Hi,
I am writing you today to strongly ask you to vote **NO** for Resolution CR22-2024 on February 5.

Liz Walsh is the councilwoman of the district where I live, and her opinion does not at all reflect mine.

The resolution calls for a ceasefire, but does not explicitly call for the release of all of the 130+ hostages (or remains of hostages) still being held in Gaza by Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad and other associated terror groups. The ceasefire resolution also appears to be a one-sided ceasefire, which pins the blame for the devastating loss of innocent civilian life in Gaza and Israel solely on the actions of the State of Israel and the Israel Defense Forces. Further, the resolution makes no mention of the brutal events of the unprovoked attacks of October 7th, which claimed the lives of more than 1200 civilians – brutally murdered in their homes, in the fields, at a dance festival, on the road and in any place where the terrorists found them. Again, the details of these attacks have been chronicled by those who witnessed and survived, but also by the explicit body-cam images captured and disseminated by the Hamas terrorists.

Additionally, I am reading in the news that if the contentious resolution fails at vote, Councilwoman Walsh plans to reintroduce it every month until it passes. We now see the outcry of those who oppose the resolution in addition to those on both sides who want to testify on February 5 and have been silenced. Do we want to have the residents of the county focused on such contention month after month, especially since the international affairs topic is **nowhere** listed as a responsibility of the Howard County Council ?(From the Howard County Council website - “ **The County Council acts as the County’s legislative branch of government. It is responsible for making the laws that govern the County. The Council members also are the zoning authority and the licensing and enforcement authority for alcoholic beverages in the County.**”) Wouldn’t the Council rather focus its efforts and residents’ efforts on topics that relate to our county?

Instead of bringing people of the county together, the reintroduction of the resolution month after month is going to divide the residents of Howard County even more. Does the County Council want to be responsible for the violence that is sure to ensue about a topic that is outside of the Council’s purview? Funds for additional security will surely be necessary to monitor the outcry and keep people safe, weeks leading to the vote and on the day of. Does the Council want to be responsible for taking away funding from other programs to provide the security necessary every time the resolution is reintroduced? It is inappropriate to use my tax dollars for topics outside the Council's purview.

Because of all the reasons I listed above, it is imperative that the Council vote **NO** for Resolution CR22-2024 on February 5.

Dear Council and Executive Ball-

As a Howard County resident, I am writing to request that CR 22-2024 be withdrawn or rejected.

According to the official government website, Howard County Council is “responsible for making the laws that govern the County... [and is] the zoning authority and the licensing and enforcement authority for alcoholic beverages in the County.” CR 22-2024 has no basis in County governance and is a waste of taxpayer time and resources. If Liz Walsh wishes to propose legislation that impacts foreign policy, she should run for Federal office.

Regarding the merits of CR 22-2024, Liz Walsh proves herself to be woefully uninformed or anti-Semitic. There are currently innocent Israeli Jews (and Americans!) held hostage by Palestinian terrorists. In Gaza, Hamas and Islamic Jihad terrorists continue to endanger Palestinian civilians by using them as human shields, preventing their access to humanitarian corridors, and confiscating aid. Recall, it was these same terrorists that pilfered foreign assistance funds and supplies to build weapons and subterranean terrorist infrastructure. CR 22-2024 willfully ignores the two key variables that would in fact create an immediate ceasefire: surrender of the terrorists and safe return of the hostages.

War is a horrible tragedy—one that should be avoided. The People of Israel—both the Jewish Diaspora and citizens of the State of Israel—grieve the loss of innocent life, of Israelis, Palestinians, and other nationalities embroiled in this conflict. That said, what is the purpose of a performative local government resolution in a foreign conflict? Yes, there are many Howard County residents with family ties to this region. But, there are also many other Howard County residents with ties to other conflict regions. The Council of Foreign Relations has a useful tool to monitor global conflicts: you can find it [here](#). Why does Liz Walsh feel that this conflict is the one that merits a resolution?

As an American-Jew—and WWII/Holocaust survivor—I find Liz Walsh’s proposed resolution a direct attack on Jews. While the words of the resolution themselves are benign, the intention behind it is not. Of all the global conflicts, Liz Walsh chooses to single out Israel’s response to terrorism as her focus for a county resolution. She never expressed concern for any of the Jewish victims of rape, torture, and

murder; she never demanded Hamas cease fire. It is anti-Semitic to delegitimize Israel, demonize Israel, and apply double standards toward the only Jewish State in the world. Anti Zionism IS anti-Semitism.

If this resolution passes, a clear message will be sent to the residents of Howard County: Jews are not welcome.

Please rescind or reject this resolution.

We write this letter to the Howard County Council as two former elected members of the Howard County Democratic Central Committee, who among others on our team, were elected on a platform of “cultivating the next generation of community leaders standing for equity and inclusion.” We spent countless hours knocking on doors, making calls and handing out literature to constituents to help usher in this “next generation” of Council members. As two Jewish members of the Howard County community we have never previously felt or witnessed the level of exclusion and division that is now readily apparent in the aftermath of the horrific events of October 7th, and while we considered standing on the sideline through this process, we cannot in good conscience watch this occur without raising objections.

The resolution put forward by Councilwoman Walsh, while on the surface is calling for peace, at its very core, is a one-sided, anti-Israel and antisemitic statement, that absolves, rather than condemns, Hamas, a known terrorist organization, for mercilessly killing 1200 Jews on October 7th. It says nothing about the release of the over 100 hostages that remain in captivity today, four months later. I am a Howard County resident (District 2), and am writing to express my strong disagreement with CR22-2024, which calls for an immediate cease-fire in Gaza.

This resolution does not contain any verbiage with respect to the fact that US citizens as well as Israelis are still being held hostage by Hamas [1], a foreign terrorist organization [2]. First, let me say that I am for a two state solution; I support much more aid going into Gaza; and, I think the Netanyahu government is bad for Israel, bad for the Palestinians, and bad for the United States.

However, I urge you to please, please withdraw the resolution that you introduced. I know that your intentions were good, but the resolution does not support a major constituency of Howard County or of your district for the following reasons:

- 1) It has no mention of the Hamas attacks on the kibbutzim on October 11th and the mutilation of hundreds of people, including women and children. I am sure you have seen pictures of the mutilation and savageness of the attacks. Think if that was your family.
- 2) The stated goal of Hamas is the elimination of Israel and the killing of all Jews. I highly doubt that is what you want for Israel or for Howard County. The resolution does not mention that, except very broadly in terms of all faiths. Dear Councilwoman Walsh et al.,

I am writing to you today to express my horror at your proposed Resolution (CR 22-2024). From what I know of you, I hope that my assumption that you do not truly understand the complexity of this resolution and the implications it could have for the county locally is true.

I have lived in Howard County for over ten years and served in leadership positions in the county. I have taught Hebrew, Jewish Studies and Jewish history for many years and know that even I do not have a full understanding of the nuance of Middle East politics. I am currently serving as Cubmaster for one of the county's largest Cub Scout Packs and am a substitute with HCPSS. Additionally, I have a JD, an MA in international politics, and a BA in History with focuses on Near Eastern and Judaic Studies, Peace and Conflict Studies, and International Relations.

I know that after October 7, you came to Shabbat services to show your support to the Jewish community. An "immediate ceasefire" means that Israel (and the Jewish people) has no right to defend herself. It means that the 1200+ innocent civilians who were ripped out of their beds, had their children or parents raped and murdered before their eyes, watched as the terrorists came in and after killing their neighbors, dismembered their bodies, decapitated them, burned them including infants and elderly. And that was only the information released to the public; other actions that are unimaginable to me are said to have occurred as well. These people were literally in their beds sleeping. Over two hundred of those people, including children as young as nine months old, women, the elderly and non-combatants, Israelis, Americans, Thai, Jewish, Christian, Muslim, Druze, etc. were snatched from their homes and forcibly taken into Gaza. While held in underground tunnels with no light, minimal air circulation, and barely enough food to survive, the hostages were subjected to rape, torture, and being forced to watch these horrors occur to others around them. One hundred thirty-nine individuals, including children and women, and the elderly, are still being held at the will of the monsters who abducted them. To make it worse, the Hamas terrorists recorded and released videos showing these crimes against humanity, while many Gazan citizens and other Palestinian supporters around the world cheered and celebrated. The atrocities that occurred on October 7 are unparalleled in human history.

