AN ACT for purposes of the property tax credit for real property owned by certain disabled law enforcement officers or rescue workers, amending the definition of disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker; and generally relating to the property tax credit for real property owned by certain law enforcement officers or rescue workers.

1	Section 1. Be It Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that the Howard
2	County Code is amended as follows:

6	Subsection (a) of Section 20.119A. Credit for disabled law enforcement officer or rescue
7	worker or surviving spouse of fallen law enforcement officers or rescue workers.

10	Subtitle 1. Real Property Tax; Administration, Credits, and Enforcement.
11	Part II. Statewide Tax Credits.

13	Section 20.119A. Credit for disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker or surviving
14	spouse of fallen law enforcement officers or rescue workers.
15	(a) <i>Definitions</i> . In this section the following words have the meanings indicated:
16	(1) (i) Disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker means an individual who:
17	1. Has been found to be permanently and totally disabled by an administrative body
18	or court of competent jurisdiction authorized to make such a determination; and
19	2. Became disabled:
20	a. As a result of or in the course of employment as a law enforcement officer or
21	correctional officer for Howard [[County]]COUNTY, BALTIMORE COUNTY, or a
22	jurisdiction with reciprocity; or CORRECTIONAL OFFICER FOR ANY COUNTY OR
23	<u>CITY IN THE STATE OF MARYLAND OR THE STATE OF MARYLAND; OR</u>
24	b. While in active service of a career or volunteer fire, rescue, or emergency
25	medical service of Howard [[County]]COUNTY, BALTIMORE COUNTY, or a
26	jurisdiction with reciprocity. MEDICAL SERVICE OF ANY COUNTY OR CITY IN
27	THE STATE OF MARYLAND OR THE STATE OF MARYLAND.
28	(ii) Disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker does not include an individual
29	whose disability is the result of:
30	1. The individual's own willful misconduct or abuse of alcohol or drugs; or

31	2. An occupational disease that did not result from an accidental injury within the
32	meaning of those terms under the Maryland Workers Compensation Act.
33	(2) (i) <i>Dwelling</i> means real property that:
34	1. Is the legal residence of a surviving spouse or disabled law enforcement officer or
35	rescue worker; and
36	2. Is occupied by not more than two families.
37	(ii) Dwelling includes the lot or curtilage and structures necessary to use the real property
38	as a residence.
39	(3) Fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker means an individual who dies:
40	(i) As a result of or in the course of employment as a law enforcement officer or
41	correctional officer; or
42	(ii) While in the active service of a fire, rescue, or emergency medical service, unless the
43	death was a result of the individual's own willful misconduct or abuse of alcohol or
44	drugs.
45	(4) Jurisdiction with reciprocity means a jurisdiction in the State of Maryland that offers a
46	similar credit to a Howard County disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker.
47	(5) Surviving spouse means a surviving spouse, who has not remarried, of a fallen law
48	enforcement officer or rescue worker.

50	(b) Credit. In accordance with section 9-210 of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated Code of
51	Maryland, an owner of real property may receive a property tax credit under this section against the
52	County property tax imposed on a dwelling if the owner is a disabled law enforcement officer or rescue
53	worker or the surviving spouse of a fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker and:
54	(1) The dwelling was owned by:
55	(i) The disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker at the time the law enforcement
56	officer or rescue worker was adjudged to be permanently and totally disabled; or
57	(ii) the fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker at the time of the fallen law
58	enforcement officer or rescue worker's death;
59	(2) (i) The disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker, fallen law enforcement officer or
60	rescue worker or the surviving spouse was domiciled in the State as of the date of the fallen law
61	enforcement officer or rescue worker's death or the disabled law enforcement officer or rescue

62	worker's disability; and;
63	(ii) The dwelling was acquired by the disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker or
64	surviving spouse within two years of the date the disabled law enforcement officer or rescue
65	worker was adjudged to be permanently and totally disabled or the fallen law enforcement
66	officer or rescue worker's death; or
67	(3) The dwelling was acquired after the surviving spouse or disabled law enforcement officer or
68	rescue worker qualified for a credit for a former dwelling under item (B)(1) or (B)(2) of this
69	subsection, to the extent of the previous credit.
70	(c) Amount of Credit. The amount of the tax credit is equal to 100 percent of the County property
71	tax imposed on the dwelling UP TO \$6,000.
72	(d) Term of Credit.
73	(1) The tax credit continues until the surviving spouse remarries or until the disabled law
74	enforcement officer or rescue worker is no longer permanently and totally disabled as
75	determined by an administrative body or court of competent jurisdiction authorized to make
76	such a determination. Additional applications are not required.
77	(2) An individual who received a credit based on employment or service in a jurisdiction with
78	reciprocity is not disqualified from receiving the credit because the jurisdiction discontinues
79	offering a similar credit to a Howard County disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker.
80	(e) Application. A surviving spouse or disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker:
81	(1) Is eligible for the tax credit beginning in the first taxable year after the date of the:
82	(i) Fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker's death; or
83	(ii) Disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker's disability; and
84	(2) Shall apply for the tax credit on or before September 30 in the taxable year for which the credit
85	is requested to begin.
86	(f) Administration.
87	(1) The Director of Finance shall develop an application form and establish procedures to
88	administer the tax credit established in this section.
89	(2) Notwithstanding subsection (d) of this section, the Director of Finance may require an
90	individual who receives a tax credit under this section to provide evidence of continued
91	eligibility for the credit.

- 92 *Construction*. An individual who worked for a jurisdiction with reciprocity is eligible to

# (This amendment:

- 1. Provides that individuals who became disabled in the course of employment with a City or a State law enforcement agency or while in active service of a City or State career or volunteer fire, rescue or emergency medical service are included in the definition of disabled law enforcement officer.
- 2. Adds a \$6,000 cap for the amount of credit to be issued.
- 3. Removes certain obsolete language.)

The purpose of this legislation is to amend the definition of disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker by adding Baltimore County to the current definition. The effect of this change is that a disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker may have become disabled as result of employment in Baltimore County.

Our local property tax revenues may decrease due to more taxpayers becoming eligible however we are unable to determine the fiscal impact. The amount of the decrease depends on the assessed value of the residential property that is eligible for the property tax credit. We do not have reliable information currently to determine the fiscal impact, but we are averaging approximately \$4,062 for Tax Year 2023 (Fiscal Year 2023/2024) for those already receiving this tax credit.
