required to provide within current budgets. Notification was received last week. (Attachment 3)
\$27,000	<b>State funding to employees</b> . Mid-year .5 COLA. Note: there was uncertainty if State would provide budget supplements to cover this cost or if LHD would be required to provide within current budgets. Notification was received last week. <b>(Attachment 3)</b>
\$50,000	<b>State supplement to ACCU Program (Administrative Care</b> <b>Coordination Unit), this is the Medicaid ombudsman program</b> . The State is providing HCHD additional funding to account for our indirect costs that were not taken due to budget constraints and increased salary costs. (Attachment 4)
\$97,768	<b>SOR Recovery Housing Grant.</b> This is state funding given to increase recovery houses in a jurisdiction. (Attachment 5)
\$28,893	State grant supplement for the Breast and Cervical Cancer Program. Funding will be used for screening services. (Attachment 6)

Dear Health Officers -

Please see below for an update on LHD COLAs from Jordan Butler. He was able to confirm this information with DBM.

#### FY 2019

- A 2% COLA went into effect on January 1, 2019. For this COLA the State has already provided \$1,320,400 to the local health departments. This figure was based off of local health departments' FY 2017 salary expenditures that were supported with State Core funds, Cigarette Restitution Funds, and other administration or categorical funds. The State's support does not account for FY 2017 salaries that were supported with County Core funds or other non-MDH funds.
- The State is also providing support for the 0.5% COLA going into effect in April 2019 totaling approximately \$165,000. The State's support for the 0.5% COLA was calculated using the same approach as in the previous bullet point except with newer FY 2018 salary expenditure data.
- In addition, the State is also providing support to the local health departments for the one-time \$500 bonus to be distributed in April 2019 totaling \$1,574,130. The support will be proportionally distributed to local health departments with the same approach as the COLAs with FY 2018 salary expenditure data.
- Finally, the State is supporting all nurse signing and retention bonus costs incurred by local health departments in the second, third, and fourth quarters of calendar 2018. The costs have already been incurred on local health departments' books, and the Department will be transferring those costs to its books toward the end of FY 2019.

#### FY 2020

 State support for the January 1, 2019 2% COLA and the April 2019 0.5% COLA in FY 2019 will be ongoing support. Funding for both of these COLAs have been annualized for a full fiscal year and included in the FY 2020 budget for State Core funding.



• Finally, the State is providing support for the 3% COLA going into effect on July 1, 2019 totaling approximately \$4 million. The State's support for the 3% COLA was calculated using the same approach as the other COLAs with FY 2018 salary expenditure data.

#### **Other Questions**

- There is the potential for an additional 1% COLA to all State employees effective January 1, 2020 if general fund revenue exceeds \$75 million more than the State's December 2018 general fund revenue estimates. If general fund revenue meets this target, the Department will try to secure State support for the local health departments.
- There has not been State support committed for local health departments' costs related to the one grade increase for all nurse classification series effective July 1, 2019 heretofore. However, there's still time left this legislative session for a potential supplemental budget bill to be introduced providing that support. Here's hoping.
