**Council Bill No. 52- 2025**

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Fiscal Impact:

The fiscal impact of this legislation would need to be calculated in connection with Council Resolution 116-2025 as they are interrelated. This legislation adds a civil penalty Class of Offense associated with the violation of parking a commercial motor vehicle in a residential area as well as subsequent violations and the allowable fine minimum and maximum. Therefore, if the number of violations remain constant, there would be an increase in fines collected.

Purpose:

To revise penalties for parking commercial motor vehicles in residential areas.

Other Comments:

Violations of Section 21.232 will have a Class B penalty for a first violation which holds a minimum fine of \$250 and a maximum fine of \$500. Subsequent violations will have a Class A penalty with a minimum fine of \$500 and a maximum fine of \$1,000.

CR116-2025 if approved would specify the fines associated with each violation and subsequent violations.
