Transportation is authorized to make grants to counties and to local governments for a mass
transportation program of projects; and

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WHEREAS, it is required by the United States Department of Transportation in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 that, in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under the Federal Transit Act, the applicant give an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the United States Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the County's goal is that minority business enterprises be utilized to the fullest extent possible in connection with these projects and programs; therefore, definite procedures have been established and are being administered to ensure that minority business shall have the maximum opportunity to compete for construction contracts,
 supplies, equipment contracts, or consultant and other services.

Subject:	Testimony in support of County Council resolution endorsing FY 2026 Annual Transportation Plan Application

Each fiscal year, on behalf of Howard County, the Office of Transportation (OOT) prepares an Annual Transportation Plan for submission to the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) of the Maryland Department of Transportation. Through the application the OOT requests funding for operating and capital grant funds. The grants allow the County to use federal and state funds to subsidize Howard County's portion of the expenses for the Regional Transportation Agency of Central Maryland (RTA), which provides the County's local bus and paratransit service

The grant requirements for financial assistance imposes certain obligations upon the County, including the provision of the local share of the project costs in the transit program. Therefore the MTA requires that the Annual Transpoliation Plan (ATP) application include an authorizing resolution endorsing the application. The resolution being submitted to the Howard County Council for this year is similar to last year's resolution

This year the Office of Transportation is requesting Capital Grants to support the purchase of up to four heavy duty buses and provide \$75,000 to assist with the preventive maintenance of the RTA fleet. Grant information including Agency detail, purpose and the local required match is included on the following page and will be provided for in the FY 2026 budgets.

For these reasons, we are requesting Council approval of our FY 26 Transit Assurance Resolution.
