2	Maryland authorizes each county board of health to set any fee or charge in connection with its		
3	rules and regulations; and

5	WHEREAS, Section 12.106 of the Howard County Code authorizes the Health		
6	Department to charge fees for certain on-site sewage disposal related activities and for the		
7	construction, alteration and operation of public pools and spas; and

9	WHEREAS, Section 12.107 of the Howard County Code authorizes the Health		
10	Department to charge fees for certain food service facility activities that it regulates; and

12	WHEREAS, the Board of Health has not proposed any changes for Fiscal Year 2026 to		
13	fees established by the Board of Health.

15	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard County