The proposed Resolution is a blatantly antisemitic and anti-Israel statement. Full stop.

The closest thing we, as Americans, have to understand this was 9-11. Did we allow al-Qaeda and ISIS to remain in power after the attack on the World Trade Center and Pentagon? Absolutely not! A sovereign nation has the right to self-defense. When the U.S. fought in Afghanistan and Iraq, did they take triple precautions to prevent the death of bystanders? Not at all--they had a mission and completed their mission at any cost. And just how did the Americans treat the terrorists they captured? They brought them to Guantanamo Bay and practiced horrific means of torture on

them.

My considerations against this resolution are four-fold:

- I. The overreach of a County Council into foreign affairs;
- II. The consequences of such a statement locally;
- III. The history and culture of the Israelis/Jews and their right to exist;
- IV. The war itself and the need to protect Gazan residents

I. JURISDICTION

Under the Constitution, Articles I and II foreign relations are explicitly delegated to the Federal Government, specifically the President and his agencies, and Congress. These powers include making treaties, waging war, and sending foreign aid. Under the Bill of Rights, Tenth Amendment, powers not explicitly given to the Federal government is reserved for the States. The Supreme Court confirmed in *United States v. Pink* (1840), *Zeschernig v. Miller* (1968), and *American Insurance Association v. Garamendi*, Insurance Commissioner, State of California (2002) that the reciprocal of the Tenth Amendment also holds: States do not have the right to participate in any kind of foreign affairs, whether trade issues or foreign policy ones.

If States do not have the right to participate in foreign affairs, it logically holds that a local government, such as a County Council, has absolutely no role in them, nor does it have any business making statements on complex international situations. This is out of the Council's scope and such a resolution should not even be on the table.

The Council's jurisdiction is to focus on local issues and we have plenty of things that need to be fixed--schools, budgets, local crime and poverty, etc.

II. LOCAL CONSEQUENCES

Although a County Council cannot participate in international affairs, if it does make a statement, that statement can have a powerful impact on the local constituents. Approximately 20,000 Jews reside in Howard County. While not worded in such a manner, the actual impact of the statement will have extremely serious antisemitic consequences. By calling for an immediate ceasefire, in essence, what you are saying is that, "Israel does not have the authority to rescue the 139 hostages still being held and abused in Gaza, nor does it have the right to conquer an invading group who committed unthinkable crimes including murdering 1200+ individuals. Moreover, their enemy has continued to bombard Israel with rockets on a daily basis, even four months after they started the war. The perpetrators directly state that their objective is to commit genocide against the Israelis, Jews, and Americans in order to establish a Jihadist Caliphate around the world. It is fine to leave them in power, leave the hostages there, and allow for the continued dangers to Israel. Israel and the Jews have ZERO RIGHT TO SELF-DEFENSE."

While you may not think this is what your statement says, I guarantee you that the anti-Semitism that lies just beneath the surface in Howard County will explode should such a statement be made. It would give permission to anyone to attack the Jews and Jewish establishments without recourse.

Even before October 7, Maryland as a whole has seen an increase in antisemitic hate crimes. See: <https://www.cbsnews.com/baltimore/news/maryland-has-had-dramatic-increase-in-anti-semitic-incidents-report-shows/>

Across Maryland, the number of hate crimes reported doubled between 2021 and 2022, with crimes against Jews begin the second-highest category at 15.2% of all those reported

The problem has become so severe even within Howard County that the Jewish Federation of Howard County needed to create a reporting form for residents. See: <https://www.jewishhowardcounty.org/antisemitism>

Additionally, the Howard County Police Department has a special procedure for investigating hate-based crimes and incidents.

These antisemitic hate crimes are here in our county. This is not something on which we can turn a blind eye.

The Resolution gives this underlying message: “It is fine and justifiable to harm the Jews. They do not have the right to defend themselves. If they do, we will immediately require them to stop. Then, you can attack them again and again and again.”

I fear for my safety and the safety of my children. This is not a “the statement MAY” be interpreted this way, but “the statement WILL” be. In and of itself, a call for a ceasefire is granting permission for any and all antisemitic, anti-Israeli, and anti-Jewish crimes or acts.

One of the things I love about living and teaching in Howard County is the great diversity of the area. My classrooms have children of all backgrounds, races, religions, and colors. The children learn from a young age to embrace those differences and to learn from each other. In the elementary schools where I have worked, the youth are truly blind to those differences and judge others based on their behavior, not their appearance or familial practices.

The message the Council will send by approving this Resolution is that it is 100% acceptable to attack Jewish neighbors and facilities, and no repercussions will occur. Our history is replete with antisemitic attacks and persecution, and the need to move constantly to protect ourselves and our families.

The Council must not send this message out. Instead, the message should be, “Here in Howard County, we embrace our differences and become better people by learning about different cultures.” Roundtables and interfaith discussions should be set up, programs for children to learn about different cultures should be organized, and a zero-tolerance policy must be implemented for any kind of antisemitism, racism, gender discrimination, etc. When the “Black Lives Matter” campaign came out, the Jews were there saying the systemic racism in the country has gone too far, we have your backs. But no one does that when the Jews are the victims.

III. The History and Political Situation of Israel

The complexity of the history of the Levant takes years of study to understand. Even with a degree in the area and

having followed Israeli news for decades, I still only have a superficial understanding of the situation and rely on others with more direct information.

Have you, personally, been to Israel? Do you know what it is like on the ground there? Do you know what it is like to fear for your life every second of every day--will the bus be blown up? What about the pizza shop? Will rockets rain down on your house? Living on a tiny sliver of land surrounded by enemies means that this is the reality for every Israeli and has been for the past 75 years.

Have you, either personally or as a group, had access to intelligence from a reliable source (CIA, Shin Bet, another country's intelligence) that would allow you to make an informed statement? Do you look at various new sources or only the "mainstream" ones that repeat what Hamas reports to them without further investigation (e.g., number of deceased) or are known to be antisemitic and anti-Israel (e.g., BBC)? How many hours have you spent trying to unravel the situation by looking at all sides of the issue including the extremely complex history? Do you challenge what you see stated by both sides? Which side has produced more accurate media and which one produces mostly propaganda?

While in no way comprehensive, I want to give you a brief history of the region to understand the long-standing Jewish connection to the land, and just how young the Palestinian nation is.

Approximately 3,000 years ago, a couple settled in the Levant, west of the Jordan River. They had a son (Isaac) who had a son (Jacob) who had a bunch of sons who sold their second youngest brother (Joseph) to traders going to Egypt. When the wife (Sarah) died, the husband (Abraham) purchased land in Hebron to bury her. Later on, their grandson Jacob instructed his sons to go to Egypt to get food during a famine. Eventually, Jacob brought his three living wives and all of their children down to Egypt where their son/brother helped them settle in Egypt out of necessity.

After several generations, a new Pharaoh came and felt threatened by this strong and powerful family-turned-nation. He enslaved them and tried to kill their sons. This was the first of many, many times the Israelites/Jews were persecuted. Several generations later (either circa 1446 BCE or circa 1186 BCE--I personally think the second is more compelling) a leader named Moses led the people out of slavery and in the wilderness for 40 years. Before his death, Moses appointed Joshua to lead the people. As was very typical for that era, Joshua entered the land and conquered land stretching from parts of the Sinai Peninsula to far north of the Golan Heights into what is now modern-day Syria and Lebanon, and from the Mediterranean Sea passed the Jordan River and covering much of the modern-day country of Jordan.

All of the civilizations in that area at the time of Joshua's conquest fell. Just as you cannot find an ancient Egyptian, Roman, or Greek today, neither can you find Amorites, Moabites, Hyssoks, or Philistines. From the time that Joshua entered this land, there have ALWAYS been Israelites/Jews living in the region, i.e., the Jewish nation has had a presence in the area since 1150 BCE at the latest.

