AN ACT to modify the restriction on the use of excess surplus revenue pursuant to Section 615B of the Howard County Charter in order to use excess surplus revenue from prior years to fund recurring expenses in the Fiscal Year 2021 budget; providing that this act shall be temporary, in an attempt to minimize service or employee reductions due to COVID-19 and recession impact, and shall expire by June 30, 2021; and declaring that this Act is an Emergency Bill necessary to meet an immediate emergency affecting public health, safety or welfare.

1	WHEREAS, the County Executive has prepared the Annual Budget and Appropriation
2	Ordinance of Howard County, Fiscal Year 2021 that contains the capital and operating budget
3	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2021 (FY21 Budget); and
4	
5	WHEREAS, because of the state of emergency surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic
6	and economic recession, the County will face a significant loss in revenue upon which to fund
7	necessary and recurring expenses in the FY21 Budget; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, for Fiscal Year 2021, only, the County has determined that excess surplus
10	revenue from prior fiscal years is necessary to fund recurring expenditures in the FY21 Budget in
11	order to minimize service or employee reductions due to COVID-19 and to minimize the impact
12	of an economic recession; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 615B of the Howard County Charter, the use of excess
15	surplus revenue is restricted to (1) fund capital projects, (2) reduce existing County debt; and/or
16	(3) fund appropriations in the current expense budget for capital outlay and for non-recurring
17	expenses; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, Section 615B also provides that the restriction on the use of excess surplus
20	may be modified by an ordinance passed by an affirmative vote of 2/3 of the members of the
21	County Council; and

23	WHEREAS, the County wishes to temporarily modify the restriction on the use of
24	excess surplus revenue to allow for the use of excess surplus revenue to fund recurring
25	expenditures in the FY21 Budget; and

27	WHEREAS, because the necessary and recurring expenditures contained in the FY21
28	budget cannot be funded without this temporary modification of the restriction on the use of
29	excess surplus revenue, pursuant to Section 209(d) of the Howard County Charter, this
30	Emergency Bill is necessary to meet an immediate emergency affecting the public health, safety,
