- 1 WHEREAS, the County Council has adopted the Annual Budget and Appropriation 2 Ordinance, and having considered all sources of revenue, has found it necessary to levy and 3 impose a property tax to balance the budget; and
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5 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6-302 of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated 6 Code of Maryland, the County Council is authorized to set a property tax rate on real property 7 within Howard County; and

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9 WHEREAS, Section 6-302 of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated Code of 10 Maryland requires that the property tax rate for personal property and operating real property 11 assessed under Section 8-109(c) of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, 12 be set at no more than 2.5 times the rate for real property.

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14 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard County, 15 Maryland this 27^{-1} day of $\underline{M_{2}}$, 2020, pursuant to Section 6-302 of the Tax - Property 16 Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, that it hereby imposes a Howard County property 17 tax for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2021 upon the assessment of 18 property subject to the property tax in Howard County; and

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20 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the tax rate on real property is hereby fixed at 21 **\$1.014 on each \$100** of assessed valuation of such property; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the tax rate on operating personal property and operating real property owned by a public utility under § 8-109 of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland is set at **\$2.535 on each \$100** of assessed valuation of such property; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive shall cause the property tax
to be collected in the manner provided by law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the property tax rate shall be effective July 1, 2020
 and shall continue in effect until changed or repealed by subsequent resolution of the County
 Council.

I received & reviewed the Howard County Section of the recent Baltimore Sun, regarding the Council Public Hearing Legislation listing.

Ref the resolution levying property tax for July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021, I would like to request the council and Mr. Ball change the time of years allowed for a property tax reduction/discount for years of residence in the home. The tax is discounted if one resides in the home for 40 years. A recent survey published the last few months indicated that persons purchase a home later in age due to work/age, profession & monetary reasons ... therefore reside in a home only 30 years. The 40 year benchmark for a discount is out of date and should be lowered. It would be more fair and an encouragement to reside here & care for the property.

I have been living continuously in my home purchased in 1981 - making it shy of the allowable 40 yr. living in home discount. I am healthy, although hearing impaired, a widow, in my 80's...I care for my home & property. A change in the Live In Property Tax Discount to 30 years would ease the monetary burden on those of us in this category only for a short time having paid the high county tax for 38 years.... but would encourage current and new county residents to buy, maintain, & stay in their home thereby supporting Howard County.
