The premise of the program was to help adolescents locate their natural connections after being placed in state care. This work was cutting edge and helped to connect young people with loved-ones after they were set to age out of the Department of Children and Families system.

Behavioral Health Associates, Green Pharmacy, and
Montgomery County Health Care for the Homeless. This
model co-located a psychiatrist at the county homeless
shelter. Green pharmacy will also be on site. We are poised
to serve the severely mentally ill/homeless population in a
unique bridge which enables services at a place where it is
convenient to the clients.