First, the area was ruled by tribal leaders called Judges. Then, the people demanded a King. Saul was appointed but he was vengeful, so his lineage lost the kingship. David was anointed king, followed by his son Solomon. Due to David's leadership in the conquest of the land (again, a perfectly normal action at that time), he was not permitted to build a Holy Temple for the Israelites to use for worship. However, his wise son Solomon built the first permanent Temple on Mt. Moriah.

While this is all reported in Holy Scripture (the Torah and the Prophets), archeological evidence supports and strengthens the stories that have been passed down from generation to generation.

After King Solomon's death, the unity of the Israelite tribes split and two kings ruled: one in the North (Israel) and one in the South (Judah). In 722 BCE, the Assyrians conquered the Kingdom of Israel. In 586 BCE, the Babylonians conquered

Judah and exiled the vast majority of the people. The Persians conquered the Babylonians and the next major persecution of the Jews occurred when King Ahashveros allowed his vizier Haman to issue an edict to kill all Jews. Esther and Mordechai thwarted this plan and the Jews were permitted to fight back and prevent the genocide of the Jewish people. After several years, Cyrus the Great permitted the Jews to return to their homeland--Judea and Samaria where they built the Second Temple in 516 BCE.

In 322 BCE, Alexander the Great conquered the Levant on behalf of the Greeks. For well over a century, the Greeks allowed the Jewish people to live and worship as they pleased in their homeland--as long as they paid taxes. However, in 167 BCE, under the Greek Syrian King Antiochus, the next planned genocide occurred. Once again, the Jews, led by Mattithius and his sons (the Maccabees), fought back and despite their small size, they overcame the Greek army and reclaimed their desecrated Temple.

In 63 BCE the Romans took control of Israel and Jerusalem. Herod was appointed King of Judah in around 37 BCE where he expanded the Temple in Jerusalem. Today, the retaining wall of that Temple stands as the holiest place that Jews can access. At some point during Herod's reign, Jesus was born and died. The Jewish people were splitting into different sects during his lifetime: rabbinical (Pharisees), Temple/Priestly (Sadducees), fighters (Zealots), and esoteric men (Essenes) who lived in caves in the mountains (e.g. Qumran and other Temples where the scrolls they wrote in understandable Hebrew have been found). While Jesus lived, he mostly followed the philosophy of the Pharisees as he preached as a Jewish rabbi.

In 70 CE, Roman Emperor Titus conquered the city of Jerusalem and destroyed the Holy Temple. Even today, there are piles of rubble from the destroyed Temple around the Temple Mount. Titus and the Romans renamed the region of Israel, "Syria Palaestina" and the city of Jerusalem, "Aelia Capitolina." This referenced Israel's ancient enemy, the Philistines, in order to add salt to the wound that was the destruction of their Holy City and Holy Temple.

The Jewish resistance to the Romans until 132 CE with the Bar Kochba revolt. Although many Jews were exiled and moved throughout Europe, some stayed in and around Israel and Jerusalem. In fact, between 200 and 350, the scholars living in Jerusalem compiled a version of the Talmud, the Jewish oral law.

Over the next several centuries, Israel was under foreign rule: the Persians, the Byzantines, the Muslims (638) who built the Dome of the Rock atop the ruins of the Holy Temple, the Seljuk Turks, the Christian Crusaders, Saladin, and the Mamluk Empire, and in 1517, the Ottoman Empire.

The Ottoman Empire allowed and encouraged Jews to settle in Judea and the Jews lived peacefully and flourished under the Ottoman rule. Due to their common language and culture, the Ottomans used the Jews for trade and commerce, allowing them to become one of the more prosperous peoples in the Empire. With the expulsions from Spain and other Western European countries, more Jews were welcomed into the communities throughout the Ottoman Empire.

The Ottoman Empire fell to the British in 1917 after World War I. Using the ancient Roman name for the region, the British received the "Palestine Mandate" for this region by the League of Nations in 1920. Under the Balfour Declaration, both the Palestinian Jews and the Palestinian Arabs were promised land for independent nations in the region known as Palestine. Both peoples were called Palestinians at the time because they were living in Palestine.

As a result of the pogroms in the 1880s and 1890s, as well as the post-war political climate and the rising power of fascism in Europe, many Jews immigrated to Israel. There, they built up the land, created irrigation systems to enable agriculture in the marshes and deserts in the region, and built infrastructure including homes, schools, synagogues, and other community centers.

After Hitler's genocide attempt on the Jews, the need for the Jews to return to their indigenous, ancient, ancestral homeland became apparent to everyone. Nonetheless, the British continued to play political games between the

Palestinian Arabs and the Palestinian Jews. The British established the Arab state of Jordan on the East side of the Jordan River and the West Bank including Jerusalem. At the moment the British Mandate expired on May 14, 1948, David ben Gurion stood up in Tel Aviv and declared Israel to be an independent state. Quickly, many countries confirmed their autonomy. On that very night, however, Egypt (which at the time included all of the Sinai Peninsula and Gaza), Jordan (including Jerusalem and the West Bank), Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, and Saudi Arabia invaded the infant state. Israel defeated all of the invading Arab countries and conquered the West Bank and Jerusalem, parts of the Golan Heights, and the Sinai Peninsula including Gaza. Israel again fought for its survival in 1967, 1973, 1982, and throughout the 1990s and 2000s. In the 1960s, the Arabs in the region united becoming what is now known as the Palestinians. Let me repeat that: the Palestinians have been a nation for less than sixty years; the Jewish people have been a nation with claims to the land for 4000 years.

IV. But what about the Palestinians/Gazans?

A. Establishment of a State of Palestine.

The Palestinian people in Gaza have shown themselves to be unwilling to have their own state. According to their charter, their aim is that, Palestinians were those who resided in the region before 1948, including Jews, however, the entire area must be only under Arab rule, and the Jews are an invading force (although I'm confused as to how it is possible a region that your people has occupied for millennia).

The People of Gaza have been offered the opportunity to have a state of their own, even up to 97% of the land area in the region leaving Israel on the tiniest sliver of undesirable land (hard to farm or build on).

Nonetheless, the Palestinians have rejected every single proposal where even a square inch of land went to the Jews to establish their national homeland in their ancestral home. Over the next hundred years, to this day, that has been the case. Offers and discussions of the two-state solution, almost always accepted by the Israelis and dismissed by the Palestinians, include: 1920 (Balfour Declaration), 1937 (Peel Commission), 1939 (British White Paper), 1947 (UN Discussion), 1979 (Israel-Egypt peace negotiations), the 1990s (Oslo Accords--no agreement reached due to Palestinian Terror attacks on Israel including on buses, cafes, busy streets), 2000 (to include giving 97% of the West Bank and all of Gaza to the Palestinians), 2008 (offer to fully withdraw from the West Bank and divide Jerusalem), 2013-14 (intentional sabotage of the Kerry Initiatives by the Palestinians), and 2020 (Trump Peace Plan).

Many people who chant, "From the River to the Sea, Palestine must be free," have no clue what this actually means. Which river? Which sea? Free from what? The river is the Jordan River, currently the Eastern border of Israel; the sea is the Mediterranean Sea, currently the Western border of Israel. Does this make sense yet? The only way Palestinians will be "free" in a land that had been ruled by Muslims from the 600s, is to completely remove the people who have resided in that land permanently since around 1160 BCE, nearly a millennium longer.

These are only some of the times that the Palestinians rejected the two-state proposal. In fact, in 2005, Israel attempted to grant the Gazans an independent region. The Israelis created infrastructure including buildings, water purification systems, schools, greenhouses, and everything needed to build Gaza into a beautiful Mediterranean destination. Instead, in 2007, the Gazans "elected" Hamas to lead them. Rather than supporting the civilians and building a prosperous region, Hamas destroyed all of the infrastructure, squandered foreign aid, and created an extensive system of tunnels to hide weapons and their own leadership while allowing their people to live in squalor, starve, and not have their basic needs met. The priority of Hamas, according to its charter, is to claim all of the land for Islam through jihad. They directly state, "Israel will exist and will continue to exist until Islam obliterates it." Moreover, it states, "Initiatives and so-called peaceful solutions and international conferences are in contradictions to the principles of the Islamic Resistant Movement....There is no solution for the Palestinian question except jihad."

