12	Terms in this subtitle have the meanings indicated:
13	(h) At large means:
14	(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a domesticated animal
15	is at large when it is:
16	(i) Off the property of its owner (property of the owner does not include
17	any public right-of-way or easement, common area of condominiums or apartments,
18	common access road or walkway, or any area open to the public); and
19	(ii) Not IN A CONTAINER, CARRIER, OR CAGE OR secured by a leash or lead
20	and under the control of a responsible person capable of immediate and effective restraint
21	of the animal.
22	(2) A domesticated animal is not at large when it is:
23	(i) Under the control of a responsible person capable of immediate and
24	effective restraint of the animal and being trained or used in herding, hunting, or tracking;
25	(ii) Being trained in obedience; [[or]]
26	(iii) On park [[land]] PROPERTY, as defined in section 19.201 of the
27	County Code, which has been designated by the Director of [recreation] RECREATION and
28	[parks] PARKS as a facility for animals, provided the owner of the animal complies with
29	the rules of the facility; OR
30	(IV) ON PRIVATE PROPERTY THAT IS ENCLOSED AND POSTED AS A DOG PARK.
