Title: AN ACT to modify the restriction on the use of excess surplus revenue pursuant to Section 615B of the Howard County Charter in order to use excess surplus revenue from prior years to further support the Operating Budget request of the Board of Education in the Fiscal Year 2026 budget; providing that this act shall be temporary and shall expire by June 30, 2026; and declaring that this Act is an Emergency Bill necessary to meet an immediate emergency affecting public health, safety or welfare.

1	WHEREAS, the County Executive has prepared the Annual Budget and Appropriation
2	Ordinance of Howard County, Fiscal Year 2026 that contains the capital and operating budget
3	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026 (FY26 Budget); and
4	
5	WHEREAS, the FY26 Budget is pending in Council Bill No. 36-2025; and
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7	WHEREAS, the FY26 Budget has been developed under conditions of great uncertainty
8	that have been amplified by major workforce changes at the federal level and funding changes at
9	the state level, including cost shifts of approximately \$8 million to Howard County Government
10	from the State in FY26; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, the Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) is facing significant
13	funding needs in the FY26 budget related to employee compensation, special education,
14	transportation, fixed costs, and State mandates including implementation of the Blueprint for
15	Maryland's Future; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, in his proposed FY26 Budget, the County Executive proposed an increase
18	of \$39 million in direct recurring County funding to support the Howard County Public School
19	System (HCPSS), reflecting a 5.1% increase and totaling \$800 million in County funding
20	proposed to HCPSS in FY26; and
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22	WHEREAS, the County Executive proposed an additional \$6.7 million in County
23	funding to cover HCPSS pension liabilities in the FY26 Budget, a cost passed from the State to
24	the County, bringing the total increase in County investment to \$45.7 million for HCPSS
25	expenses in the proposed FY26 Budget, which reflects 64% of all new revenue growth; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, the Board of Education and Superintendent have identified that additional
28	funds are needed above the County increase of \$45.7 million to avoid reductions in staff and
29	impacts to core educational services in the FY26 Budget; and
30	

1	WHEREAS, in order to avoid reductions in staff and impacts to core educational
2	services, the County Executive intends to further support the County's portion of the Board of
3	Education's Operating Budget request; and
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5	WHEREAS, for Fiscal Year 2026, only, the County has determined that excess surplus
6	revenue from prior fiscal years in the amount of up to \$14,500,000 is necessary to further support
7	the Fiscal Year 2026 Operating Budget request of the Board of Education; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 615B of the Howard County Charter, the use of excess
10	surplus revenue is restricted to (1) fund capital projects, (2) reduce existing County debt; and/or
11	(3) fund appropriations in the current expense budget for capital outlay and for non-recurring
12	expenses; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, Section 615B also provides that the restriction on the use of excess surplus
15	may be modified by an ordinance passed by an affirmative vote of 2/3 of the members of the
16	County Council; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, the County wishes to temporarily modify the restriction on the use of
19	excess surplus revenue to further support the Fiscal Year 2026 Operating Budget request of the
20	Board of Education; and
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22	WHEREAS, because there may be reductions in staff and impacts to core educational
23	services, pursuant to Section 209(d) of the Howard County Charter, this Emergency Bill is
24	necessary to meet an immediate emergency affecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the
25	County.

27	NOW, THEREFORE,
28	
29	Section 1. Be It Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, the restriction on
30	the use of excess surplus revenue required by Section 615B of the Charter is temporarily modified

- 1 to allow the use of excess surplus revenue from prior fiscal years in the amount of up to
- 2 \$14,500,000 to further support the County's portion of the Fiscal Year 2026 Operating Budget
- 3 request of the Board of Education.

- 5 Section 2. And Be It Further Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland
- 6 that, this modification is temporary in nature in that it only applies to the Fiscal Year 2026
- 7 budget, and at the end of Fiscal Year 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the
- 8 County Council, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

- 10 Section 3. And Be It Further Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland that
- this Act is adopted as an emergency measure to address an immediate emergency affecting
- 12 public health, safety, or welfare and having been passed by two-thirds of its members, this Act
- shall be effective immediately upon its enactment.