Hamas's charter requires the education of their children to hate Jews, to aim to destroy Israel, and to honor suicidal fighting and martyrdom. Hamas managed to infiltrate the international aid organization so that the international community (rather than the governing body) could provide food, clothing, shelter, medicine, and education (see above) to the populace so that their money could be used to prepare for a war to annihilate Israel and the Jews. But, Hamas does not stop there; the Hamas charter also states, "The imperialistic forces in the Capitalistic West and the Communist East forces support the enemy." In plain English: Once we finish destroying Israel, we are going to continue to conquer by force every non-Arab and non-Muslim country. Watch out, America, you're next."

Additionally, Palestinians are the only people who have the hereditary right to refugee status. All other people, including the many, many Jewish people after World War II, have been through periods of being refugees. The difference is that all organizations other than for the Palestinian people assist in resettlement and learning skills to provide for oneself and build a good life for their children. Palestinians are encouraged to remain in a perpetual state of being a refugee. After nearly 80 years and several generations, the Palestinians have lived in one area and could have worked to establish a stable community (if their government permitted them to do so).

So the answer to the question of "Could there be peace if we give the Gazans/Palestinians their own state?" is a resounding NO. It has been offered, it has been attempted, and they admit they will commit the atrocities of October 7 over and over and over and over again until no Jew or Israeli remains on this planet. The charter outright says this and so do their actions and direct statements.

B. The Current Situation and Israeli Relations with Gazans.

Imagine for a moment that Mexico invaded the United States, killing 1200+ people in the most heinous way possible and kidnapping over 200. Imagine if they insisted that to return children home that had been ripped out of their parents' arms three criminals who wish to kill Americans must be released. What would happen? Would America continue to provide humanitarian aid including water, gas, and fuel to the Mexicans even though the Mexicans are sending rockets every single day to New Mexico, Texas, and California? Would they facilitate and encourage international aid organizations to bring supplies into Mexico through their border crossings? What if none of the other Central American countries want to help?

That example might sound silly, but that is exactly what has been going on for the last four months. Israel is expected to continue to provide resources to their neighbor who attacked and continues to attack them especially because no one else will. Hamas is the one that broke the first ceasefire. Hamas is the one insisting on continuing the war. Hamas is the one raping women and holding hostages in tunnels. Before this war, many Gazans crossed the border into Israel every day for work or to receive medical care. Israel supplied Gaza with many resources including water. Now, they continue to supply resources despite being in an active war with Hamas. Israel opened a border crossing to facilitate international aid while the nearest Arab country, Egypt, has refused to do the same. The Arab countries refuse to help to make Gazans look more pathetic thereby making Israel look evil for preventing aid.

However, Israel cares about the Gazans much more than Hamas does. Hamas steals the humanitarian aid and food from the Gazans. Hamas takes the fuel and gas that should be used for heating, cooking, and running generators in hospitals, and uses it to build weapons. Hamas took building materials from established structures (like the greenhouses) and materials sent by the international community and rather than building housing, schools, and hospitals, Hamas built miles and miles of tunnels. Gaza is a small area, approximately 25 miles from North to South, and 3.5 to 7.5 miles across (141 square miles). Howard County is 251 square miles. In an area smaller than Howard County, more than 350 miles of tunnels have been found. These tunnels contain running water, electricity, and air circulation systems needed for long-term habitation. The tunnel system's length is nearly twice as big as the area of the land.

Israel warns civilians to evacuate areas before attacking; Hamas forces them to stay. Israel takes many times longer to carefully minimize civilian casualties; Hamas dresses as civilians. Hamas secures its headquarters and weapons under

schools, daycares, and hospitals, knowing that Israel's image will suffer for attacking those places. Hamas uses a strategy of human shields. It is also believed that Hamas exaggerates the number of deaths and counts its 16 and 17-year-old combatants as “minors” to increase those numbers.

If Israel had wanted to win this war quickly regardless of the cost, it would have been over on October 9. Israel is waging this war to ensure that any innocent Gazans have an opportunity to be free from the terrorist organization claiming to govern them whose methods backfire and create an environment of poverty and hatred. Israel has the military capacity to do so. But Israel, as well as the Jewish people as a whole, prioritize human life. Israel, more than any other country, takes precaution after precaution to prevent the deaths of innocent people. Hamas on the other hand continues to fire rockets to populated areas every day. How do they still have rockets and fuel after firing them daily for four months?

Finally, if you look within Israel, Palestinian Israelis, as well as other Arabs, Muslims, Druze, Christians, etc. have equal rights and status to any other Israel. They may vote, serve as members of the Knesset and High Court, attend school, and worship in their own way. Israel protects the holy sites of all people. In fact, Jewish Israelis allow more freedom of religion than the Muslims in Israel do: the Temple Mount, the holiest site in all of the world for Jews and the third holiest for Muslims (despite there being no evidence that Muhammed corporeally traveled to Jerusalem), cannot be accessed most of the time by anyone who is not Muslim. When it can be accessed, it is only for a very short time, through one specific gate, and with very limited access to the area. Muslims, on the other hand, are welcome anywhere. Women in Israel have far more rights than women in Palestinian-ruled areas, and LGBTQ+ individuals can find safety and security in Israel, whereas in Gaza they would be killed.

Therefore, I request that you rescind the proposed resolution. Alternatively, I request that the wording be changed to include the following statements:

The actions on and since October 7 by the terrorist organization Hamas are inhumane and we condemn them.

Israel has a right to self-defense and national preservation. In doing so, Israel is defending not only her land and residents, but also Jews around the world and the way of life that we enjoy.

We request an immediate ceasefire when the following conditions are met:

- a) The return of all of the hostages, or their remains, to Israel;**
- b) The surrender of all of the Hamas leadership and terrorists;**
- c) The relinquishment of all weapons to international authorities (Interpol or Europol);**
- d) A plan of self-governance that secures Israel’s right of existence and the safety of all of the Israeli citizens;**
- e) A plan of self-governance that provides for the Gazan populous, the rebuilding of Gaza into a stable region, and the education of Gazan youth which promotes peace.**

I am writing to express my opposition to the Resolution introduced by Councilmember Walsh (CR-22-2024). The reasons for my opposition are listed below, in no certain order:

1. This Resolution is not within the scope of the work of the Howard County Council. The Howard County Government website states, in pertinent part, that the Council is “responsible for making the laws that govern the County.” I question how the topic addressed in this Resolution fits this definition.
2. I also question whether this body has sufficient information and/or expertise to decide whether or not a ceasefire is appropriate. After days of testimony the International Court of Justice did not call for a ceasefire.

I am writing to you today to express my deep concern and strong opposition to the Resolution (CR 22-2024) introduced by Councilmember Walsh. My name is Adam Lowy, I live in District 4 in Howard County. I **oppose CR22** and ask the county council to oppose the bill.

Dear Howard County Council Members:

As a registered voter of District 4, I am writing to request your VOTE FOR the Council Member Liz Walsh's resolution (CR22-2024). The resolution calls on the Biden administration to support an immediate and durable ceasefire in Gaza to stop killings of innocent children and women. Also, that humanitarian aid could reach 2.3 million civilians (half of them children) in dire need.

During the past four months, Israel's military campaign in Gaza (a territory under its effective control since 1967) has created, in the words of officials of aid agencies of the United Nations, a "catastrophic" humanitarian situation and has rendered the territory "uninhabitable". Israel's indiscriminate bombing campaign has wiped out entire neighborhoods, with currently over 27,000 killed (70% of whom are women and children) and more than 60,000 wounded, thousands more unaccounted for under the rubble. Around 1.9 million (85% of the population) displaced from their homes and forced into a small sliver of land in southern Gaza. Israeli bombing has also destroyed almost 70 percent of housing units in Gaza, based on an academic analysis of satellite radar data. Alarming, the mortality rate of civilians killed is also higher than that of the Second World War. Israel's military operation has created a large population of sadly WCNSF (wounded child with no surviving family). Civilians in Palestine have had little or no food, water, safe shelter, sanitation, electricity, fuel, and medical care.

