Resolution for the Closure of a Lynx Lane

The Department of Public Works has reviewed the proposed legislation concerning the closing of Lynx Lane. In accordance with Section 18.204(g) of the Howard County Code, the department is required to develop a report of the closing of Lynx Lane. The Department's findings are as follows:

- The Department of Planning and Zoning (DPZ) has reviewed the road closure and supports the proposed closure as part of a revitalization and redevelopment of Wilde Lake Village Center. DPZ has indicated privatization of the road will allow for enhancement of the pedestrian streetscape. On May 3, 2012, the Howard County Planning Board recommended approval of Zoning Board Case No. 1096M anticipating the closure "to further the potential for a more creative and pedestrian –friendly streetscape design".
- 2. The Department of Public Works has reviewed the legislation and the following is provided:
- Howard County, Maryland is the fee simple owner of Lynx Lane by deed dated January 21, 1969, and recorded in the Land Records of Howard County, Maryland in Liber 503, Folio 213.
- The road right of way is approximately 50 feet wide and .14 miles in length. The road closure was posted on Wednesday September 12, 2012.
- The Traffic Engineering Division evaluated the closure with respect to pedestrian and vehicular traffic circulation. Lynx Lane was constructed to serve a commercial area including Wilde Lake Village Center. The road provides access between Twin Rivers Road and Cross Fox Lane. Alternative routes include Twin Rivers Road to Cross Fox Lane. There are twelve drives to commercial parking lots located along Lynx Lane.

The paved and curbed roadway measures approximately 29 feet wide and 778 feet long. There is existing sidewalk the entire length of Lynx Lane on the west side and a small section of sidewalk on the east side. Lynx Lane, with a posted speed limit of 25 mph, serves as a walking route for students of Wilde Lake Middle School and Wilde Lake High School. There are two existing crosswalks on Lynx Lane. A County maintained school flasher and traffic signal facilities to serve the intersection of Lynx Lane and Twin Rivers Road are located within the road right of way. There has been one reported crash in 2010 involving a bicyclist running into a car. There is no record of traffic volumes.

- d. The Bureau of Utilities has indicated there are no public water and sewer facilities within Lynx Lane.
- e. Council Resolution No. 153-2012 to surplus the roadbed has been submitted to the County Council for consideration. Upon approval, the roadbed will be transferred to the Wilde Lake Business Trust. The transfer will be subject to easements for the County's existing traffic facilities and for existing phone, gas and electric facilities maintained by the Baltimore Gas & Electric Company and Verizon.
- 3. The attached Memorandum to Stephen LeGendre, Executive Secretary, County Council, indicates that the adjacent property is owned by Wilde Lake Business Trust, and Star KFC Realco Two, LLC. Other nearby owners include the Columbia Association, Inc, the Wilde Lake Interfaith Religious Center, and the Board of Education of Howard County.
- 4. The Howard County Police Department has evaluated the proposed closing and indicates that the closure will have no adverse impact on public safety or traffic conditions.
- 5. The Department of Fire and Rescue Services has evaluated the proposed closing and indicates that the closure will have no impact on the services provided by the department subject to the requirement that access to all structures and proposed structures within the village center is maintained at all times thru a 24' wide private road or a 20' wide Fire Department access road restricted to emergency vehicle use only.

In conclusion, the closure will not have any adverse effect on public safety or convenience to the commercial community. The Department of Public Works supports the legislation to close Lynx Lane subject to the maintenance of access for emergency vehicles. The department recommends that the County retain ownership to Lynx Lane until such time as the following items have been accomplished:

1. Reservation of any easements for the County's traffic facilities including a school flasher, BGE's existing gas and electric facilities, and Verizon's telephone facilities.

There will be no fiscal impact to the County. The petitioner will be required to file all necessary subdivision plans, site development plans and developer agreements with the County and perform all construction activities.

The Department of Planning and Zoning supports proposed Council Resolution __ - 2012 to close Lynx Lane, as shown in Exhibits A and B, in accordance with §18.204 of the Howard County Code.

