As long time residents of Howard County, we are writing to express our profound disappointment in Resolution 22-2024, introduced by Council member Liz Walsh, that calls for an "immediate cease-fire in Gaza". This resolution amounts to little more than a one-sided, and incredibly misguided, attempt by a local government entity to involve itself in a complex international issue in which it has absolutely no expertise. Absent a compelling local government interest in the region (for example, through a cultural exchange or 'sister city' program), there is simply no rationale or basis for issuing such statements on international events.

The first sentence of the resolution, "Whereas all human life is precious, and the targeting of civilians, no matter their faith or ethnicity, is a violation of international humanitarian law" implies strongly that Israel is actively targeting civilians. In fact, compelling evidence exists that Israel, unlike Hamas, has gone to great lengths to reduce civilian casualties. The resolution makes no mention of the barbarity of Hamas' crimes against Israel. The resolution goes on to call for the Biden administration to "promptly send and facilitate the entry of humanitarian assistance into Gaza." In fact, this is already being done, and the administration has continued to work with various agencies to help aid those in need. Simply put, calling for an immediate cease-fire without simultaneously calling on the release of all hostages and surrender of Hamas terrorist fighters, as others have indicated, cannot be viewed as a serious solution to the current crisis. I am writing to express concern about the upcoming vote on CR22-2024.

First, Liz Walsh, you should understand that I do want this Hamas- Israel war to end, soon. In fact, I wish it had never started. On December 10 2023 my second cousin Itay Perry was killed in combat in Khan Younis. Itay's mother Ahuva, is my mom's first cousin. Itay's grandfather is my grandfather's brother. These men grew up together in Argentina in a small town called Moisesville. Moiseville is farmland in the interior of Argentina (in the province of Santa Fe) that became a safe haven for Jews escaping pogroms in Eastern Europe in the 1880's. A pogrom is similar to the events that unfolded on October 7t in the south of Israel. They left their lives, their homes, their profession, to learn how to farm and make a new life in Argentina. The bravery of my great grandparents is what saved my family from the Holocaust.

To understand our family tree is to understand Israel it is a melting pot. Ahuva and my mom were close friends as children, however her family moved to Israel at a young age. She married a Syrian man, whose family had been expelled from Syria in 1948 along with all the other Jewish communities. They had four children, Itay was the third. Most of my family remains in Argentina, although three first cousins have immigrated to Israel as young due to financial issues in Argentina and the deadly bomb attack at the AMIA (essentially the JCC in Buenos Aires) that scared their childhood. Hezbollah is thought to be the responsible party but no one has been brought to justice.

Itay was 36 and left behind his wife and three children, the youngest of which is 8 months old. His oldest son, sent him this card that translates to. "I love you, I miss you dad. Please don't get hurt."



As you can see Itay has a beautiful smile and was not a stereotypical soldier. But he was a willing, yet not enthusiastic reservist. As we learned at his funeral and in his eulogies, he had told his wife and close circle that he had go because what if that had happened to them, to his wife, to his children. How can they live in a world where this is possible?

When he came home for a break from service he didn't discuss it, he just wanted to live a normal life, enjoy his baby daughter and be a clown. That was his nickname, he liked to joke around alot.

They live in Modi 'in, which is a few miles from the West Bank. When I was there for Passover a few years ago, I remember that you can hear the Muslim call to prayer from their dining room.

We always joke that those are "our cousins" because they are. And Itay was my cousin, and he is now dead. So yes I want a ceasefire, I want this all to end.

I also want the remaining hostages to be released, including the dead bodies so the families can bury their dead loved ones.

I want Hamas to disappear. I want their genocidal charter to be condemned (they call for the destruction of Israel and the killing of all Jews).

I wish Hamas would come out and surrender so that no innocent Palestinian civilians would be killed.

I want Hezbollah to disappear.

I want all those who have learned to hate Jews (many of which were educated in UNRWA schools) to soften their hearts and consider a different path.

I also want the Jews who hates Muslims to soften their hearts and consider a different path.

I want the Palestinian people to have peace and prosperity.

I want the Abraham accords to succeed and expand in the region.

I want Israel and Saudi Arabia to normalize relations.

If you altered you resolution to all this, I would fully support it, but the way it is written now it simply ignores Israel and the Jewish people. It ignores the existential threat to the Jewish people when there is a terrorist group that has taken hold and built a sophisticated infrastructure to launch attacks on Jewish people and Israel and employs barbaric techniques of embedding in civilian populations to protect its interests.

You are ignoring a whole side of this. It's like when people ignore the fact that there are transgender people and that they exist and refuse to modify their language to include these people.

Please consider that this call for a ceasefire is creating a hostile environment for people like me in Howard County. And perhaps it's in my genes, but we're leaving at the end of the school year. I won't be the first or last Jewish person to leave Howard County because of this. I see the writing on the wall, and I fear it's just too late. Calvin Ball's comments in May 2021. The ceasefire walks out in the schools. Liz Walsh's prior posts on the topic. And now this. The risk is not worth it. I always wondered how brave my ancestors had to be to leave their homes, their occupations to becomes farmers in Moiseville, Santa Fe Argentina. The new place we go is not nearly as far (and I don't claim to be nearly as brave), and in fact this location may also have similar motions etc, but I have been watching from afar and so far they have not. In my heart I know that this flexibility, this ability to adjust and adapt is the reason the people of Israel live. Don't forget that. Am Israel Chai!

Now please turn your attention to the school bus crisis and HCPSS school funding crisis.

My name is Dara Neuman-Sunshine and I have lived in District 4 in Howard County for 14.5 years. I am writing to you today to express my deep concern and strong **OPPOSITION** to Resolution CR 22-2024 introduced by Council Member Liz Walsh.