These civilian casualties and suffering has had a worldwide impact, with calls for moral and legal responsibility of countries under the international humanitarian law. In this regard, South Africa brought legal proceedings against Israel's military campaign in Gaza before the International Court of Justice (ICJ) under the Genocide Convention. On January 26, 2024, the court in its provisional order found it plausible that Israel has committed acts that violate the Convention. Among the court-ordered provisional measures, one of them requires that Israel must take "immediate and effective" measures to ensure the provision of urgently needed humanitarian aid and basic services.

Your VOTE FOR the resolution would be an act of moral obligation and would contribute to a growing political momentum for achieving an immediate and durable ceasefire in Gaza, a prerequisite for effectively delivering humanitarian aid.

Dear Councilwoman Walsh and Members of the Howard County Council,

As an attorney, mother, daughter, sister, and Jewish citizen in Maryland – I am disappointed and ashamed that you would propose and support in any way Resolution CR22-2024 - demanding for an immediate cease fire in Gaza. You point to the millions of innocent lives being jeopardized in Gaza. Yet Council President Liz Walsh’s resolution fails to take into account its antisemitic intent and impact:

- 1) A cease fire will ONLY benefit Hamas AND proxy groups aimed at annihilating and eradicating all Jews and the state of Israel. This is not just conjecture – this is an absolute fact, which Hamas and every proxy group aiming to kill Israelis has made clear and unequivocal. Calls of “From the River to the Sea” symbolize the elimination of Israel from its west to east border – and that intent of Hamas and Iranian proxies is no secret.
- 2) Israel is fighting to survive – fighting to exist. Many point to the despicable, violent, inhumane and evil actions by Hamas on October 7, 2023, as proof that Hamas has killed Israeli innocent civilians as well. However – I would be remiss if I didn’t clarify that there is much more at stake here. THERE IS MUCH MORE TO CONSIDER WHEN YOU REQUEST THE END OF THE KILLING OF INNOCENT CIVILIANS VIA A CEASEFIRE. Israel happens to be fortunate to have the Iron Dome – to protect its people from the missiles and rockets aimed every day at innocent Jewish civilians to kill them and destroy them. Without that self protection – do you really think the number of innocent civilians on the Israeli side would not exist? Palestinian violent proxy groups are aiming rockets and bombs at Israel all day and for many years – tens of thousands of Israelis have been killed deliberately by Hamas and Iranian proxy groups whose only goal is to destroy Israel and kill Israelis. Even today that is the only goal of Hamas, Houthis, Hezbollah and other proxy groups. Israel just has fewer innocent civilians dying because the Iron Dome has intercepted the rockets aimed to kill Israelis. DO NOT BE FOOLED. There are innocent civilian lives at stake in both directions. But a cease fire CERTAINLY will not stop the firing from terror groups toward Israel because their sole goal, which they are very open and transparent about, is to destroy every ounce of Israel and everyone in it.
- 3) If there is a cease fire – Hamas and other proxy groups of Iran have made very clear that they will continue to fight to destroy Israel, regardless of when or where. So, what exactly are you attempting to accomplish with Resolution CR22-2024? Do you really expect a cease fire to solve the problem that Hamas started with violence in the first place? Hamas has made very clear, as have other groups, that they plan to continue until all violence, killings, stabbings, and bombings of Israelis until Israel and Jews are gone.

- 4) Who will be the parties to this “cease fire” being proposed? Is Hamas negotiating and agreeing to it? Are Houthis negotiating it? Is Hezbollah negotiating with Israel? Is Iran compromising and negotiating with Israel on behalf of its proxies? Because a cease fire must go both ways. So, who exactly will sit down at the table to negotiate and implement your cease fire? Or are you only requesting Israel to “cease fire?”

- 5) Israel is not the party killing and punishing innocent civilians in Gaza and the West Bank. In fact, it has been more than one decade since Israel withdrew from Gaza, as well as REMOVED EVERY ISRAELI LIVING ON GAZAN LAND, even though many Israelis were upset about the unilateral Israeli withdrawal from Gaza and the northern West Bank. In August 2005, under Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, Israel unilaterally evacuated all Israelis from the Gaza Strip and the northern West Bank. In fact, Palestinians in Gaza chose Hamas to become their governing leader – a leader that should have been responsible for creating infrastructure, schools, hospitals, educational systems, and a sound economic system. When Israel withdrew from Gaza, Israel even left behind in perfect operating condition its agricultural lands and properties to help Hamas create sustainable life off of the land and ways for people in Gaza to support themselves. Do you know what happened next? Hamas went and DESTROYED all of the agricultural property provided by Israel – Hamas didn’t care about its people and taking care of them. In fact, in response to Israel’s withdrawal, Gaza immediately launched missiles and rockets into Israel at innocent civilians for years – as far as to Tel Aviv.

- 6) There have been multiple efforts, even since October 7, 2023, to implement a cease fire and/or peace. EVERY SINGLE TIME Hamas has chosen not to enforce the cease fire agreement or to maintain peace – Israel has complied EVERY SINGLE TIME. Even more, historically – every single time Israel has come to the table and either agreed to provide land or independence to Palestinians – Palestinians have rejected all peaceful initiatives with Israel (even when prior agreements had been made). In November 1947, Mufti Hajj Amin Husseini refused to agree to the terms of the UN Partition Plan to establish two states (a Jewish and Arab state) – which by the way would have given Palestinians much more land. The Mufti made clear no Jews would be allowed in a Palestinian state and that he would not agree to any plans that included a Jewish state. Yasser Arafat succeeded the Mufti, refusing to accept the state of Israel. In fact, he mounted, via the PLO, terrorist attacks on Israel. When Anwar Sadat signed a peace treaty with Israel, Arafat and the PLO joined with other Arab League countries from 1977 to 1989 to punish Egypt and reject Egypt as a member. The Oslo Accords resulted in immediate suicide bombings all over the streets of Israel that targeted innocent civilians – all in an effort to destroy any existence of an Israeli state. In July 2000, at the Camp David Summit, Israel Prime Minister Ehud Barak aimed to create a strong peace agreement with Arafat to introduce

peace to all people in the Middle East by offering many concessions to Arafat in return for Arafat to recognize the state of Israel's right to exist. Despite numerous concessions, and the chance to truly create lasting peace, Arafat refused. Instead, the Palestinian Authority immediately declared a war of terror ("al-Aqsa Antifada") on Israel – once again attacking innocent civilians despite Israeli concessions and attempts to make peace. More than 1,100 Israelis were murdered. Next, in August 2005, Prime Minister Ariel Sharon of Israel aimed for peace again - unilaterally evacuating all of the Gaza Strip and the northern West Bank, including forcefully removing every Israeli person from that land, as a way to make peace. Israel left in place all of the agricultural land it had worked hard to create and preserve for the people of Gaza. In response, the Palestinians launched missiles and rockets at Israel from the Gaza Strip. In June 2007, Hamas took over the Gaza Strip (Israel was not in the Gaza Strip at all). Since then, there have been tens of thousands of nonstop missiles, bombs and rockets fired at Israel from Gaza. In 2008, Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert offered PLO Chairman and PA President Mahmoud Abbas a huge peace proposal. Abbas wouldn't even listen – he rejected it immediately. Abbas either wanted the boundaries of Palestine from 1967 or nothing. One year ago, Abbas rejected the United States more recent proposal – which Abbas refused to even hear. ***In case it is not yet clear – the ultimate purpose of a cease fire would be to negotiate a peaceful solution in the Middle East and end the violence. But calls to destroy all of Israel and to eliminate its right to exist by Hamas and other proxy groups will never cease – that has been made clear through history.