The proposal is submitted in conjunction with the revitalization of the Wilde Lake Village Center to support redevelopment of the site. Privatization of the road will allow for the enhancement of the pedestrian streetscape and re-organization of the site.

On October 27, 2010, the Howard County Design Advisory Panel reviewed the design guidelines for this revitalization project and on May 3, 2012, the Howard County Planning Board recommended approval of Zoning Board Case No. 1096M, both of which anticipate a request for the closing of the public right of way to further the potential for a more creative and pedestrian-friendly streetscape design.

Fiscal Impact

There is no immediate fiscal impact associated with adoption of this Council Resolution.

As requested by your office we have posted the Notice of Public Hearing signs concerning the closure of Lynx Lane with the hearing date of October 15, 2012 at both approaches of Lynx Lane with Twin Rivers Road and Cross Fox Lane on Wednesday September 12, 2012.

Lynx Lane has the following characteristics:

- Lynx Lane between Twin Rivers Road and Cross Fox Lane serves an established commercial area.
- The paved curbed roadway is 29 feet wide and 778 feet long and curbed on both sides for its entire length. Access at Twin Rivers Road is controlled by a signal. Access at Cross Fox Lane is controlled by a stop sign.
- There is a 4 foot wide sidewalk for the entire length on the west side and small section of sidewalk on the east side on Lynx Lane.
- An alternative route would be Twin Rivers Road to Cross Fox Lane or Twin Rivers Road to Trumpeter Road.
- There are twelve drives to parking lots to the commercial establishments along Lynx Lane.
- There is no record of traffic volumes.
- Lynx Lane is part of a walking route to Wild Lake High School for students who live north of Twin Rivers Road. There is a flashing school zone beacon and two existing crosswalks on Lynx Lane for the commercial businesses. There are also crosswalks at both ends of Lynx Lane to cross the major roadway.
- Speed limit is posted at 25 mph.
- Access to Lynx Lane will be required for any business still in operation.
- There was one recorded crash in 2010 concerning a bicycle running into a car. No additional accident information is available.

Subject: Lynx Lane Closing

Hello Tina,

I am responding to the memorandum dated September 4, 2012 to Steve Gerwin requesting information relative to public water & sewer utilities that may be located in the Lynx Lane area, which is scheduled to be closed.

There are no public water and sewer utilities within the limits of Lynx Road that will require public utility easements. Our system records show that there is a short segment of 3-inch water line along Lynx Lane that was either (1) constructed and then abandoned by the developer, or (2) never constructed. Neither case requires a public easement.

- Howard County, Maryland is the fee simple owner of Lynx Lane by deed dated January 21, 1969 and 1. recorded in the Land Records of Howard County, Maryland in Liber 503, Folio 213. The road is approximately 50 feet wide and .14 miles in length.
- 2. Wilde Lake Business Trust, c/o Kimco Realty Corporation, 1954 Greenspring Drive, Suite 330, Timonium, Maryland 21093, owns the adjacent property shown on Tax Map 29; Parcel 272, as Lots 3, 4, 5 & 6; and Parcel 132, as Lots 1, 2, & 3.
- Star KFC Realco Two, LLC, 515 Congress Avenue, Suite 1400, Austin, Texas 78701, owns the adjacent 3. property shown on Tax Map 29, Parcel 272, as Lot 7.

Carl,

The Office of the Fire Marshal has the following comments / concerns in reference to the closing of Lynx Lane.

Additional information is needed concerning the language of this proposal. Is the road going to be closed to all traffic or is it going to be designated as a private road with public access?

The Fire Marshal will still require access to all structures and proposed structures within the village center. This will also include access to Cross Fox Lane from Twin Rivers Road. At minimum a private road shall be 24' wide and allow for parking on both sides. A "Fire Department Access Road" is required to be 20' wide and can be restricted to emergency vehicle use only.
