#### Council Resolution No. 116 -2025

## Fiscal Impact:

The County could see potential revenues from fines collected as a result of increased issuances of tickets for violations resulting from commercial motor vehicles being parked in residential areas. While initially in the first one to two years after implementation of this legislation the County would see an increase; ideally the expectation would be that revenues from this violation would decrease over time. Our office is awaiting responses to provide context on a range of potential revenue amounts based on current revenues collected for this infraction.

Additionally, revenues should increase from fines collected related to Council Bill 52- 2025 which increases the Civil Penalty Class (and corresponding fines) of violation for parking a Commercial Motor Vehicle in a residential area as well as subsequent violations.

#### Purpose:

To approve a schedule of increases for fines and penalties and administrative costs for violations of Commercial Motor Vehicles parking in residential areas. Also, allowing for the Police Department to conduct a campaign to educate the public about the increased fines.

## Other Comments:

The Police Department intends to conduct an education and outreach campaign before and during the implementation of this legislation to promote awareness of the fines and penalties associated with the parking of Commercial Motor Vehicles in residential areas.
