Dear County Council,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony at the County Council's Budget Hearing last Wednesday night.

I wanted to follow up on a couple of comments that council members made regarding Blueprint.

Reading through the mission and pillars of Blueprint, the state initiative was designed to be **additive**. Supports were to be put in place to make education **even better for all Maryland students**. It is now our mandate to find ways to fund this as a county.

One to two years of preschool access does not suddenly make the next 13 years not matter.

Here are a couple of key quotes in Blueprint: "The Blueprint will increase state funding for education over the next 10 years, **enrich student experiences and accelerate student outcomes**, as well as **improve the quality of education for all children in Maryland**, especially those who have been historically underserved."

Improving the quality of education for all children in Maryland includes improving the quality of education for all children in Howard County.

"The Blueprint for Maryland's Future and the updated CCR standard are **not intended to alter the need for high quality programs and content in fine arts, civics, physical education, and other areas that are necessary to provide a holistic education and enable every student to be well-rounded and meet the CCR standard**."

If we continue to cut programs that enrich all students whether they be the number of elementary GT teachers per school, music teachers per school, teacher to student ratios, special education teachers and support staff, or any school service that benefits our children's education, we do a disservice to the community.

Please work with the county to fund our schools. As described in my testimony, we have already witnessed how cutting 1:1 special education support staff has decreased available staff in elementary schools to help students with basic skills like reading. This harms all children.

My name is Dr. Corinne Happel.

As a board-certified pediatrician and parent, I'm advocating for funding for the Howard County Public School System. Per last night's report from the superintendent, the county is almost \$30 million short of funding currently mandated items and existing school staffing and programs. Without additional funding from the county council, our schools will again have significant cuts this year.

Funding the school budget tells our children: You are important. You are our future.

In Howard County, we have a vision of Educational Excellence. Families re-locate here for that excellence. The county should provide the funding requested to maintain this vision.

Each year, we are chipping away at programs and services offered in our schools to school-aged children and their families. Each loss is not a silo. As we cut one item on the budget, the negative effects are felt in other areas. For example, earlier this month, I learned from school leaders that **because of cuts to 1:1 staffing supports for certain children with special needs, paraeducators are being pulled from helping children with reading to helping keep children safe.** While I applaud efforts to keep children and staff safe, it is clear that what we think of as an isolated cut negatively affects all students. **Children who are struggling to read are receiving decreased support because of last year's cuts to 1:1 support aides and without increased funding, it is likely that their classes will increase in size next year too.**

On a similar note, children who are not sufficiently challenged become disengaged and disruptive, particularly in grades 3 through 5, where there are few accelerated learning opportunities outside of students' contact with GT teachers in GT math classes and in curriculum extension units. Yet elementary GT teachers are again being discussed as an item to reduce. **Many accelerated learners in these grade levels are already not being sufficiently challenged and as a result are becoming disengaged and/or are disrupting classroom activities.** Whether a child is disengaged or disruptive, not being appropriately challenged pulls teachers' attention away from the class as a whole and detracts from learning for all students and will get worse if cuts happen.

My family enjoys playing Jenga, a block tower game that requires you to take a block out of the base of the structure and place it on the top until the tower finally tips over. Imagine that block tower is our vision of Howard County as a sanctuary of educational excellence. Each year, the county cuts another block from the foundation of the tower and hopes not to topple the vision. In addition to cuts to 1:1 support aides, last year the county increased class sizes for all middle and high schools. We know increased class sizes are associated with poorer student performance.

When does it stop? We know that the game ends when the tower topples over. When Howard County becomes a mediocre school district. When families who can, move away because of lackluster school programs or choose to enroll their children in private schools. When children who could have thrived and succeeded, don't.

The County Council has the opportunity to work with the county to find additional resources. **I encourage you to consider the ideas proposed by educational advocates that describe revenue sources that would not cut funding from other current county budget items.**

Cutting funds to education, cuts the vision of Howard County as a place of educational excellence. Please find funding for the proposed 2025-26 operating budget for the Howard County Public School System. Our children are our future.



The following have been noted as possible planned cuts and the dollar savings (but note that total dollar values are only \$19 million and we need \$29.2 million in cuts to balance the budget).

-Class size increase: \$6 million

-Eliminate MS Gen Ed Paraeducators: \$255,000

-Reduce ES paraeducators: \$4 million

-Reduce HS Teacher Secretaries: \$351,000

-Reduce HS/ARL Media Specialists: \$1.4 million

-Reduce Dual Enrollment: \$300,000

-Eliminate 3rd grade strings: \$1.1 million

-Reduce ES GT teachers: \$3.6 million

-Reduce Non-School-Based Staff: \$2.0 million

-----TOTAL savings \$19.0 million, still have a \$10.2 million shortage.

Dear Memembers of the Board of Education, Superintendent Barnes and County Executive Ball,

While I fear my email may just end up in a long list of unread annoyance, I truly hope at least one of you will take a moment to digest the contents. It is with deep frustration and profound sadness that I write to each of you this evening. This time of year is often filled with budget woes and anxieties, and somehow the answer for cuts ALWAYS arrives at cuts to the music programs in our county. It seems that promises made are so often forgotten, and the children of Howard County are the ones who repeatedly end up paying.

Many of you may remember my personal testimony delivered in the fall of 2024 regarding the necessity for strict cell phone policy reform. I shared that my son was the victim of a horrible doctored picture that was "dropped" to students at neighboring schools. In my testimony, I shared that my son wanted to take his life and suffered a deep depression following the incident. While I was testifying, Superintendent Barnes put his hand to his chest and mouthed "I'm sorry". At the conclusion of my testimony, three board members came out into the hallway to speak with me, and I shared with them that one thing that saved my son was his involvement in the music program and Marching Band. I explained to them that his involvement gave him a safe place; it provided a refuge to deal with the flood of emotions and anger he was feeling. The music program was a critical component of his healing journey and even today he will loudly declare, without hesitation, that the BEST part of his high school experience was being a member of the symphonic band at Glenelg High School. Many would assume that his best experience was being a part of the state champions soccer team or his track involvement. However, music is what provided him with happiness. Music provided him with a place to belong. Music provided an outlet for him to grow both academically and artistically, providing the courage to apply to top 4 year institutions and being accepted by almost all of them. Music education was the key to a successful high school experience.

A study found in Psychology Today from May of 2024 states "Students who participate in music-related activities between grades 7-12 achieve significantly higher scores on science, math, and English exams in high school than non-musical classmates". This study even made appropriate adjustments for socioeconomic differences. This study is NOT an outlier. The data continues to tell the real truth - music education is ESSENTIAL for academic success. While not every HCPSS student will avail themselves of music education, it cannot be ignored that a substantial difference in outcomes results when access to music education is significantly reduced or denied altogether. While budget cuts are unavoidable, I implore you to stop believing that music education should take more than an equal portion of those cuts.

World class musicians don't just happen by chance. They are cultivated through thousands of hours of time, dedication and education in classrooms just like those found in Howard County. For decades, our county has been a shining example of what quality arts education should look like. Please thoughtfully consider how you can bridge the gap in funding without causing the majority of the burden to fall on the music programs. According to the stated mission of the board of education, each of you have chosen "to provide leadership for excellence in teaching and learning by fostering a climate for deliberate change through policy and community engagement". It is time for introspective reflection on how well you have been a leader to provide excellence in teaching and learning, if at the helm of your leadership, many of our most beloved programs are subject to significant cuts. The families of Howard County are depending on each of you to do what you have been charged to do. Please don't fail our students.

My name is Jessica Estrogano and I am a parent of a student at Jeffers Hill Elementary School. Our school is celebrating its fiftieth anniversary this

year, and has never had a renovation. Our school is overcrowded, underfunded, and underserved. We are Title 1 eligible, but Howard County drew the line above us, so we do not benefit from Title 1 funding. This is unfair to every single child at this school. The children in this county need to close the gap between what the Howard County Public School System needs and what the County Executive has proposed in his county budget. The screenshot attached is from the superintendent's report to the Board of Education.

The most recent discussions I've heard about the budget are that class sizes will be increased and the Gifted and Talented program will be eliminated at elementary schools. Please, don't do this to our kids. Studies show smaller class sizes lead to better behavior and test scores. The Howard County Board of Education voted in the blueprint that leads to a spending increase of almost \$10M that the county isn't funding. The Howard County Council, specifically Jones, Rigby, and Yungman, consistently vote in favor of development and, as a result, overcrowd and degrade our schools. The Howard County Council consistently does not give HCPSS the budget to hire more teachers, build new schools, or even to keep up with deferred maintenance. This is unacceptable.

Please do the right thing and fix the budget issues you've created with over development and no infrastructure support. Please stop making our children pay the price for poor decision making by adults.

I moved to the county 5 years ago because of the school systems, and I am afraid that I may need to make hard decisions to ensure that my children have the best education. I love this county and I would like it to get better.

Please prioritize students and restore funding to HCPSS.

I am writing as a concerned parent in Howard County to urge you to assure the Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) have the full necessary FY26 Operating Budget to proceed without eliminating more positions, increasing class size, and reducing student support, special educators, and summer opportunities.

