1	WHEREAS, Plan Howard 2030, the County's General Plan, recommended the
2	updated of regulations relating to gasoline stations; and
3	WHEREAS, during the Comprehensive Zoning process in 2013 the County
4	considered adding specific standards for alternative fueling stations throughout the
5	County, without adopting related legislation; and
6	WHEREAS, the Council recognizes the need to continue the analysis initiated in
7	the Comprehensive Plan and General Plan and has received a request to amend the
8	decision-making standards in the Zoning regulations for the use of gasoline stations in
9	Howard County; and
10	WHEREAS, as alternative fuels, including biodiesel and electricity, become
11	more popular there is an increased demand for alternative fueling stations and associated
12	parking; and the demand for conventional gasoline will decrease, while the demand for
13	alternative fueling stations and associated parking will increase; and
14	WHEREAS, the Council recognizes the need to study New Town zoning as a
15	whole, including fueling stations; and
16	WHEREAS, Section 902 of the Howard County Charter authorizes the creation
17	of temporary advisory boards of citizens to study policies and issues.
