1           **WHEREAS**, Council Bill No. 25-2020 is the Annual Budget and Appropriation  
2 Ordinance for Fiscal Year 2021 and it was adopted on May 27, 2020; and

4           **WHEREAS**, on May 27, 2020, the County Council adopted Council Resolution No. 63-  
5 2019 (“CR63”) that sets forth the Fiscal Year 2021 (“FY21”) Operating Budget for the Board of  
6 Education; and

7  
8           **WHEREAS**, the FY21 Budget for the Board of Education was amended by the passage  
9 of Council Resolution No. 106-2020 (“CR106”); and

10  
11           **WHEREAS**, the County Executive and the County Council received a request from the  
12 Board of Education to increase the FY21 Capital Budget by approximately \$9,733,000 to include  
13 additional State funding; and

14  
15           **WHEREAS**, the additional State funding will be used for capital projects E1035, New  
16 High School #13, and E1043, Talbott Springs Elem School Replacement, and an adjustment will  
17 also be made to E1044 Systemic Renovation; and

18  
19           **WHEREAS**, Section 5-105(c) of the Education Article of the Annotated Code of  
20 Maryland provides that nonlocal funds received by Board of Education after the adoption of the  
21 annual budget may be spent by the Board of Education if the County is notified and approves of:

- 22           (1) The source and amount of the funds; and  
23           (2) The manner of spending the funds.

25           **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard County,  
26 Maryland this 5<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2020 that it approves the inclusion of  
27 approximately \$9,733,000 in state funding into the FY21 Capital Budget for the Board of

Dear Dr. Ball and Chairperson Jung:

Thank you for your continued support of the Howard County Public School System (HCPSS). As you know, the HCPSS FY 2021 Capital Budget was adopted by the Board of Education ("the Board") on June 18, 2020. We are pleased that the final adopted budget supports the continuation of the priority projects of Talbott Springs ES Replacement, New HS #13, and Hammonds HS Renovation/Addition.

On behalf of the Board, I am submitting this request for County approval of an amendment to the Howard County Public School System's FY 2021 Capital Budget, relating to CB25-2020 (county budget ordinance) and CR63-2020 (HCPSS budget resolution) as approved by the Council on May 27, 2020.

A summary of the County Council approved budget, by category, is below, in thousands:

The funding approvals shown for individual major projects may be adjusted due to a number of factors, including the final determination of the area that is eligible for State participation, subtraction of State funding for projects previously approved in an existing facility, and the actual contract cost in some cases. These adjustments will be shown in the worksheets that will accompany the Final FY 2021 Capital Improvement Program publication.

Also note that while approval of planning is a commitment on the part of the State to fund a project, this commitment is made pending continuing eligibility of the project and the availability of funds. Approval of planning cannot guarantee that future State construction funding will be available at the time that it is requested. It is advisable to proceed with a full understanding that local funding may be necessary in order for a project to proceed on schedule.

**Notes:**

- (1) Projects adopted by the IAC as of May 2020 are shown with a status of "A".
- (2) The column titled "FY 2021 CIP Combined Total Approved 100 % Allocation" sums the approved Maryland Capital Construction Bond Loan (MCCBL 2020) authorizations for the capital improvement program, EGRC supplemental grant and funding available from prior year appropriations.
- (3) The Capital Budget Bill (SB 191, Laws of Maryland Ch. 537) provided an appropriation of \$75 million and set specific funding levels for LEAs from the supplemental capital grant program for local school systems, of which \$25 million is not required to have a local match.