The main reason for my opposition to CR 22-2024 is that the resolution calls for a ceasefire, but does not explicitly call for the release of all of the 130+ hostages still being held in Gaza by Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad, and other associated terror groups. These hostages include a baby who just turned 1 year old while in captivity, and who have been denied a visit by the Red Cross in violation of international law. The decision to consciously omit the call for the release of all hostages from the resolution submitted to the Howard County Council appears to be a deliberate decision to erase the existence and legitimacy of the lives of these 130+ hostages. This decision alone should make anyone who cares for all of humanity carefully consider what a vote for this resolution would say about their values, commitments, and ethics. Further, the resolution makes no mention of the brutal events of the unprovoked attacks of October 7th, which included the sexual assault of women and girls, and claimed the lives of more than 1200 civilians – brutally murdered in their homes, in the fields, at a dance festival, on the road, and in any place where the terrorists found them. Nor does the resolution acknowledge the more than 200,000 Israelis who have been displaced from their homes since the attacks of October 7th.

The ceasefire resolution also appears to be a one-sided ceasefire, which pins the blame for the devastating loss of innocent civilian life in Gaza and Israel solely on the actions of the State of Israel and the Israel Defense Forces. The resolution fails to acknowledge that Hamas uses the innocent people of Gaza as human shields as part of their war strategy to garner the world's sympathy while Hamas fighters and their leaders are protected in underground tunnels, built with the aid that was intended for the people Hamas governs. The employment of human shields, the placement of weapons depots, rocket launching stations, and command centers inside of dense civilian areas, inside and beneath hospitals, schools, UNHCR facilities, and other places which are sure to result in civilian loss of life have been a hallmark of Hamas' tactics for years and, in this war, have resulted in devastating consequences for the innocent civilian population in Gaza who are unsupportive of Hamas. Therefore, a ceasefire resolution must also acknowledge that the actions of Hamas make them culpable for a substantial percentage of the civilian deaths that have occurred during Israel's war on Hamas.

Whether intended or not, this ceasefire resolution delegitimizes the state of Israel as it strips her rights to defend itself from its enemies. According to its own covenant, Hamas is committed to the destruction of Israel. It has no interest in a peaceful settlement with Israel. The Hamas terrorists have repeatedly vowed to conduct attacks worse than October

7th again and again, so by calling for a ceasefire against Hamas, this resolution essentially calls for the destruction of Israel.

Finally, I question why this resolution should be the work of the Howard County Council. I do not understand why the Howard County Council would single out Israel. Is the Council planning to pass resolutions on other conflicts/wars such as Russia's war on Ukraine in which more than 19,000 Ukrainian children have been abducted from their country for involuntary resettlement in Russian families? Does the Council have any particular expertise on these issues? Are Council Members well versed on the history of the state of Israel? Is formulating international policy within the Council's official duties?

As mentioned, I have lived in Howard County for more than 14 years. I work in Howard County and am raising two children here in Howard County. I have always been proud to call Howard County my home, but am now concerned about my place in this community and the safety of my family and fellow Jews, and this resolution furthers my safety concerns. After the October 7th attacks I contemplated taking down the mezuzah on my door and questioned whether it was safe to send my children to our Synagogue for Hebrew School or to hang Chanukah decorations in my windows. There are real safety concerns that must be acknowledged in advancing resolution CR 22-2024. Since Israel began a just war of self-defense against Hamas, violence against Jews in the U.S. has increased by 360%. Advancing this resolution serves to further isolate the Jewish community and I fear that the passing of this resolution will embolden those who advocate for Israel's destruction in louder and more aggressive ways, all of which makes the Jewish community less secure.

I strongly urge all members of the Council to **REJECT** resolution CR 22-2024 and to instead, focus on actions that will help heal the divisions in our community that this resolution has already caused.

Thank you for your time and your commitment to your constituents and to all of Howard County in this perilous time.

To the members of the Howard County Council and County Executive Calvin Ball,

I am writing to you to express my deep concern and strong opposition to the Resolution (CR 22-2024) introduced by Council Member Walsh which is apparently scheduled to be first considered at the County Council meeting on February 5th.

I express this deep concern and total opposition as an individual Howard County resident, as a retired Rabbi, as a member of Temple Isaiah, as a still practicing clinical social worker with a daughter and grandchildren who also live, work and attend school in Howard County. I am deeply committed to interfaith understanding and to sustaining a community in which the concerns and dignity of all are respected.

My opposition to CR 22-2024 is based on the fact that the resolution calls for a ceasefire, but does not explicitly call for the release of all of the 130+ hostages (or remains of hostages) still being held in Gaza by Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad and other associated terror groups. The ceasefire resolution also appears to be a call for a one-sided ceasefire, which pins the blame for the devastating loss of innocent civilian life in Gaza and Israel solely on the actions of the State of Israel and the Israel Defense Forces. Further, the resolution makes no mention of the brutal events of the unprovoked attacks of October 7th, which claimed the lives of more than 1200 civilians – brutally murdered in their homes, in the fields, at a dance festival, on the road and in any place where the terrorists found them. Again, the details of these attacks have been chronicled by those who witnessed and survived, but also by the explicit body-cam images captured and disseminated by the Hamas terrorists.

I share my opposition to such a divisive and destructive resolution while continuing to have deep concern for the untold amount of suffering being experienced by the civilian population of Gaza. My name is Stanley Kusnetz. My wife is Fany Kusnetz

I am a retired officer of the Commissioned Corps of the U.S Public Health Service. Fany at one time was the Office Manager of the DC Council of Jewish Federations. I was also a volunteer in our County Executive's campaign. We have lived in Howard County since 1979. Our three children are all graduates of Howard County Schools.

