member shall serve as a citizen advisory member and shall be appointed by the County Executive



The Howard County Volunteer Firefighters Association values the opportunity to meet and communicate with the leadership of the Department of Fire and Rescue Services and the County Administration. Recently, this has been accomplished thru meetings held with the Executive Board of the Howard County Volunteer Firefighters Association. This Board is made up of the Chiefs and Presidents of each of the Volunteer Corporations and the President of the County Association. These meetings have proven to be effective for the decision makers are all present at the table. We have been ensured that this process will continue.

The Fire and Rescue Services Board was formed in 1968. It proved to be an effective medium for the County Commissioners and the leadership of the Volunteer Departments to meet. After the formation of the Department of Fire and Rescue Services in 1971, many things began to change.
