22	(a) This section applies to all elected officials, all candidates to be elected officials, all
23	employees holding positions listed in subsection (b) of this section, all persons appointed to the
24	boards and commissions listed in subsection (c) of this section, and certain high school members
25	of boards and commissions.
26	(b) This section applies to the following County employees:
27	(1) All executive exempt positions as listed in section 1.306 "Executive Exempt" of the
28	Howard County Code;
29	(2) All employees authorized to draft specifications for, negotiate or execute a contract
30	which commits the County or any of its boards, agencies or departments to expend in excess of
31	\$2,500.00; and

1 (3) All employees in a managerial or policy-making positions as determined by the 2 commission upon recommendation of their department or agency head.
