

**Amendment 1 to Council Bill No. 61-2020**

**Amendment No. 1**

*(This amendment expands the parameters of the “Green Cultural Trail”.)*

1 In Exhibit A attached to the Bill, on page 70, in “Policy 1.7 “Green Cultural Trail””, immediately  
2 before the period, strike “West End and beyond” and substitute “tributaries’ headwaters”.

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4 In Exhibit A attached to the Bill, on page 125, in “Policy 5.2 “Sidewalk and Trail Connectivity””  
5 strike “Implementing Action f. Trails:” and substitute “d. Trails:”. On the same page, in the item  
6 “i. “Green Cultural Trail””, immediately before the period strike “West End and beyond” and  
7 substitute “tributaries’ headwaters”. Also, on the same page, in the item “ii. “New Cut Trail””, in  
8 the first sentence, strike “and the proposed “green cultural trail”” and at the end of the first  
9 sentence, before the period, insert “via the proposed ‘green cultural trail’”.

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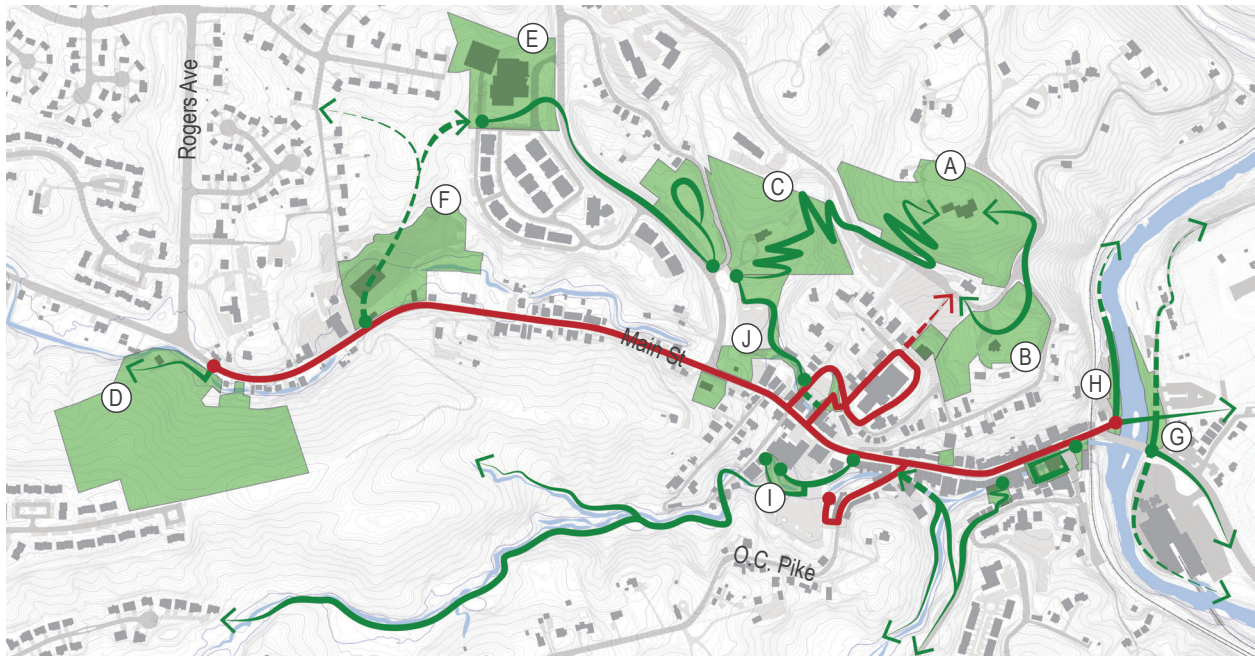

