1	WHEREAS, in 1971, the idea for a national flag, comprised of a black and white				
2	image of a gaunt silhouette, a strand of barbed wire and an ominous watchtower was				
3	developed to remind every American of our nation's military service members whose				
4	fates were never accounted for from the Vietnam War; and				
5					
6	WHEREAS, by the end of the Vietnam War, more than 2,500 service members				
7	were listed by the Department of Defense as Prisoner of War ("POW") or Missing in				
8	Action ("MIA"); and

10	WHEREAS, in 1979, Congress and the President proclaimed the first National				
11	POW/MIA Recognition Day to acknowledge the concerns and symbolize the steadfas				
12	resolve of the American people to never forget the men and women who gave up their				
13	freedom protecting ours; and

15	WHEREAS, the POW/MIA flag became the only flag other than the Stars and				
16	Stripes to fly over the White House in Washington, D.C. and the only flag ever displayed				
17	in the U.S. Capitol Rotunda, where it will stand as a powerful symbol of national				
18	commitment to America's POW/MIAs; and

20	WHEREAS, the POW/MIA flag's continued visibility remains a constant				
21	reminder of the plight of America's POW/MIAs; and

23	WHEREAS, the United States Government recognizes the significance and				
24	importance of the POW/MIA flag by flying it beneath the flag of the United States on the				
25	following dates:				
26	1. Armed Forces Day, the third Saturday in May;				
27	2. Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;				
28	3. Flag Day, June 14;				
29	4. Independence Day, July 4;				
30	5. National POW/MIA Recognition Day, the third Friday in September; and				
31	6. Veteran's Day, November 11; and