Frankly, when I saw the resolution, calling for a cease fire I was very unpleasantly surprised. Consider this, as our county council, your mandate is to make this a better county through legislation and other administrative duties, NOT to take sides in international affairs. The context in this resolution makes it very clear that you are speaking of Israel. You are our council, not our Department of State. You were not elected to take any side in this issue that is a source of passions and division among your constituents.

Further the resolution itself is misleading. You quote a number of Gazan casualties supplied by Hamas and not backed with any evidence whatsoever. Keep in mind Hamas includes the losses of its own fighters presenting the total as all civilian to inflame passions as part of its psychological warfare to influence groups such as this council.

The resolution uses the names of Reps Raskin and Mfume as well that of Sen van Hollen, giving the impression that they support an immediate cease fire. However, those seeming endorsements lack context. Their support is for a Bi-lateral cease fire when the hostages are released as a whole package. None of this is mentioned in your resolution.

When Hamas broke the existing cease fire (one broken cease fire of many) to conduct a brutal invasion of an Israeli holiday festival and nearby citizen communities, committing unspeakable acts, in itself a violation of International law, a goal was to take hundreds of hostages, another violation of international law.

Make no mistake, this was a long time in planning. Council Members,

Liz Walsh, of District 1, pre-filed CR22-2024, "A RESOLUTION demanding an immediate cease-fire in Gaza; calling upon the Biden administration to facilitate certain humanitarian assistance into Gaza; and urging certain elected officials to take immediate action to use their position and influence to end this humanitarian crisis."

There are a few problems with the resolution that need to be addressed and questions that need to be answered before voting on this resolution.

1. The resolution is not related to Howard County governance.

The resolution does not direct the executive branch in its management of Howard County resources and does not provide guidance to residents for how to maintain property and run businesses in Howard County. Because it is not relevant to Howard county governance, this resolution should not have been proposed.

I request that it be withdrawn, or, that the council members exercise professional judgment and abstain from voting on it.

2. The resolution misses the point of this whole war: that Hamas invaded Israel and slaughtered Israelis and kidnapped Israelis.

By putting the two into this one statement in lines four through six, the resolution is trying to equivocate the two parties. There is no equivalence. A violent death cult that glorifies in murder attacked a peaceful people. The latter's government is defending against the continuing attacks and attempting to get its kidnapped people back home.

While I understand that calling for a ceasefire sounds nice, calling for a ceasefire on the part of Israel while Israel is still receiving barrages of rockets from Gaza and Israel still has its people held hostage in tunnels in brutal conditions by a terrorist organization and these terrorists are still at large, is the same as supporting genocide against Israel. To be clear, calling for Israel to cease defending itself against a genocidal terrorist organization is itself a call for genocide.

3. It is not clear which party is to do the ceasing of the firing.

There are a number of parties that are engaged in the conflict related to Gaza:

- Hamas, Islamic Jihad, and other terrorist groups have been firing rockets almost daily into civilian areas in Israel causing damage to buildings, including hospitals, and killing and injuring civilians. This has been ongoing since the October 7th massacre. It's part of a pattern of violence against Israel that started since Hamas took over Gaza in 2007. Just think about it: 15+ years of rocket fire, plus incendiary balloons burning down farms and nature reserves in Israel, as well as killing civilians. This violence against Israel is happening because these terrorist groups are engaging in a religious war of annihilation.

- Hezbollah, an Iranian terror proxy bombarding Israel from Lebanon, killing and injuring people and damaging homes and hospitals.
- Houthis, a group in Yemen bombarding Israel from Yemen and attacking ships in the Red Sea, disrupting shipping in the area.
- Syria, who has a significant Iranian military presence that occasionally aims rockets at Israel.
- Iran, the mastermind of it all, also attacking ships transporting goods, and sending drones to kill US service people in other countries.
- and, finally, Israel, who is defending herself against all these assaults.

If the council members decide that there must be a resolution, I would appreciate clarity on who should be doing the ceasing of the firing. I would support a resolution in which all parties targeting Israel would cease their firing and other assaults, return the hostages, and disarm. This resolution should include a provision supporting Israel's right to defend her citizens.

In addition to ceasing the firing, the resolution should consider condemning entities that are contributing to the conflict:

- Palestinians, from some estimates, 75-95% of the population, some directly and some indirectly, are supporting the Hamas in their murders: by running hospitals, schools, and mosques that serve as Hamas command centers and weapons storage locations; by holding hostages in cages; by rounding up escaped hostages and returning them to captivity; by selling heads from murdered Israelis; by using children as couriers for explosives; by using civilian decoys to ambush Israeli soldiers; by preaching terrorism in mosques; by hiding weapons and tunnel entrances in children's rooms.
- United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) has provided many workers who educate Palestinians to hate Israelis and who are supporting the terrorists. These include: hospital workers and administrative heads and teachers in schools. The teachers have been discovered to celebrate the murder of Israelis, to aid and abet the Hamas terrorists, and to train children to be terrorists.
- Palestinian Authority (PA) head Mahmoud Abbas and his government, that governs the West Bank, where a sizable Palestinian population lives. The PA pays terrorists to shoot, stab, throw projectiles, and car ram random people living in Israel. The PA is also paying the Gaza murderers.
- Qatar, for funding these terrorists.
- Turkey and other countries that give safe haven to these terrorists.
- 4. The provision of humanitarian aid is the responsibility of the United Nations, and not Israel.

Israel is the only country in the world that is being urged to feed, water, and fuel an enemy population that is determined to destroy it. Encouraging this only prolongs the conflict. As long as the Hamas terrorists are comfortably fed, watered, and fueled in their tunnels, they will continue their genocidal war against Israel. In spite of that, hundreds of trucks of humanitarian aid have already entered Gaza through Israel. Unfortunately, the Hamas terrorists intercept this humanitarian aid and prevent the ordinary citizens of Gaza from getting it. A better way for the people of Gaza to get humanitarian aid would be for them to leave and go to a place of safety. The resolution should include exploring ways to make this happen.

