ADMINISTRATIVE HANDLING FEE AND PENALTY FOR UNPAID PARKING CITATIONS AND AUTOMATED RED LIGHT ENFORCEMENT CITATIONS

Section 21.203 of the County Code authorizes the County Council to establish an administrative handling fee charged to individuals who receive a parking citation or an automated red light enforcement citation and fail to pay the appropriate fine and fail to file an intention to stand trial, and a penalty in the event the MVA is notified of the failure.

Failure to pay fine.

\$10.00 for each month or fraction of a month until the citation is satisfied.

Penalty in the event the Motor Vehicle Administration is notified of a person's failure either to pay a fine or to file a notice of intent to stand trial for a citation.

\$10.00 per notification

^{*} All fines are in addition to \$2 in costs payable to the County in an uncontested parking or impounding case, in accordance with Section 7-301 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