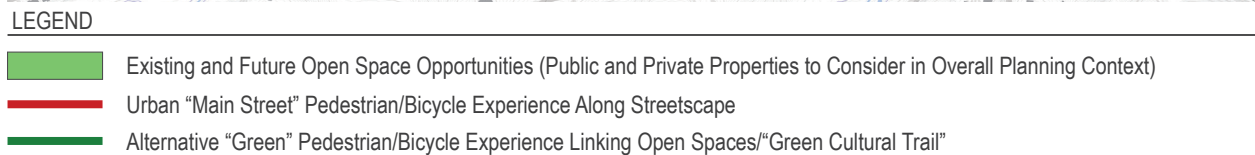
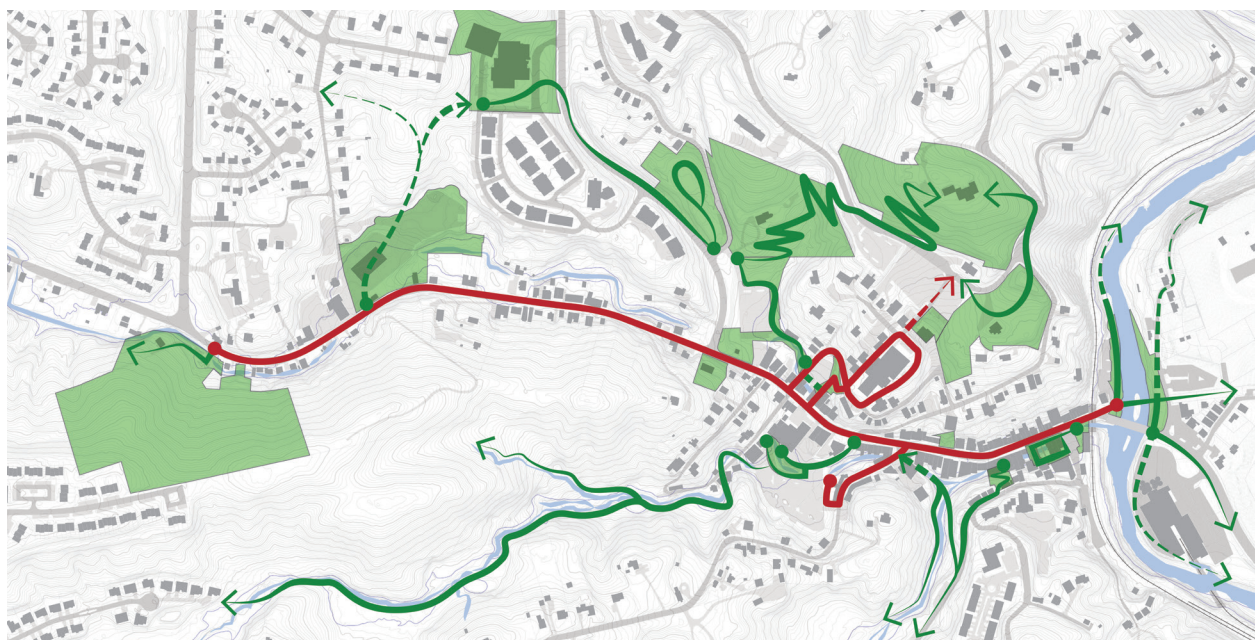


Figure 77: “Green Cultural Trail,” Open Opportunity Sites and Pedestrian/Bicycle Connections

12 Substitute the attached maps for Figure 31 on page 71 of Exhibit A and Figure 77 on page 124 of

trails, hard surface shared-use pathways, and bridges connecting to the downtown core.

**b. Capital Project Coordination:** Use capital projects—such as flood mitigation projects, park improvements, or other changes to county owned-land—to provide missing links in the pedestrian network.

**c. New and Extended Sidewalks:**

**i. Old Columbia Pike Sidewalk Extension:** Improve the existing sidewalk connecting Lot D and Main Street. Fill in missing sidewalk sections from Lot D to Montgomery Road to provide safer pedestrian access to the core.

**ii. Main Street/Frederick Road Sidewalk Extension:** As outlined in WalkHoward, Extend the sidewalk along one side of Main Street/Frederick Road from Rogers Avenue

to Plumtree Drive and beyond to connect with the existing sidewalk network and the Miller Library.

**iii. College Avenue Sidewalk Extension:** Evaluate the need, feasibility and extent of extending a sidewalk along College Avenue, connecting the core to the neighborhoods off College Avenue.

**iv. Court House Drive Sidewalk:** As identified in the county’s pedestrian master plan, WalkHoward, add a sidewalk along Court House Drive.

**v. Rogers Avenue Sidewalk Extension:** Evaluate extending a sidewalk along Rogers Avenue from Main Street/Frederick Road to Court House Drive/Rogers Avenue to connect the core to the neighborhoods off Rogers Avenue.