Please do not advocate that the US taxpayers that have been funding the UNRWA to the tune of close to 350 million dollars per year and have been sending aid to Gaza ad infinitum ad nauseam, must be taxed to send yet more aid to keep these people in perpetual dependency. UNRWA has been discovered to be staffed with Hamas supporters who have been aiding and abetting Hamas in its terrorism, including by using its facilities as Hamas action sites. UNRWA has socialized the Palestinian population to choose terrorism as a way of life. This is not conducive to peace.

Please include a statement that all humanitarian aid to Gaza should stop until the hostages from Israel are released. There are only 136 of them. Hamas should just return the 136 people and Israel will do a cease fire. The resolution should include this requirement.

In addition, the resolution should include providing humanitarian aid to the Israelis and guest workers in Israel who were

forced to leave their homes and who have lost family members. This aid would be put to better use than the aid going to the Hamas terrorists.

5. The County Council would give the appearance of supporting a religious war.

Jihad is a religious war waged by certain practitioners of Islam, where the parties use terror to try to establish an Islamic caliphate, by forced submission to Islam or by killing the people who refuse to submit. Should Howard County elected representatives be advocating on behalf of a particular religion that has a significant number of believers that believe it's their duty to annihilate an entire people? Wouldn't that amount to Howard County effectively establishing a religion? This sounds like a First Amendment issue. It's also a horrific statement of support of genocide against Jews.

6. This resolution will not make Howard County work better together.

The resolution will make it harder for the new Interfaith Advisory Council; it will make it harder for the Office of Human Rights and Equity; and it will make it harder for programs that bring people together, such as the Courageous Conversations and Howard County Library programs, that work to build connections and encourage recognition of our shared humanity. By choosing one person's humanity over another, particularly, by choosing to support genocidal terrorists, this creates more conflict.

7. Has the impact of this proposed resolution on the people of Howard County been considered?

Many residents were horrified to learn their extended family and friends were subjected to a violent murderous pogrom that happened on October 7, 2023, because of the actions of a genocidal death cult whose members invaded Israel and slaughtered, raped, burned, beheaded, and abused civilians. They have been growing increasingly more horrified at the Nazi- and KKK-like marches around the country calling for their deaths. Telling these residents that their people can't defend themselves is a horrific statement to make — it amounts to condoning the horrific act of attempted genocide.

Please ensure that the resolution, if it is made, makes it clear that the pogrom committed by Hamas is being condemned and that the victims, Israeli citizens and their guest workers, through the Israeli government, have the right to defend themselves and ensure that these kinds of pogroms can't happen again.

8. Is this a new pattern of advocacy for the County Council?

Whenever there is a conflict around the world, should the County Council make a resolution in support of or in opposition to it? Is that practical, and is that wise? Or, is this particular instance, that of a majority Jewish country defending itself from a genocidal terrorist group, so egregious that a resolution needs to be made? If so, then the resolution is antisemitic. Please don't taint yourself by supporting this.

If you need to take a stand on moral principles, standing against Hamas and similar death cults and encouraging Israel's dismantling of them would be the wiser course of action.

Thank you for taking these issues into consideration.

Dear Council Chairperson, Deb Jung,

I am writing to ask you to vote against the motion, CR22-2024, that calls for an imposed immediate ceasefire in the Hamas-Israel war. Such an imposed ceasefire would only benefit the terrorist organization Hamas.

It pains me greatly to see the suffering of the Gazan population. It is not what Israel wants. But **Hamas** has **created** this situation. They have long openly declared their goal to rid Israel of Jews, in fact to go after Jews everywhere. One example was on October 13, less than a week after the original slaughter in Israel, when Hamas leaders called for an assault on Jews all over the world.

When Hamas perpetrated the massacre on Israeli men, women, children and babies on October 7th, they demonstrated the reality of their stated goals in the most inhumanly grotesque way. A friend recently asked me **why** did Hamas attack in such a devastating way? The only explanation that made sense was that Hamas wanted to provoke a huge military response from Israel.

Why would Hamas want to basically force Israel to go into Gaza to root out Hamas? Because Hamas knew that they had created the scenario in which they could not be reached and eliminated without many, many of their own people being killed. Such an ethical code has been immensely tested because Hamas has spent years building an infrastructure that uses their civilians and their people's homes, hospitals, schools and mosques as shields behind which Hamas could hide and fight, attack, and fight again. I am submitting this written testimony to express my displeasure and disappointment with the resolution that will be discussed and voted upon in the next few days.

While I appreciate the overall sentiment for putting an end to the violence going on in Gaza and in other areas of the Middle East perpetrated largely by militant proxies of Iran in Iraq, Syria, Lebanon (Hezballah), Yemen (Houthis), Hamas is a terrorist organization, just like the others except operating out of Gaza. From there they have launched missiles, rockets, and launched raids into Israel, a United Nations country with sovereign status with the expressed purpose of ending this country's existence and annihilating or expelling the Israeli people in total. I cannot imagine any other country on earth which would not respond to so brazen and ruthless attacks culminating in a horrible pogrom on October 7.

We am writing as longtime Howard County residents, specifically in Liz Walsh's district. We were drawn to Howard County when we moved here in 1983 from Wisconsin, in large part because of its diversity and public school systems. We are members of Temple Isaiah, which strongly supports interfaith dialogue and support. This letter is being sent to voice our opposition to CR22-24, which has been fast-tracked for passage on February 5, 2024. This resolution, which calls for an immediate ceasefire in the Israel-Hamas war, significantly omits a call for release of the remaining Israeli hostages who range in age from one year to 85 years. They have been held incommunicado without needed medication and care, and have been abused and cruelly treated since they were forcibly abducted on October 7th. The Hamas attack that day resulted in the brutal murder of over 1200 Israeli civilians.

