1	WHEREAS, both the Howard County Police Department and Howard County
2	citizens value safe communitie and fairness in application of the law, protection of the
3	public, and law enforcement and criminal justice practices and procedures; and
4	WHEREAS, Howard County enjoys a relatively low rate of crime, high
5	standards of police conduct, the support of its citizens for safe communities and public
6	safety officials who protect them, and forward-thinking law enforcement leadership; and
7	WHEREAS, the County has embraced community policing by adding resources
8	to allow for more school resource officers and bicycle patrols, posting police in
9	neighborhoods, providing housing incentives for eligible officers to live in the
10	community, and engaging police officers as volunteers in numerous community and
11	charitable events; and
12	WHEREAS, the Police Department has an active Citizens Advisory Council that
13	meets monthly with the Chief of Police and his staff; and the Police Department has
14	implemented numerous community-outreach programs, including a partnership with the
15	African American Roundtable; an expanded Community Outreach Section, which
16	includes a full-time multicultural liaison officer; a robust youth services program, which
17	includes a gang and violence-avoidance youth camp, known as P.L.E.D.G.E., among
18	many other community-based programs; and
19	WHEREAS, in the absence of crisis, it is prudent to consider opportunities to
20	focus on strengthening relationships between police and the community to improve
21	public safety, including enhancements to police presence in the community; to the
22	equipment and resources available to law enforcement officials, including new uses for
23	technology such as body cameras; and to adoption of best practices in law enforcement;

25	WHEREAS, new uses of technologies, such as body cameras, must respect
26	protections of privacy that are afforded by law to citizens and officers alike, and policies
27	governing the adoption and new uses of technologies should reflect both the intention to
28	safeguard those protections and to emulate best practices in selection and deployment of
29	the devices; and

1	WHEREAS, an examination of the potential for enhancements in community
2	policing, including the use of resources which may strengthen community trust and
3	confidence, is timely;
4	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
5	County, Maryland, this day of 2015 that the Council requests that
6	the Howard County Police Department's Citizens Advisory Council establish a
7	Committee on Community Policing that will:
8	1. review relationships between the police and the community and make
9	recommendations to enhance existing successful policies and practices and seek
10	out examples of model community policing programs in the U.S. for possible
11	applicability in Howard County;
12	2. evaluate the operation, impact and effectiveness of the county's seven
13	Neighborhood Community Policing Offices and make recommendations as
14	appropriate;
15	3. evaluate emerging technologies in law enforcement, such as body cameras, to
16	determine if they may have application in Howard County;
17	4. investigate enhanced training opportunities for police to address growing and
18	changing County demographics, and make recommendations for implementation
19	both in the police academy and in-service training for employees.

21	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
22	County that the Committee on Community Policing should include members from a
23	variety of community groups, faith-based organizations, minority and business
24	organizations, and other groups that reflect the diversity of Howard County;
25	
26	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
27	County that as the Committee on Community Policing accomplishes the work outlined in
28	this Resolution that it should solicit input from a variety of stakeholders, including,
29	without limitation:
30	1. The Chief of the Howard County Police Department;
31	2. The Howard County State's Attorney;

2	4. The Howard County NAACP Youth Council;
3	5. The Howard County Police Officer's Association, Lodge 21;
4	6. Conexiones of Howard County;
5	7. The Jewish Federation of Howard County;
6	8. The Howard County Muslim Council;
7	9. The African American Community Roundtable of Howard County;
8	10. The Korean American Community Association;
9	11. The Howard County Chamber of Commerce;
10	12. The Howard County Association of Student Councils;
11	13. The Howard Community College Student Government Association;
12	14. The Howard County Mental Health Authority; and
13	15. The Howard County Human Rights Commission.

15	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
16	County that as the Committee on Community Policing accomplishes the work outlined in
17	this Resolution that it should hold meetings, including at least two public hearings to
18	facilitate broad citizen input.

20	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard
21	County that the Council requests that the Committee on Community Policing present its
22	findings and recommendations to the Chief of Police, the County Executive, and the
23	County Council on or before October 30, 2015.
