Fiscal Impact:

There will not be any direct fiscal impact from this legislation, as this legislation only endorses and authorizes the County Executive to apply for certain grants.

If the grant applications are approved, the County can expect FY 2024 grant revenues and expenditures of \$5,934,739 for the Office of Transportation (OOT) and expenditures of \$676,783 for the County match requirement. Each grant would require a County match that ranges from 10 to 25 percent of the grant award.

Per the Administrator of the OOT, all grants in the below table will be appropriated in its FY 2024 Operating Budget, while required match amounts will come from general fund and program revenue appropriations in the OOT's FY 2024 Operating Budget request.

Purpose:
