WHEREAS, Section 610 of the Howard County Charter authorizes and empowers the Howard County Council to make supplementary appropriations from the unexpended and unencumbered funds set aside for contingencies in the County budget; and

WHEREAS, the County has been awarded grant funds in the amount of \$32,530 from the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention for the Safe Streets Grant; and

WHEREAS, grant funds will be used to provide reentry services for inmates returning to the community; and

WHEREAS, the Safe Streets program connects ex-offenders to community services and tracks sobriety, recidivism and criminal activity after release; and

WHEREAS, the FY2015 budget includes an appropriation of \$24,750 for the Safe Streets Grant and this SAO would appropriate an additional \$32,530 for a total of \$57,280; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance has certified that the appropriation to be transferred is not encumbered and is available for transfer.

NOW, THEREFORE,

The Department of Corrections was awarded grant funds from the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention for the Safe Streets grant. The Safe Streets program provides Reentry Services for inmates returning to the community. The program connects ex-offenders more efficiently to community services and tracks maintenance of sobriety, reduced recidivism, and decrease in criminal activity after release. The grant is currently budgeted for \$24,750. We have been awarded additional funds in the amount of \$32,530.00

Due to the additional funding I am requesting a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$32,530.00 for the Safe Streets grant.

Fiscal Impact: There is no fiscal impact to Howard County.



The League's support for this legislation is based on our Maryland State position, which supports reintegration services for all inmates and encouragement with strong incentives to participate in these programs upon release into the community.


