1 **Section 1. *Be It Enacted*** by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that the Howard County
2 *Code is amended as follows:*

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9 **Title 21 - Traffic Control and Transportation**

10 **Subtitle 6. – Speed Monitoring Systems**

11 **Sec. 21.601. – Authority to use speed monitoring systems; use of fines.**

12 (a) In accordance with section 21-809 of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of
13 Maryland, the Howard County Department of Police may:

14 (1) Use [[up to eight]] speed monitoring systems for the purpose of determining the speed
15 of a vehicle traveling within a designated school zone; and

16 (2) Issue civil citations to vehicle owners based upon the speed recorded by the recorded
17 image of the speed monitoring system.

18 (b) In accordance with section 7-302 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the
19 Annotated Code of Maryland, regarding fines collected as a result of violations enforced by
20 speed monitoring systems, the County may:

21 (1) Recover the costs of implementing and administering the speed monitoring systems;
22 and

23 (2) Subject to section 7-302(e)(4)(ii) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the
24 Annotated Code of Maryland, spend any remaining balance solely for public safety
25 purposes, including pedestrian safety programs.

26 (c) Any citation issued under this section shall include:

27 (1) Information about the right to a trial and to have the speed monitoring system operator
28 present at the trial; and

29 (2) How to request that the speed monitoring system operator be present at the trial.

30 (d) If a citation is issued on the basis of speed indicated by a flashing light, the speed system
31 operator must verify that the flashing lights are operating properly.