We are also heartsick about the Palestinian civilians who have died or been injured since Israel started to seek retribution and defend herself from future attacks by Hamas. This conflict never would have happened if not for the Hamas attack in October. Civilian fatalities in Gaza would have been minimized if Hamas did not use them as human shields, and hide weapons, tunnel systems, and terrorists in schools, hospitals, mosques, homes, and UNWRA facilities.

Moreover, this resolution is one-sided in that Hamas is not asked to lay down their arms; only Israel is expected to cease hostilities.

Please do not vote to pass CR22-24. A ceasefire is desired by all but it must include the immediate release of the 130+ hostages who are still in captivity in Gaza. - > " would not typically post something like this, but with the news last night that Howard County Council Member Liz Walsh 's Ceasefire resolution to the Howard County council will be fast-tracked to a vote on Monday rather than go through the public comment that was scheduled for February 20th, I wanted to urge all my friends who are residents of Howard County to contact their council representative and the general council mail to express opposition to this truly flawed and one-sided resolution. I am pasting my response to the council and Howard County Executive Calvin Ball below.
- > To the members of the Howard County Council and County Executive Calvin Ball,
- > I am writing to you today to express my deep concern and strong opposition to the Resolution (CR 22-2024) introduced by Councilmember Walsh which I believe is going to be first considered at the County Council meeting on February 5th.
- > I will acknowledge that I have had the opportunity to speak with Councilmember Walsh today to express my concerns today, and I believe we had a productive and civil discussion, but I would like to be able to be on the record with the full council for the reasons of my strong opposition. I also want to note that I express this concern and opposition as an individual, but also as the Senior Rabbi of Temple Isaiah, on behalf of the 700 family member units of this congregation, the vast majority of which are Howard County Residents; a congregation that has been a proud member of the interfaith community of Howard County for more than fifty years and which treasures its associations with our elected officials

and the role that we are able to serve as a partner faith organization towards the betterment of our greater community. Finally, I take up this opposition as an individual who was recently honored to be appointed by County Executive Ball to the new Interfaith Council for Howard County – and I believe it is my responsibility to be among those who represent the Jewish community in that important bridge between the faith communities and civil society.

> Finally, I will share that I base this opposition to CR 22-2024 also in 40 years of Israel engagement that has been focused on peace-building, on the strengthening of Arab-Israeli and Muslim-Jewish relations, and as someone who has worked tirelessly as an advocate of a Two State Solution throughout the entirety of that time. I also spent much of the first week of January returning once again to Israel, but this time on a solidarity mission to witness the effects of the Hamas terror attacks of October 7th, the ongoing devastation, grief, anxiety and suffering caused by the attacks that Hamas initiated on that day and the resultant war that has raged since then. What I saw during this visit will likely haunt me throughout my life, and I continue to process it and to share about the carnage, the devastation and the impact of that single deadliest day in the history of the State of Israel. I shared in great detail with Councilmember Walsh and am willing to make time to talk to any of you individually about the things that I witnessed and the first-hand testimony that I received.

> The crux of my opposition to CR 22-2024 is that the resolution calls for a ceasefire, but does not explicitly call for the release of all of the 130+ hostages (or remains of hostages) still being held in Gaza by Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad and other associated terror groups. The ceasefire resolution also appears to be a one-sided ceasefire, which pins the blame for the devastating loss of innocent civilian life in Gaza and Israel solely on the actions of the State of Israel and the Israel Defense Forces. Further, the resolution makes no mention of the brutal events of the unprovoked attacks of October 7th, which claimed the lives of more than 1200 civilians – brutally murdered in their homes, in the fields, at a dance festival, on the road and in any place where the terrorists found them. Again, the details of these attacks have been chronicled by those who witnessed and survived, but also by the explicit body-cam images captured and disseminated by the Hamas terrorists. As someone who has seen some of the most graphic imagery that was deliberately and joyfully distributed by Hamas, I can tell you that when the deniers will come to say that these things did not take place, the very perpetrators of these actions will have provided the incontrovertible evidence.

> I also shared with Councilmember Walsh my astonishment that she has referenced several leaders of the Democratic Party who have similarly called for ceasefire's in their resolutions. They specifically called for the immediate release of all 130-plus hostages. The decision to consciously omit this from the resolution submitted to the Howard County Council can be seen as nothing else than a deliberate decision to erase the existence and legitimacy of the lives of these hostages — civilians who range in age from one year old to mid-80s. This decision alone should make anyone who cares for all of humanity carefully consider what a vote for this resolution would say about their values, commitments and ethics.

>

> I say all of this with the simultaneous deep concern for the untold amount of suffering being experienced by the civilian population of Gaza. The civilian casualty numbers are beyond comprehension, and I call on the Israel Defense Forces to do everything possible to avoid any and every civilian casualty, even as they legitimately proceed in this war against the Hamas terrorists who have repeatedly vowed to conduct attacks worse than October 7th again and again — witness repeated public statements by Hamas officials both in the Gaza strip and speaking from their relative safety of Qatar. I also pointed out to Councilmember Walsh that I believe any Ceasefire resolution must also acknowledge the deliberate and calculated tactics and actions of Hamas that make them culpable for substantial percentages of the civilian deaths that have occurred throughout the prosecution of Israel's war on Hamas. The employment of human shields, the placement of weapons depots, rocket launching stations and command centers deliberately inside of dense civilian areas, inside and beneath hospitals, schools, UNHCR facilities and other places which are sure to result in civilian loss of life have been a hallmark of Hamas' tactics for years, but in this specific war have resulted in the most devastating of consequences. My heart breaks for the civilian population of Gaza who are unsupportive of Hamas. I pray for their liberation from this brutal terror group.

