On behalf of the Department of Community Resources and Services (DCRS), I am pleased to submit testimony regarding CB53-2019 An ACT Amending the Membership and Responsibilities of the Board to Promote Self-Sufficiency (BPSS).

The BPSS was created in 2009 with the mission of reducing the incidence of poverty in Howard County by acting as a planning and coordinating body for initiatives that promote the economic stability of individuals and families. The Board does its work by reviewing, coordinating and aligning efforts across sectors to improve the quality of life for all Howard County Residents.

The proposed changes in CB53-2019 do not change the substantive purpose, mission or work of the BPSS. The Board remains an important and vital voice for our community, and valued advisors to the County Executive. The Board has been actively involved over the past 2 years in a planning process that included re-envisioning their work and strategic planning. They were actively involved and consulted in the changes that are being proposed before you today. The changes received a full vote of approval prior to submitting CB53-2019 for your consideration.

The proposed changes before you include:

- a) Language that expands the definitions of eligible members: ex. Individuals who have used services of emergency, transitional or subsidized housing; along with updating language/terms of art like moving away from "welfare to work" to phrases like "stable employment";
- b) Removing from BPSS the sole responsibility for the Human Services Master Plan while maintaining a meaningful role in its development, and allocation of resources to support it; and
- Removing the responsibility for overseeing the Stewart B. McKinney-Vento Homelessness Assistance Act c) Funds. These funds remain the responsibility of DCRS as the Lead Agency for HUD funds and are now administered under the advice and guidance of the Howard County Coalition to End Homelessness and its Board, both established in 2017.

These proposed changes are made in recognition of the need to better align the work of the Board with the growth in infrastructure and capacity of both DCRS and the community as a whole. It is our hope that the evolution of the Boards work will place them in a stronger position to speak directly to the desires of the community to develop programs, policies, resources and funding streams to support a pathway for self-sufficiency for county residents.

<u>Testimony</u>

As a member of the Board to Promote Self-Sufficiency for over 7 years, I am testifying in support of the changes to the membership and responsibilities of the board provided in Bill 53-2019.

While originally charged with the development and oversight of the Plan to End Homelessness and subsequently the Coordinated System of Homeless Services, the BPSS has expanded its scope. The members of this multi-disciplinary board have extended its goals to include the collaborative development, implementation and evaluation of a broad range of services and programs designed to assist our most economically vulnerable residents in developing the resources necessary to meet their basic needs. Given the broad range of resources and services this requires, the BPSS is ideally positioned to convene the necessary organizations and to promote the development of the partnerships that can most effectively and efficiently respond to them. The changes to BPSS will allow it to be proactive in addressing needs upstream, before residents confront homelessness, and the domino effect that often follows.

BPSS has a history of proactive programming, The Getting Ahead program that helps residents to identify the resources needed to move out of poverty, a plan for moving ahead, and the community connections necessary to assist them was an initiative of the Board. BPSS Members worked to tailor this program to Howard County, pilot it in multiple agencies, and evaluate its effectiveness. Likewise, the VITA site program that provides free tax preparation for low-income residents, and the ever-expanding collaborations at the Multi-Service Center and NonProfit Collaborative are all outgrowths of the Board to Promote Self-Sufficiency.

Bringing together leaders with a common long-term goal but who address different aspects of it, continues to provide a unique opportunity to create programming that best meets the needs of economically vulnerable residents of Howard County. I encourage you to support the changes to the membership and responsibilities of the Board to Promote Self-Sufficiency.