Your job is to reflect and represent the identities and well being of all of your constituents. This resolution is discriminatory, antisemitic, and ineffective. You can do better. I am a constituent residing at 6263 Deep River Canyon in Columbia. I am reaching out to you today to thank you for the introduction of Councilmember Liz Walsh's resolution CR22-2024. I applaud this act of leadership, which demonstrates a strong stance against violence and injustice. I would also like to express unwavering support for CR22-2024, advocating for an immediate and permanent ceasefire in Gaza. I believe this resolution reflects Howards County's values and the community's aspiration for peace.

I recently moved to Howard County from Montgomery County less than two years ago, primarily for the benefit of my children ages 12 and 9 and for the values espoused by Howard County. 

I urge you to oppose Howard County Council Resolution CR22-2024, “a resolution demanding an immediate cease-fire in Gaza”. The Howard County Council should not support this proposal for the following reasons.

1. A demand for an immediate ceasefire undermines America’s military who are currently fighting terrorists on land, at sea, and in the air. Israel is fighting America’s fight in this war.
2. A demand for an immediate ceasefire undermines the negotiating process by which the moderate Middle East parties who are attempting to broker a ceasefire between Hamas and Israel carry the weight of U.S. support behind them.
3. A demand for an immediate ceasefire would not be honored by Hamas, the Houthis, or America’s other enemies in the Middle East. It is, in effect, merely a plea to have Israel and America stop shooting at our enemies.

Dear Howard County Council Members:

As a registered voter of District 4, I am writing to request your VOTE FOR the Council Member Liz Walsh's resolution (CR22-2024). The resolution calls on the Biden administration to support an immediate and durable ceasefire in Gaza to stop killings of innocent children and women. Also, that humanitarian aid could reach 2.3 million civilians (half of them children) in dire need.

During the past four months, Israel's military campaign in Gaza (a territory under its effective control since 1967) has created, in the words of officials of aid agencies of the United Nations, a "catastrophic" humanitarian situation and has rendered the territory "uninhabitable". Israel's indiscriminate bombing campaign has wiped out entire neighborhoods, with currently over 27,000 killed (70% of whom are women and children) and more than 60,000 wounded, thousands more unaccounted for under the rubble. Around 1.9 million (85% of the population) displaced from their homes and forced into a small sliver of land in southern Gaza. Israeli bombing has also destroyed almost 70 percent of housing units in Gaza, based on an academic analysis of satellite radar data. Alarming, the mortality rate of civilians killed is also higher than that of the Second World War. Israel's military operation has created a large population of sadly WCNSF (wounded child with no surviving family). Civilians in Palestine have had little or no food, water, safe shelter, sanitation, electricity, fuel, and medical care.

These civilian casualties and suffering has had a worldwide impact, with calls for moral and legal responsibility of countries under the international humanitarian law. In this regard, South Africa brought legal proceedings against Israel's military campaign in Gaza before the International Court of Justice (ICJ) under the Genocide Convention. On January 26, 2024, the court in its provisional order found it plausible that Israel has committed acts that violate the Convention. Among the court-ordered provisional measures, one of them requires that Israel must take "immediate and effective" measures to ensure the provision of urgently needed humanitarian aid and basic services.

Your VOTE FOR the resolution would be an act of moral obligation and would contribute to a growing political momentum for achieving an immediate and durable ceasefire in Gaza, a prerequisite for effectively delivering humanitarian aid.

Good evening members of the Howard County Delegation,

My name is Hena Zuberi, a proud resident of Howard County and the Director of Advocacy at Justice For All. For over three decades, our organization has been at the forefront of advocating against genocide. Today, I stand before you to express my strong support for CR-22, the resolution calling for a ceasefire.

Ceasefire is more than just a term; it signifies the hope for peace, the cessation of the killing of innocent children, the release of hostages and prisoners, and the provision of essential resources like food and water to millions. The people in Gaza are facing extreme hardships, to the point of eating grass to survive.

My career, spanning more than ten years, has been devoted to researching genocide and advocating for its survivors. This work has provided me with a deep understanding of the devastating effects of such atrocities. It is with this knowledge that I speak to you today.

The crisis in Gaza, which I consider genocidal, has far-reaching implications, even here in the U.S., challenging our core values of freedom and justice. There have been documented cases, including in Maryland, where individuals' First Amendment rights were threatened due to their stance on Palestine.

Moreover, this crisis has contributed to a significant rise in Islamophobia in Maryland, as reported by the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR). The increase in hate crimes and bigotry against our Muslim community members is alarming and underscores the necessity for a ceasefire and efforts to address the underlying causes of such hatred.

This is not just an international issue; it's a Maryland issue. Maryland's solidarity, similar to the support shown for Ukraine, can bring hope and acknowledge the pain of many, including my friend Laila, who has lost numerous family members in Gaza.

Our state plays a significant role in the conflict through companies like Lockheed Martin, headquartered here, which exports arms to Israel. The U.S. is a major supplier of military equipment to Israel, with Maryland contributing significantly through tax dollars and military financing.

Every day, I document the tragic losses caused by these weapons, including children like Jamil a-Din Nijam, only three years old. Our silence on this issue makes us complicit. We stand with all victims of violence and oppression and urge you to advocate for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza and the West Bank.

Nelson Mandela once said, "To deny people their human rights is to challenge their very humanity." As we witness the

tragedy in Gaza and the West Bank, we must not be silent. Let Maryland be remembered for standing on the side of humanity, justice, and peace.

Our call for a ceasefire is a plea for peace and a demand for the preservation of our constitutional values. Let us join together to promote peace and justice, both internationally and within our own community. Thank you for considering this urgent plea. Actions by councils in cities like San Francisco and Ann Arbor have shown that local support can influence national policy. Let's ensure our actions reflect our commitment to human rights and justice.

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

Dear Councilwoman Walsh and Members of the Howard County Council,

As a mother, daughter, sister, and Jewish citizen of America with children and grandchildren who are citizens in Maryland – “I am disappointed and ashamed that you would propose and support in any way Resolution CR22-2024 - demanding for an immediate cease fire in Gaza. You point to the millions of innocent lives being jeopardized in Gaza. Yet Council President Liz Walsh’s resolution fails to take into account its antisemitic intent and impact:

- 1) A cease fire will ONLY benefit Hamas AND proxy groups aimed at annihilating and eradicating all Jews and the state of Israel. This is not just conjecture – this is an absolute fact, which Hamas and every proxy group aiming to kill Israelis has made clear and unequivocal. Calls of “From the River to the Sea” symbolize the elimination of Israel from its west to east border – and that intent of Hamas and Iranian proxies is no secret.
- 2) Israel is fighting to survive – fighting to exist. Many point to the despicable, violent, inhumane and evil actions by Hamas on October 7, 2023, as proof that Hamas has killed Israeli innocent civilians as well. However – I would be remiss if I didn’t clarify that there is much more at stake here. THERE IS MUCH MORE TO CONSIDER WHEN YOU REQUEST THE END OF THE KILLING OF INNOCENT CIVILIANS VIA A CEASEFIRE. Israel happens to be fortunate to have the Iron Dome – to protect its people from the missiles and rockets aimed every day at innocent Jewish civilians to kill them and destroy them. Without that self protection– do you really think the number of innocent civilians on the Israeli side would not exist? Palestinian violent proxy groups are aiming rockets and bombs at Israel all day and for many years – tens of thousands of Israelis have been killed deliberately by Hamas and Iranian proxy groups whose only goal is to destroy Israel and kill Israelis. Even today that is the only goal of Hamas, Houthis, Hezbollah and other proxy groups. Israel just has fewer innocent civilians dying because the Iron Dome has intercepted the rockets aimed to kill Israelis. DO NOT BE FOOLED. There are innocent civilian lives at stake in both directions. But a cease fire CERTAINLY will not stop the firing

from terror groups toward Israel because their sole goal, which they are very open and transparent about, is to destroy every ounce of Israel and everyone in it.