>

> Finally, I will share that in conversations with many members of Temple Isaiah, a constant refrain that I hear is "why was/is this the work of the Howard County Council?" I happen to agree with this sentiment. As someone who (like you)

cares deeply for the strength and success of our community, I know that the County Council has real work to do in assuring that justice, equity, right and blessing are the shared bounty of all in our community. Advancing this legislation does nothing to forward that mission — and I will say it has already done great harm towards the relationships within our community, causing deeper divisions between people who genuinely care for one another, and who may have deeply divergent assessments of the Israel-Hamas war. No good comes from the introduction of this deeply flawed resolution.

> I urge all members with my full voice to reject this resolution and to work towards actions that will help heal the divisions that this resolution has already caused. I pledge my support and assistance in doing just that.

I'm a resident of District 4, represented by council member Deb Jung. Eight years ago, my son had his Bar-Mitzvah and invited to the celebration were friends of different religions (Jews, Muslims, Hindus, Catholics, Episcopalian, others, and atheists). My husband, who grew up behind the Iron Curtain, who could not have a Bar-Mitzvah, gave a most moving speech. He spoke about how when he was growing up in the mid-1980s, he could not have a Bar-Mitzvah. On the day of our son's celebration, he was moved to tears to see not only that we could celebrate openly, but we celebrated with the love of friends of every ethnic, religious, and racial background that makes up the beautiful tapestry of people in Howard County.

Last month my son lost one of his close friends to a horrible car accident in College Park (you might have heard about it). In searching for pictures of his friend from when they were younger, I came across one in which Jewish kids, Muslim kids, Hindu kids, and Christian kids were hanging out with the biggest smiles on their faces. They were happy! Politics, religion, or color of skin did not divide them.

Sadly, today, politics and ideologies, false information and blood libels are causing <u>deep</u> <u>deep</u> animosities; prior close friendships are now breaking apart. Indeed, his best friend, a Muslim boy, who we cared for with love and joy, who enjoyed many days at a time in our home as his mother was earning her graduate degree, who we picked up in the middle of the night when there were thunderstorms and his mom had not returned from her studies, who ate in our home (never having to worry about dietary issues), slept in our home, and whose college applications I reviewed because his mother was not around, has radicalized. My son is so hurt and grieving in a way I had never seen someone grieve the loss of a friend before. His own best friend—no longer—wants nothing more to do with my son merely because his friend was told by his religious leaders that Jews are infidels.

This is not what Howard County is about. It is not what Howard County should be about. It is not why we moved to this multicultural county.

We moved to Columbia because Jim Rouse had a vision of people living together in harmony, where creed, race, religion, ethnicity, SES, and politics would not divide us, but instead allow our humanity to unite us.

The County Council Resolution <u>CR22-2024</u> for a ceasefire in Gaza is a resolution that divides, stokes animosity and marginalization of the Jewish community, and devalues the lives of innocent civilians who are still held hostage by Hamas and their operatives, by ignoring their existence.

On October 7th, my childhood best friend's nephew was killed in one of the kibbutzim, my cousin's 12 year old student and her mother were taken hostage, my graduate student's neighbor was killed at the peace party, and my colleague's grandson was shot and miraculously survived. How can Howard County even consider calling for a sovereign nation to ceasefire against Hamas, evil do-ers? Such an act, without the release of all hostages, puts Israeli Jews, including my family, in harms-way, and it also puts Israeli Arabs, Druze, and Bedouins, as well as peace-wanting Palestinians in harms-way—causing more misery and destitution for them by Hamas. To uplift people out of misery, we should not enable bad actors to flourish. A call for ceasefire is a call for Hamas to strengthen its resolve to eliminate the State of Israel and oppress people, much as Iran does to its people today, where women are forced to wear hijabs, even if they do not want to.

I fear that the good heartedness of some people on our County Council is impeding their abilities to see that they are doing more harm than good to residents of the county, and, if a ceasefire without the release of all hostages is pressed upon Israel, they would be part of the reason why nearly 1+ million Palestinians who do not want to be under Hamas's oppressive rule will be subjected to it.

The fact that this resolution even came to existence breaks my heart. The County Council should put forward resolutions that create unity, togetherness, care, and respect.

My name is Stanley Kusnetz. My wife is Fany Kusnetz I am a retired officer of the Commissioned Corps of the U.S Public Health Service. Fany at one time was the Office Manager of the DC Council of Jewish Federations. I was also a volunteer in our County Executive's campaign. We have lived in Howard County since 1979. Our three children are all graduates of Howard County Schools.

Frankly, when I saw the resolution, calling for a cease fire I was very unpleasantly surprised. Consider this, as our county council, your mandate is to make this a better county through legislation and other administrative duties, NOT to take sides in international affairs. The context in this resolution makes it very clear that you are speaking of Israel. You are our council, not our Department of State. You were not elected to take any side in this issue that is a source of passions and division among your constituents.

Further the resolution itself is misleading. You quote a number of Gazan casualties supplied by Hamas and not backed with any evidence whatsoever. Keep in mind Hamas includes the losses of its own fighters presenting the total as all civilian to inflame passions as part of its psychological warfare to influence groups such as this council.

The resolution uses the names of Reps Raskin and Mfume as well that of Sen van Hollen, giving the impression that they support an immediate cease fire. However, those seeming endorsements lack context. Their support is for a Bi-lateral cease fire when the hostages are released as a whole package. None of this is mentioned in your resolution.

When Hamas broke the existing cease fire (one broken cease fire of many) to conduct a brutal invasion of an Israeli holiday festival and nearby citizen communities, committing unspeakable acts, in itself a violation of International law, a goal was to take hundreds of hostages, another violation of international law.


