Fiscal Impact:

There is no anticipated fiscal impact anticipated from this legislation.

Per the Administration, this is only a change in the County's practice of issuing "registrations" rather than "licenses". Revenues previously collected as an "electricians' license fee" will now be referred to as an "electricians' registration fee".

Purpose:

This legislation changes the County Code's references to County electrical "licenses" to become "registrations" in accordance with State law, which now requires the licensing of Master Electricians to be authorized by the State of Maryland Electrical Licensing Board.

Other Comments:

Our Office has noted that the FY 2022 fee schedule for the Department of Inspections, Licenses, and Permits, approved via CR72-2021, was updated appropriately for this legislation by changing its references to "electricians' licenses" to "electricians' licenses or registrations".

Testimony Regarding Changes to The Electrical Licensing Law

In the State of Maryland Legislative Session 2021, the State has taken over the licensing of all Master Electricians. That legislation allows the local jurisdictions to change from licensing electricians to registering them for any work performed within that jurisdiction. In order to comply with the State's imposed change, the proposed legislation eliminates the word 'license' and requires all previous licenses to be converted to registrations in all local jurisdictions.

The State of Maryland Electrical Licensing Board will now be the authority within the State that will license all Master Electricians. Howard County will no longer license Master Electricians and all licenses will be converted to registrations in order for them to apply for and perform electrical work within the County.