- 3) If there is a cease fire – Hamas and other proxy groups of Iran have made very clear that they will continue to fight to destroy Israel, regardless of when or where. So, what exactly are you attempting to accomplish with Resolution CR22-2024? Do you really expect a cease fire to solve the problem that Hamas started with violence in the first place? Hamas has made very clear, as have other groups, that they plan to continue until all violence, killings, stabbings, and bombings of Israelis until Israel and Jews are gone.
- 4) Who will be the parties to this “cease fire” being proposed? Is Hamas negotiating and agreeing to it? Are Houthis negotiating it? Is Hezbollah negotiating with Israel? Is Iran compromising and negotiating with Israel on behalf of its proxies? Because a cease fire must go both ways. So, who exactly will sit down at the table to negotiate and implement your cease fire? Or are you only requesting Israel to “cease fire?”
- 5) Israel is not the party killing and punishing innocent civilians in Gaza and the West Bank. In fact, it has been more than one decade since Israel withdrew from Gaza, as well as REMOVED EVERY ISRAELI LIVING ON GAZAN LAND, even though many Israelis were upset about the unilateral Israeli withdrawal from Gaza and the northern West Bank. In August 2005, under Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, Israel unilaterally evacuated all Israelis from the Gaza Strip and the northern West Bank. In fact, Palestinians in Gaza chose Hamas to become their governing leader – a leader that should have been responsible for creating infrastructure, schools, hospitals, educational systems, and a sound economic system. When Israel withdrew from Gaza, Israel even left behind in perfect operating condition its agricultural lands and properties to help Hamas create sustainable life off of the land and ways for people in Gaza to support themselves. Do you know what happened next? Hamas went and DESTROYED all of the agricultural property provided by Israel – Hamas didn’t care about its people and taking care of them. In fact, in response to Israel’s withdrawal, Gaza immediately launched missiles and rockets into Israel at innocent civilians for years – as far as to Tel Aviv.
- 6) There have been multiple efforts, even since October 7, 2023, to implement a cease fire and/or peace. EVERY SINGLE TIME Hamas has chosen not to enforce the cease fire agreement or to maintain peace – Israel has complied EVERY SINGLE TIME. Even more, historically – every single time Israel has come to the table and either agreed to provide land or independence to Palestinians – Palestinians have rejected all peaceful initiatives with Israel (even when prior agreements had been made). In November 1947, Mufti Hajj Amin Husseini refused to agree to the terms of the UN Partition Plan to establish two states (a Jewish and Arab state) – which by the way would have given Palestinians much more land. The Mufti made clear no Jews would be allowed in a Palestinian state and that he would not agree to any plans that included a Jewish state. Yasser Arafat succeeded the Mufti, refusing to accept the state of Israel. In fact, he mounted, via the PLO, terrorist

attacks on Israel. When Anwar Sadat signed a peace treaty with Israel, Arafat and the PLO joined with other Arab League countries from 1977 to 1989 to punish Egypt and reject Egypt as a member. The Oslo Accords resulted in immediate suicide bombings all over the streets of Israel that targeted innocent civilians – all in an effort to destroy any existence of an Israeli state. In July 2000, at the Camp David Summit, Israel Prime Minister Ehud Barak aimed to create a strong peace agreement with Arafat to introduce peace to all people in the Middle East by offering many concessions to Arafat in return for Arafat to recognize the state of Israel's right to exist. Despite numerous concessions, and the chance to truly create lasting peace, Arafat refused. Instead, the Palestinian Authority immediately declared a war of terror (“al-Aqsa Antifada”) on Israel – once again attacking innocent civilians despite Israeli concessions and attempts to make peace. More than 1,100 Israelis were murdered. Next, in August 2005, Prime Minister Ariel Sharon of Israel aimed for peace again - unilaterally evacuating all of the Gaza Strip and the northern West Bank, including forcefully removing every Israeli person from that land, as a way to make peace. Israel left in place all of the agricultural land it had worked hard to create and preserve for the people of Gaza. In response, the Palestinians launched missiles and rockets at Israel from the Gaza Strip. In June 2007, Hamas took over the Gaza Strip (Israel was not in the Gaza Strip at all). Since then, there have been tens of thousands of nonstop missiles, bombs and rockets fired at Israel from Gaza. In 2008, Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert offered PLO Chairman and PA President Mahmoud Abbas a huge peace proposal. Abbas wouldn't even listen – he rejected it immediately. Abbas either wanted the boundaries of Palestine from 1967 or nothing. One year ago, Abbas rejected the United States more recent proposal – which Abbas refused to even hear. ***In case it is not yet clear – the ultimate purpose of a cease fire would be to negotiate a peaceful solution in the Middle East and end the violence. But calls to destroy all of Israel and to eliminate its right to exist by Hamas and other proxy groups will never cease – that has been made clear through history.

- 7) The road to peace is easy. As soon as Hamas releases Israeli hostages – problem solved. Yet Hamas has made very clear that it is not going to happen. So, you are calling for a cease fire in the name of peace, but Hamas wants no part of peace.
- 8) No other Arab countries are taking in Palestinians. What about the dozens of other countries who could be helping in this situation? Israel is trying to defend itself and the lives of its citizens after a horrifically brutal attack, **while also** providing protection to innocent Palestinians. While Hamas is hiding underground, in tunnels and beneath holes created in civilian buildings – innocent Palestinians are being left aboveground with no protection. Hamas is the governing body in Gaza – yet where is Hamas to protect its people? Hamas doesn't want what is in the best interest of Gazans – Hamas is hurting its own. Perhaps your resolution should call for Hamas to stop ignoring the best interests of and stop hurting its own Palestinian innocent civilians, as well as innocent Israeli civilians!!!!

9) Israel drops millions of leaflets in Gaza to warn civilians to move out of harms way. What other nation does that? NONE. Israel makes public announcements to warn innocent civilians to move to places of safety. What other nation does that? NONE. Yet many innocent civilians have died in Palestine because Hamas refused to let them move despite warnings from Israel. So how would a call for a cease fire protect innocent civilians from Hamas – their own leader who is hurting them? Israel is trying to save them while still fighting for the lives and existence of Israelis.

This is a post I shared on Facebook about my feelings regarding the conflict in the Middle East, the increase in antisemitism- and Islamophobia- in our community as well as our country.

I ask that you please reject the resolution presented by Liz Walsh. I have made attempts to speak with her directly but she refuses to engage with the Jewish community.

Thank you for taking the time to read my plea. Because I am begging.

A long plea to Humanity.

I am truly devastated by the growing sympathy for HAMAS - to be clear this is the increasing inability to distinguish the terrorist regime from the innocent Gazans who deserve our compassion. More and more I am seeing the bolstering of Hate, even from so called friends and especially members of my own community in Howard County.

I don't know how to talk about it anymore because people have chosen to turn their backs on us and that is a very jagged, bitter pill to swallow. I didn't want to believe how much antisemitism exists - and I am not calling criticism of Netanyahu's government's crimes antisemitism - I am talking about the inability to denounce HAMAS and to demand the release of all hostages - the babies, the girls who have been sexually tortured for months...I have been so naive my entire life.

Why don't you hear us?

Why don't you loudly support us as you support the Palestinians?

Yet you unequivocally call for a ceasefire without any care for Israeli (ie JEWISH) suffering.

The inability to have compassion for both Palestinians and Israelis is heartbreaking. I cannot just ignore it when it is so rampant here in Howard County and among so-called friends who have never even spoken of the massacre of 10/7 - which, by the way, is also being investigated for acts of genocide and war crimes.

But you remain silent about these things.

You write about how Israelis are raised to hate and fear Palestinians, yet do not acknowledge the indoctrination of Palestinian children which is even more intense and literally militant.

Some have even defended the HAMAS charter.

You celebrate Palestinian protests with the refusal to understand that “from the river to the sea” *has antisemitic sentiments* that are hurtful to the Jewish community. Rather, you seek to argue the point instead of HEARING how those words MAKE US FEEL.

I will continue to strive to openly listen to those who do not share my perspective as I always seek to understand.

I wish the rest of the community was able to do the same - and the friends I can't bring myself to speak to because they have clearly made their choice and have shown zero concern for the rising antisemitism here at home in our own country.

And have been silent about the slaughter on 10/7 - have turned a blind eye to that event and the ever existing threat to be repeated in perpetuity. I doubt you have brought yourselves to look at those images.

