1	WHEREAS, communities across the world are facing impacts from the ever-growing threat of
2	global climate change, which includes rising temperatures, increased heat waves and
3	droughts, more frequent severe weather events, sea level rise, and environmental
4	degradation;
5	WHEREAS, the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) published
6	its Sixth Assessment Report on August 7, 2021, which highlights that climate change has
7	occurred at an "unprecedented" pace and notes that "it is unequivocal that human
8	influence has warmed the atmosphere, ocean and land.";
9	WHEREAS, the IPCC Sixth Assessment Report firmly establishes that "limiting human-induced
10	global warming to a specific level requires limiting cumulative CO2 emissions, reaching
11	at least net zero CO2 emissions, along with strong reductions in other greenhouse gas
12	emissions.";
13	WHEREAS, in 2022, the Maryland General Assembly passed the Climate Solutions Now Act,
14	which requires the state of Maryland to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 60% from
15	2006 levels by 2031 and achieve net-zero emissions by 2045;
16	WHEREAS, the preliminary report of Howard County's Climate Action and Resiliency Plan
17	(CARP) has determined that the transportation sector accounts for approximately 55% of
18	Howard County's local greenhouse gas emissions;
19	WHEREAS, the United States Federal Transit Administration has identified that public
20	transportation is one part of the solution to address climate change and decrease
21	greenhouse gas emissions as "public transportation produces significantly lower
22	greenhouse gas emissions per passenger mile than private vehicles.";
23	WHEREAS, Howard County currently offers public transportation through its partnership in the
24	Regional Transportation Agency of Central Maryland (RTA), which estimates it will
25	provide 640,000 passenger trips in Howard County during FY2023;
26	WHEREAS, the Howard County Office of Transportation has identified a goal of reaching
27	1,000,000 passenger trips through the RTA bus service by FY2025 in an effort to
28	promote sustainable transportation opportunities, decrease traffic congestion, and reduce
29	air pollution in the region;
30	WHEREAS, transit utilization and transit ridership increase when more frequent service,
31	additional travel routes, and longer hours of operation are implemented;
32	WHEREAS, reliable public transportation provides individuals with a multitude of benefits and
33	opportunities, including affordable access to education, employment, recreation,
34	government services, healthcare facilities, and other resources;

1	WHEREAS, in September 2021, Howard County Government began providing free RTA bus
2	service to over 31,000 middle school and high school students enrolled in the Howard
3	County Public School System;
4	WHEREAS, the Howard County Council's Racial Equity Task Force released its Final Report to
5	the County Council on August 3, 2021, which identifies and recommends that the
6	Howard County Council "pass legislation to invest equitably in mass transportation in
7	Howard County and, as a first step, develop a screening tool that can help determine mass
8	transportation investments in priority communities."; and
9	WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the Howard County Council to address the effects of climate
10	change by reducing greenhouse gas emissions, including through funding and
11	strengthening the local public transportation system;