I have one child now at Purdue who made use of all of the elementary gifted and talented programs and innumerable STEM, FBLA, sporting, and other opportunities throughout high school. One of my most vivid recent memories is that her tennis team did not have money for necessary tennis equipment (I think they were even limited to not having enough balls!). Yes, that memory is ingrained right next to her presenting her NASA Hunch project at the Johnson Space Center. Her boyfriend, a current senior, has used dual enrollment at least throughout his senior year (maybe earlier) to complete math through differential equations. We cannot fail these students. The county school system has actually failed my second child, and I am paying for her to be in private school to meet her needs. Any further increases in class size and reduction in services, especially ones necessary to prepare our children for a high skills future job market are intolerable, and frankly, if I were back in my younger family days, would make me seriously consider not moving to Howard County at all.

Howard County's reputation for excellence is built on its schools. Reputation is extremely hard to rebuild once lost, and it has been going in the wrong direction since 2020. Due to staffing cuts over the years, bigger classes sizes, and lack of staff training, he was moved from program to program and now he is at Homewood. Homewood is a wonderful school but my son now has emotional and academic damage from 10 years of underfunding. During that time he was lost from the school, restrained and isolated, not given appropriate support so he failed his 7th grade year. He had no friends. He was also eating his lunch alone on a dirty hallway floor. To say we are disappointed with his educational journey is the understatement of the year. No child with an IEP or special needs should be treated this way. I feel if schools continue to be underfunded, there will be more cases like my son and higher need for private , non public placement which is very costly.

If you want to continue to promote this area as a destination for families, you must have strong schools. The schools also need to have programs that promote college and career readiness. If you have the same programs have every county, people will not pay top dollar to live here. Residents are already complaining about crime. If there are no GT offerings or after school orchestra, it will only get worse. There need to be a rich variety of offerings and it can not be basic.

Dear Mr. Yungmann and the Howard County Council,

I am aware that the HCPSS Operating Budget was not fully funded, and now there are multiple proposed program cuts that will directly affect my children and the other children who attend HCPSS. First, I am aware that 64.6 teachers are at risk of being cut, which will further increase class sizes. This is absolutely ridiculous and cannot be allowed to happen. My third grade son, who attends Bushy Park Elementary School, **has 29 children in his class**. How is it possible that he can get the excellent education that the HCPSS boasts if his class size is even larger? His classroom is already excessively crowded. There is no more room for more children, and his school is one of the newer elementary schools. There is no way that a teacher can give each student the individualized attention that they need with 29 children per class, let alone > 30 children per class!

Additionally, I understand that 78 paraeducators are at risk from being cut from our elementary schools. These positions are instrumental in giving all children the extra help and attention they need to be successful, from our GT children to those enrolled in special education.

Reducing the high school teacher secretaries will only contribute more to the burnout our teachers are already facing. Please do not remove the support staff that allows our teachers to focus on what they do best- **teaching**.

The elimination of third grade strings would be a huge blow to our public school system. Howard County has the reputation of being one of the best public school systems in the country, and it is in large part due to the presence of special programs like third grade strings. Learning to play a musical instrument at such a young age enhances learning and creativity in so many different ways. Please do not rob our children of this experience.

Finally, the reduction of elementary GT teachers is harmful for all of the children. With fewer kids pulled into GT math in 4th and 5th grades, all math class sizes will increase, and no one will benefit from that.

We moved to Howard County because of the great reputation of the public schools here. In order for HCPSS to keep its excellent reputation, we need the money to support these programs. Please find the funding to fully fund the HCPSS budget. If you don't, you not only risk having people take their kids out of the school system, but you risk losing taxpayers as they will move out of Howard County altogether in search of a county that prioritizes its education system.

Dear Howard County Council,
I am writing as a concerned parent in Howard County to urge you to restore full funding to the Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) in the FY26 Operating Budget.

Over the past several years, HCPSS has been consistently underfunded. To maintain even a same-services budget this year, the school system needs at least \$80.6 million. Without this funding, our community will face larger class sizes, reductions in essential programs, and layoffs of valued staff -- all of which directly impact the quality of education for our students. It is troubling that when financial pressures arise, it is our schools that are first in line for service reductions. The school system should not be leading the way in cuts. Education is a core public service — not a luxury item to be scaled back.

Moreover, recent investment reports suggest the county will have at least \$10 million more in available funds than currently projected. Instead of shifting "extra" money into PAYGO projects, we should prioritize critical services like education. Our students, teachers, and schools should not be asked to sacrifice while funding is diverted elsewhere.

As a parent of a daughter in HCPSS, I see firsthand how thin resources already are. We cannot afford to cut any deeper.

Howard County's reputation for excellence is built on its schools. I urge you to prioritize our students and schools by restoring the necessary funding to HCPSS.