It is not a tangible thing to most of you who know no one in Gaza or Israel and have never been touched, threatened or lost people because of Hate simply because of your history and dna. Every one of us has personal connections to the Israelis, the majority of us to the Holocaust and the community I grew up with lost valued and beloved members along with a sense of security when our synagogue was the scene of the worst massacre of Jewish people in our nation's history.

You watch the heartbreaking, horrific images coming from Gaza and lazily choose to ignore the suffering of not only the Israel citizens, but the intense hurt and fear of the Jewish community in your own backyard. Because it's in your face constantly and the easy thing to see and sympathize.

Everything that comes out of Israel is called a lie - no other nation has been questioned like this. You don't want to hear truths because you would have to examine your own narrative.

I am relieved that I did not become a member of the Howard County Democratic Central Committee because I see you now, most of you. And I am so disappointed.

Dear Council Members and County Executive,

My name is Muzna Ansari, I have been a Howard County resident for almost 5 years now. I have dedicated my entire career to social justice--having worked on voting rights, civil rights, and for the past decade, immigrant rights. I want to start by thanking Council Member Liz Walsh for her moral integrity in Drafting CR-22, which calls for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza. I am shocked that members of this Council requested that CR-22 be put on tonight's legislative session agenda for final consideration, when our community has been calling, emailing, and requesting meetings daily to discuss the resolution. This is an issue of utmost importance to us but our Council members are blatantly ignoring us.

The breadth and scale of human rights abuses in Gaza are truly shocking--from basic freedom of movement, to access to necessities such as water and food, to the displacement of 2 MILLION Palestinians. I have heard the refrain from leaders in Howard county that "that is an issue far away, one that we cannot change and that does not affect us." None of us supporting CR-22 are naive enough to believe a county resolution will immediately end the atrocities in Gaza--but we are also smart enough to know that these resolutions are not simply symbolic in nature. They are a testament to the public opinion and a reflection of the concerns of county residents. And when enough states pass these resolutions, the very elected officials who DO have the power and ability to help bring an end to the genocide of the people of Palestine, will see how out of touch they are with the will of the people. I am grateful that Senator Van Hollen has joined calls for a ceasefire but we still have many other state electeds who are blatantly ignoring the will of their people. At this time, 60% of Americans and 80% of Democrats support a ceasefire, but our electeds are silent.

The truth of the matter is that this issue does directly affect us. Nearly \$80 million in Maryland taxpayer dollars go to the state of Israel every year, while the Howard County Public School System is cutting over 300 positions this year. The Council on American-Islamic Relations received 3,578 Complaints during the last three months alone. There have been countless incidents right here in Howard County of students whose freedom of speech has been inhibited, simply because they are speaking on behalf of Palestine. Across the nation, there have been attempts to not only prevent our communities from speaking out and exercising our freedom of speech, but elected leaders have gone so far as to smear us and defame us for exercising these rights. As the American Civil Liberties Union, ACLU recently stated "it is NEVER ok for our leaders to attack, investigate, or surveil people because of their dissent against the government. Period." In our own state, the Montgomery County Senate Delegation went after the immigrant rights organization CASA, simply because they expressed support for Palestine. Today we are being prevented from speaking out on behalf of our communities and against a genocide-- tomorrow, we may be inhibited from exercising our freedom of speech on other matters. This is a dangerous slippery slope, not just for us as residents of Maryland, but for us as citizens of a democracy.

The issue of Palestine is not a small or irrelevant issue, but one that affects all of us, directly. And frankly, many of us here are single issue voters--your votes on this resolution will determine whether or not we will support you in the next election cycle. As our representatives, you have a responsibility to your residents, including the Muslim, Arab,

Palestinian community who reside and contribute daily to our communities, county, and state. You have not only an opportunity, but a responsibility to support this resolution.

It contains NO reference to Israel's right to exist and to defend all of her citizens; no reference that this war was started by a murderous terrorist regime that slaughtered 1200 people and kidnapped 240 citizens of Israel on October 7th and that if Hamas had not attacked there would be no war; no reference that there was a ceasefire in place on October 6th; no reference to the hostages being freed; that humanitarian aid has been provided on a daily basis only to be left dumped into Gaza due to the lack of the UN's ability to properly distribute the aid; and that people of Gaza will be free when Hamas is not in power. None of these are addressed in the proposed resolution.

I also support the Howard County Council using time and funds to actually benefit the county. As a registered voter of District 1, I am writing to request that you VOTE FOR the Council Member Liz Walsh's resolution (CR22-2024), which calls on the Biden administration to support an immediate and durable ceasefire in Gaza so that humanitarian aid could reach 2.3 million civilians (half of them children) in dire need.

During the past four months, Israel's military campaign in Gaza (a territory under its effective control since 1967) has created, in the words of officials of aid agencies of the United Nations, a "catastrophic" humanitarian situation and has rendered the territory "uninhabitable". Israel's indiscriminate bombing campaign has wiped out entire neighborhoods, with currently over 27,000 killed (70% of whom are women and children) and more than 60,000 wounded, thousands more unaccounted for under the rubble, and 1.9 million (85% of the population) displaced from their homes and forced into a small sliver of land in southern Gaza. Israeli bombing has also destroyed so far almost 70 percent of housing units in Gaza based on an academic analysis of satellite radar data compared to the Allied bombing that destroyed almost 50% of buildings in Dresden during the Second World War. Alarming, the mortality rate of civilians killed is also higher than that of Second World War. Israel's military campaign has also given the world a sad new acronym, WCNSF (wounded child with no surviving family). Last but not least, during this time, civilians have had little or no food, water, safe shelter, sanitation, electricity, fuel, and medical care.

These civilian casualties and suffering has had a worldwide impact, with calls for moral and legal responsibility of countries under the international humanitarian law. In this regard, South Africa brought legal proceedings against Israel's military campaign in Gaza before the International Court of Justice (ICJ) under the Genocide Convention. On January 26, 2024, the court in its provisional order found it plausible that Israel has committed acts that violate the Convention. Among the court-ordered provisional measures, one of them requires that Israel must take "immediate and effective" measures to ensure the provision of urgently needed humanitarian aid and basic services.

Your VOTE FOR the resolution would be an act of moral clarity and would contribute to a growing political momentum for achieving an immediate and durable ceasefire in Gaza, which is a prerequisite for effectively delivering humanitarian aid.

Dear Howard County Council Members,

I'm writing to urge you to vote NO on CR22-2024.

As a long-time resident, I'm disturbed by the divisive nature of this resolution. Our Jewish and Muslim communities are hurting right now - with many who have personal connections to those who have lost their lives in either Gaza or Israel.

Please remember, this is NOT a war against the Palestinian people. This is a war against the terrorist organization, Hamas. There WAS a cease-fire in place on October 6th, that was broken by Hamas terrorists who illegally broke over border walls, and brutally attacked, raped, mutilated, burned, and murdered Israeli citizens. Hamas terrorists took injured civilian CHILDREN, the elderly, women, and Holocaust survivors hostage and are still holding over 130 people hostage - almost four months later. As much as our Jewish community would love to see the end of the war against Hamas and the end of the suffering of the Palestinian people -- leaders of Hamas have rejected offers of a ceasefire, and have publicly proclaimed that October 7th is just the start of the attacks they plan to lead against the Israeli people. October 7th was not the first time that Hamas has broken a ceasefire - it has happened over and over since they took power after Israel pulled out of Gaza in 2005.

Besides the fact that Hamas will not agree to a ceasefire, leaving the release of the hostages out of the ceasefire resolution is a great injustice. Holding civilians hostage is a WAR CRIME, that should not be tolerated and is just another indication that a ceasefire agreement will not work until the Hamas terror organization is eradicated.

In addition, this resolution, filed by Liz Walsh, incorrectly implies that this resolution is similar to the ones being called for by United States Congressmen Kweisi Mfume and Jamie Raskin, and Senator Chris Van Hollen. when in fact their resolutions are calling for "immediate return of the hostages, a complete bilateral ceasefire, the removal of the Hamas terrorists from operational control of Gaza," none of which are mentioned in CR22-2024.