Dear County Council Members,

You may know that I have spent my entire adult life trying to further understanding, cooperation, and peace between Jews and Muslims, between Israelis and Palestinians, and between peoples of different races and ethnicities. Perhaps you have attended some of the programs I created and cosponsored with the Muslim Council, Courageous Conversations, and others over the years about furthering peace and understanding.

I have been following the events in Israel and Gaza closely. Like you, I worry about the terrible toll on the people of Gaza and the fate of the hostages held by Hamas.

However, CR 22-2024, based on HR 786, is not the way to help the Gazan people or help bring peace to the region—just the opposite. Based on the one-sided and biased HR 786, this resolution can do actual harm. CR 22-2024 ignores the plight of the hostages held by Hamas, the continued bombardment of Israeli cities by Hamas, and the tragic victimization of the people of Gaza by Hamas, who intentionally used their own people as human shields by setting its command centers, arms depots, rocket launchers, and tunnels in densely populated civilian areas, even utilizing schools and hospitals, all contrary to international law. Your resolution further undermines the recent and courageous protests of the Gazan people themselves against the terror Hamas has visited upon them since Hamas took over control of Gaza in a bloody coup and fails to recognize the right of Israel to defend itself and its citizens.

This resolution is flawed. It does not call for the return of the hostages or the removal of Hamas from operational control of Gaza. Even worse, a complete ceasefire that this bill calls for will merely allow Hamas to rearm with more potent weaponry, rebuild their command centers, coordinate further attacks on Israel, and track down and harm those brave Gazans who have been protesting against them. Hamas has been their own people's worst enemy, ruling through violence and intimidation and subverting international aid to support their cause of destroying Israel. Hamas leadership admitted to New York Times journalists (see link below) that their goal was to create a permanent state of war, using the suffering of the Gaza People to further their strategic objectives of the destruction of Israel. A helpful resolution that holds out hope and peace for all people in the region requires Hamas to be removed from operational control of Gaza, includes a commitment to a two-state solution, and demands the return of the hostages. In the meantime, there are efforts currently underway to broker not a unilateral ceasefire that plays into Hamas' hands but a temporary ceasefire that would return all the hostages, deliver needed aid to Gaza, and set up the conditions that would hopefully result in a more peaceful region. It is critical not to unintentionally harm the genuine efforts being pursued by the United States and its allies to bring immediate aid to Gazans and rescue the hostages.

We are all pained by the tragedy unfolding in Gaza. We need to be thoughtful and smart about how we can best help. CR 22-2024 is neither thoughtful nor helpful. I urge you to vote down CR 22-2024.

To the members of the Howard County Council and County Executive Calvin Ball,

I am writing to you today to express my deep concern and strong opposition to the Resolution (CR 22-2024) introduced by Councilmember Walsh which I believe is going to be first considered at the County Council meeting on February 5th.

I would like to be on the record with the full council in my opposition to this harmful resolution.

The crux of my opposition to CR 22-2024 is that the resolution calls for a ceasefire, but does not explicitly call for the release of all of the 130+ hostages (or remains of hostages) still being held in Gaza by Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad and other associated terror groups. The ceasefire resolution also appears to be a one-sided ceasefire, which pins the blame for the devastating loss of innocent civilian life in Gaza and Israel solely on the actions of the State of Israel and the Israel Defense Forces. Further, the resolution makes no mention of the brutal events of the unprovoked attacks of October 7th, which claimed the lives of more than 1200 civilians – brutally murdered in their homes, in the fields, at a dance festival, on the road and in any place where the terrorists found them. Again, the details of these attacks have been chronicled by those who witnessed and survived, but also by the explicit body-cam images captured and disseminated by the Hamas terrorists.

When the deniers will come to say that these things did not take place, the very perpetrators of these actions will have provided the incontrovertible evidence.

Councilmember Walsh has referenced several leaders of the Democratic Party who have called for ceasefires. Councilmember Walsh fails to mention in her resolution that these Democratic leaders specifically called for the immediate release of all 130-plus hostages. The decision to consciously omit this from the resolution submitted to the Howard County Council can be seen as nothing else than a deliberate decision to erase the existence and legitimacy of the lives of these hostages — civilians who range in age from one year old to mid-80s. This decision alone should make anyone who cares for all of humanity carefully consider what a vote for this resolution would say about their values, commitments and ethics.

I say all of this with the simultaneous deep concern for the untold amount of suffering being experienced by the civilian population of Gaza. The civilian casualty numbers are beyond comprehension, and I call on the Israel Defense Forces to do everything possible to avoid any and every civilian casualty, even as they legitimately proceed in this war against the Hamas terrorists who have repeatedly vowed to conduct attacks worse than October 7th again and again – witness repeated public statements by Hamas officials both in the Gaza strip and speaking from their relative safety of Qatar.

I believe any ceasefire resolution must also acknowledge the deliberate and calculated tactics and actions of Hamas that make them culpable for substantial percentages of the civilian deaths that have occurred throughout the prosecution of Israel's war on Hamas. The employment of human shields, the placement of weapons depots, rocket launching stations and command centers deliberately inside of dense civilian areas, inside and beneath hospitals, schools, UNHCR facilities and other places which are sure to result in civilian loss of life have been a hallmark of Hamas's tactics for years, but in this specific war have resulted in the most devastating of consequences. My heart breaks for the civilian population of Gaza who are unsupportive of Hamas. I pray for their liberation from this brutal terror group.

Finally, it is my belief that the Howard County Council's mission should focus solely on the needs of the Howard County community. It is not the purview of the Howard County Council to propose and consider a resolution unrelated to issues specific to Howard County and its residents. Advancing this legislation does nothing to strengthen and unite our Howard County community. Indeed it has already done great harm towards the relationships within our community, causing deeper divisions between people who genuinely care for one another, and who may have deeply divergent assessments of the Israel-Hamas war.

