1 **WHEREAS**, Section 12-103(b) of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated Code of
2 Maryland authorizes the governing body of a County to impose a recordation tax upon instruments
3 of writing recorded with the clerk of the circuit court for the County; and

5 **WHEREAS**, the Recordation Tax was last adopted by the passage of Council Resolution
6 No. 68-2024 and there are no changes proposed for Fiscal Year 2026; and

8 **WHEREAS**, the County Executive has recommended the rate of the recordation tax.

10 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard County,
11 Maryland this 21 day of May, 2025 that it sets a recordation tax of **\$2.50 on each \$500**
12 **or fraction of \$500** of consideration payable or of the principal amount of debt secured for an
13 instrument of writing, the tax to be imposed on the instrument of writing prior to recordation with
14 the Clerk of the Court; and

16 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the recordation tax rate shall be effective July 1,
17 2025 and shall continue in effect until changed or repealed by subsequent resolution of the County
18 Council.