No good comes from the introduction of this deeply flawed resolution. I urge all members to reject this resolution and to work towards actions that will help heal the divisions that this resolution has already caused.

I am writing to you today to express my deep concern and strong opposition to the Resolution (CR 22-2024) introduced by Councilmember Walsh which I believe is going to be first considered at the County Council meeting on February 5th.

The crux of my opposition to CR 22-2024 is that the resolution calls for a ceasefire, but does not explicitly call for the release of all of the 130+ hostages (or remains of hostages) still being held in Gaza by Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad and other associated terror groups. The ceasefire resolution also appears to be a one-sided ceasefire, which pins the blame for the devastating loss of innocent civilian life in Gaza and Israel solely on the actions of the State of Israel and the Israel Defense Forces. Further, the resolution makes no mention of the brutal events of the unprovoked attacks of October 7th, which claimed the lives of more than 1200 civilians – brutally murdered in their homes, in the fields, at a dance festival, on the road and in any place where the terrorists found them. Dear Ms Walsh,

My name is Yuval Krausz, and I live at 4017 Dorseys Ridge Square.

I'm a member of our five person HOA at the Reserve at Dorseys Ridge. I am also an Israeli with both American and Israeli citizenship. I came to live in the USA in April of 1991, and this March will be twenty years since I became a naturalized American Citizen.

My four adult children from my first marriage live in Israel. I have eight grandchildren who live there as well.

Ms Walsh, I served in front-line combat units and I lived to tell about two wars that I was called to active duty. I was in Syria during the Yom Kippur War of 1973, and during the first Lebanon War (1982) I was on the new Egyptian border with my unit. My unit and I were deployed countless times to the Gaza Strip during the 1980's. My final three years in the Israel Defense Forces I served as a Liaison Officer with the MFO (Multinational Force and Observers).

I have always been a proponent of the two-state solution.

What happened on October 7th, 2023 cannot ever be described in words. No video footage, no testimony, nothing can describe the horrors of that day.

It is my sincere hope that no country, no people on this planet ever experience this horror.

And yet, it was perpetrated on the people I know personally. I lived on a Kibbutz (Yad Mordechai) just a few kilometers north of the Gaza Strip. My friends lived through that horror.

One of my daughters lives in a city called Be'er Sheva, about twenty five miles or so from the Gaza Strip. My three small grandchildren (two in elementary school and one in Kindergarten) had to hide in their safe room when missiles from Gaza flew in their direction.

One of my daughters and her mother (my ex wife) fled to live with my other daughter in the center of Israel.

My daughter-in-law's aunt and uncle and their two children were murdered, along with many other families of Kibbutz Be'eri.

No one in Israel now lives without that memory.

And yet, yes, and yet, I continue to support a two-state solution. I do not support the extreme right-wing and racist members of the current government. I do not support the current Prime Minister, a man who has sadly (in my opinion) lost sight of what is moral and what is not.

To the point, a cease fire will, as we all know, allow the murderers who perpetrated the October 7th 2023 massacres to re-organize and re-arm. It is a fact of life there. It will allow Hamas to continue to oppress the very population they claim they serve. They do not serve the Palestinian Arab population. Not in the Gaza Strip, and not in the West Bank. They are a true threat not only to Jews but to Americans and Europeans everywhere.

They are in fact the Muslim Brotherhood, an organization and philosophy that desires to establish a Caliphate with all the ramifications thereof.

Ms Walsh, I personally do not support a cease-fire at this time, because there are still hostages held in terrible captivity in the Gaza Strip, whether by Hamas, PIJ or just plain thugs. Until all hostages are returned, whether dead - to be mourned, or alive, there must be an agreement. The agreement must first and foremost return all hostages to Israel. Then we could discuss a cease-fire, and eventually (it is again my sincere hope) a neighbor state willing to live in peace with Israel.

I am Dr. Zoobia Chaudhry. I live in old Ellicott City in Council District 1, and I'm represented by Councilmember Liz Walsh. I am with the group Baltimore health care workers for Palestine. I would like you to support CR22 Ceasefire resolution as we witness 100+ days of genocide in Gaza, it's crucial for us as concerned Maryland residents and taxpayers to take a stand. As a physician I have been esp. concerned about the attack on hospital and healthcare workers. I have been in touch with a few physicians on the ground in Gaza. Among them is Dr. Ebrahem Matar who works as an internist working in ICU and cardiology in the Gaza Hospital. He was living in the hospital for the last 4 months not only to help with patients but also to take refuge. He has not only been posting the dire situation in the hospital but also the emotional and physical toll this conflict has taken on him. Few weeks ago, his hospital was raided by Israeli forces and he was forced to leave. Now he is a refugee on the streets and still not able to see his family because of the limited movement between north and south Gaza. He writes beautiful prose poetry and I will read a line from it:

I have seen all of this, oh God. I have seen people rushing to the hospital after the shelling, covered in blood, sand, and ashes. I have seen their faces, filled with shock, as if they had no idea what had just happened, as if they couldn't comprehend the magnitude of the event.

I sat with someone who talked to himself, wondering, 'All these wounded and martyrs were like us an hour ago. They were with us just a while ago in life. When will it be our turn?'"

I have wondered why this situation has such an impact on a lot of us. It may be because of what we identify to be. Part of our identity is who we are born as, and who we grow up to be. As a Muslim most of us here testifying have carried the pain of suffering of fellow Palestinians for as long as I was able to read or listen to the news. As a physician it hurts me to see my fellow health care worker suffer. Now part of my identity is being an American and the pain is compounded as the US is backing Israeli military operations with

our taxpayer money. And if you do not identify as any of the above then I implore you to call on your humanity to further this resolution to call for a ceasefire and allow us to act like, well like human beings, and help us call an end to this senseless violence.
